ALBERTA RCMP URGES PARENTS TO BE MINDFUL OF PRIVACY RISKS ON SOCIAL MEDIA THIS BACK-TO-SCHOOL SEASON

This back-to-school season, the Alberta RCMP is reminding parents and guardians of the importance of online privacy, especially when it comes to sharing first-day photos of children.

As class comes into session, it is common to see photos of children posted to social media to commemorate the start of the school year. It has become increasingly common for parents to share images of their children alongside boards or placards outlining fun facts and personal details about them.

Information often includes the child's name, age, school, grade, favourite colour or activity, and more. While the intentions behind these images are innocent, posting these personal details to social media can risk the safety and privacy of our little ones.

The personal information often included in these photos can be used by individuals to identify, find, and build a false sense of trust or security with a child. A stranger could approach a youth, list their personal details, and claim they know their parents or are a trustworthy adult, when it is in fact untrue.

To avoid such risks, the Alberta RCMP encourages both parents and children to keep in mind the following safety tips:

Parents:

- Do not post images to social media that include the name of the school your child attends.

- Ensure photos are taken outside of undisclosed locations and do not include visible addresses, such as house numbers or street addresses.

- Avoid posting specific details about your child. Simply include a sign that reads something like "First Day of School" instead. Or

keep these types of posters off the web entirely.

- If you are posting photos of children in general, ensure your online privacy settings are set to maximize security.

- Speak with children about online safety and have parental monitor software or ensure parental security

settings are in place on their social media accounts.

- Have conversations with your kids about stranger danger and outline safety plans with them, i.e., establish safe words, identify trusted adults, etc.

- Do not give out personal information online or share details including your last name, address, school, etc. on your social media profiles.

- Have a parent review photos or videos before posting them online.

- If you feel uncomfortable with online activity or interactions, or are unsure if they are safe, tell a parent or trusted adult.

"We want to ensure that the start of this school year is a safe one. By being aware of the photos and details we are posting online, we can reduce the risk of our children's personal details being used to exploit their

safety and well-being," said Cst. Lauren Mowbray, Alberta RCMP. "Children look to us as adults to act in their best interest – both online and in their day-to-day lives."

TAX RELIEF FOR PRAIRIE LIVESTOCK PRODUCERS FACING THE IMPACTS OF EXTREME WEATHER

Canadian farmers are directly impacted by climate change and its effects can be detrimental to sustaining operations. To provide assurance for producers as they make difficult herd

management decisions, today the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food, the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, announced an initial list of designated regions in Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba where Livestock Tax Deferral has been authorized for 2022

due to extreme weather conditions.

The Livestock Tax Deferral provision allows livestock producers who are forced to sell a significant amount of their breeding herd due to drought or flooding to defer a portion of their income from

sales until the following tax year. The income may be at least partially offset by the cost of reacquiring breeding animals, thereby reducing the potential tax burden associated with the original sale.

WHAT IS A SMART HOME?

Refrigerators that inform their owners when it's time to buy more eggs and thermostats that learn homeowners' heating and cooling preferences may once have seemed like futuristic ideas straight out of a sci-fi movie. However, such products are no longer a dream but a reality.

The term "smart home" refers to a residence that has appliances, HVAC, lighting, entertainment systems, security, and many more devices that communicate with one another. Such devices can

be controlled remotely, according to SmartHome-USA, an automation product retailer. Proponents of smart home technology say features can help people save money on utilities and conserve natural resources, all the while providing peace of mind to homeowners.

In 2016, 80 million smart home devices were delivered worldwide. That marks a 64 percent increase from 2015, according to the research data firm IHS Markit. The smart home trend is only expected to grow in coming

years.

Although there's interest in smart home technology, the industry remains

fragmented. Consumers are trying to figure out which devices

GOLFER'S GUIDE

9 WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR GOLF GAME

Warmer weather sends scores of golfers to their favorite courses each and every day. Golf is a challenging pastime, but a few pointers can help golfers hone their short games, long games and everything in between.

- Choose the right clubs. There is more to selecting clubs than pulling any old iron out of your golf bag and whacking away. Wind, hazards and obstructions in landing areas should influence your de-

cision of which club to use. Novice golfers may want to rely on their caddies to make club recommendations, and as they become more confident in their abilities they can start to make their own choices.

- Anchor your feet. Anchor your foot behind the ball to drive the ball further. Right-handed players will keep the right foot anchored, and lefties will do the opposite. Do not lift your foot prematurely; otherwise, you can lose power and distance.

Identify your weaknesses. As with any hobby, identifying those areas that need the most work can help you become a better golfer. Keep track of each shot you take, and then look at the results to see which areas of your game need the most work.

- Fix your alignment. Align your shots by assessing the target from behind the ball. Then set the club-

face behind the golf ball and align it with the target before you enter your stance.

- Use your torso for power. The torso is essential to a solid swing. Practice rotating from your core to control your backswing and then maintain the same spine angle and posture on the downswing.

- Use the wind. Not every golf game will be played in perfect weather. A good player knows how to make adjustments for the wind depending on the shot. Use the wind to your advantage when you can, and adjust your swing when hitting into the wind.

- Become a better chipper. Many players put so much emphasis on their backswings and putt shots that they fail to devote any practice to chips. All shots are important for golfers trying to shed strokes off of their scores.

- Keep fit. Maintaining or improving your physical strength and overall health can help your golf game. Exercise and eat right, and you will have more endurance on the links.

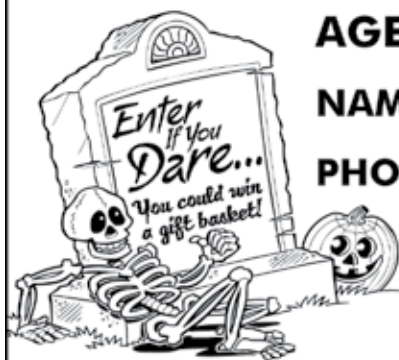

Eligible regions have been identified based on weather, climate and production data, in consultation with industry and provinces. The criteria for identifying regions for Livestock Tax Deferral includes forage shortfalls of 50 per cent or more caused by drought or ex-

cess moisture. The Government of Canada will continue to monitor conditions across the country to determine whether the addition of other regions throughout the year are required.

In addition to the Livestock Tax Deferral provision, producers have access to a comprehensive suite of Business Risk

Management (BRM) programs to help them manage significant risks that threaten the viability of their farm and are beyond their capacity to manage. BRM programs are often the first line of support for producers facing disasters and farmers are encouraged to make use of these programs to protect their farming operations.

To help farm families succeed in a changing climate, the Government of Canada will continue to support farmers with the tools they need to get through the challenges of today, while working to build a sustainable future for the agriculture sector in Canada.

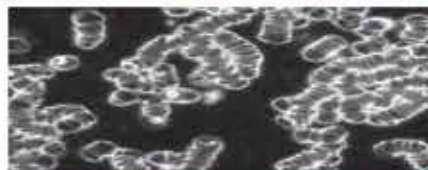
