MAYERTHORPE RCMP INVESTIGATE PEDESTRIAN HIT AND RUN FATALITY AND SEEK WITNESSES

Submitted by Mayerthorpe RCMP

Mayerthorpe RCMP, with the assistance of Western Alberta District General Investigation Services, conducted an investigation into the pedestrian hit and run which occurred on Oct. 1, 2022, resulting in the death of a 16-year-old male.

On Oct. 12, Jason Delaney Alexis (49), a resident of Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation, was arrested and charged with leaving the scene of an accident causing death and obstruction of justice. After a judicial hearing, Alexis was released on conditions and will be appearing in Mayerthorpe Provincial Court on Nov. 17, 2022.

As this matter is now before the courts, no further information will be provided.

ALBERT RCMP MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATE HOMICIDE NEAR BRETON

On Oct. 17, 2022, Breton RCMP received a report requesting a welfare check on a male at a rural property in Brazeau County. Upon arrival, officers spoke to and arrested a male on outstanding warrants. After conducting a search of the property, RCMP located a deceased male. The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit was called to investigate. The deceased has been identified as 67-year-old Robert Charles Marshall, a resident of Brazeau County.

On Oct. 19, 2022, an autopsy was conducted by the medical examiner who determined the manner of death is a homicide.

As a result of the investigation, RCMP have charged Shane Allen Marshall (37), a resident of Rimbey, with second degree murder.

Shane Marshall was taken before a Justice of the Peace where he was remanded in custody with his next appearance set for Nov. 9, 2022, at Breton Provincial Court.

As this matter is now be-

fore the courts, RCMP are not able to comment further.

Screen Test is coming to Whitecourt November 7 to 26, 2022

Thank you for supporting Screen Test over the past 30 years. It has been our pleasure bringing screening mammography to you. Together we are saving lives, one community at a time.

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 120 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 50 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 49 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 49 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.


Whitecourt Town Council has proclaimed November 2023 as Family Violence Prevention Month. Events and activities planned throughout the month aim to encourage Albertans to work together to promote healthy relationships and safe communities throughout our province. Albertans are also encouraged to show their support by wearing purple throughout the month. Council has authorized a change to the 2023 Power Franchise Fee. The franchise fee is paid to the municipality in exchange for giving Fortis Alberta the exclusive right to supply power in Whitecourt. The approved 2023 franchise fee rate was increased by 0.59% and set at 3.91%. This change will result in the average residential customer experiencing an increase of \$0.50 per month on their power bill.

Council authorized a change to the 2022 Gas Franchise Fee. The franchise fee is paid to the municipality in exchange for giving ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. the exclusive right to supply gas in Whitecourt. The approved 2023 franchise fee rate was increased by 1.25% and set at 27.17%. This change will result in the average residential customer experiencing an increase of \$0.69 per month on their gas bill.

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has adopted a resolution submitted by the Town of Whitecourt in support of the oil and gas industry. The resolution received written support from numerous communities from across the country prior to being adopted by the federal association. FCM will be advocating to the federal government in support of this topic, and the resolution will help guide policy for the Association over the next three years.

PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE POSSIBLE HATE CRIME

On Oct. 16, 2022, at approximately 10 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a severed pig's head that had been left on the rainbow Pride crosswalk painted at Graminia School in Parkland County.

The pig is believed to be a domesticated pig. Its head was severed with a bladed instrument. Its placement in the center of the crosswalk appears to have been intentional and designed to disturb students, staff and parents. Due to these circumstances, investigators are treating this incident as a possible hate crime targeted at the school, which has a Gay-Straight Alliance.

"An unsophisticated person might think this was a prank. An objective viewer would see it as highly intolerant and provocative," says Staff Sergeant Ian Gillan of Parkland RCMP.

Parkland RCMP are seeking any information that may assist the investigation. In particular, police are seeking the following information:

• Any suspicious activity in the area between the evening of Oct. 15, 2022, to the late morning of Oct. 16, 2022


• Information pertaining to recently missing or mutilated pigs

• Butchers and meat packers who recently sold, or had a pig's head stolen, are also asked to contact Parkland RCMP

The RCMP encourages all victims and witnesses to report any hate-motivated crime or incident to their local police of jurisdiction. Reporting hate-motivated incidents, no matter how minor they may seem, can help Police better target crime prevention efforts in the communities. It can also help identify trends and prevent a possible escalation towards violence.

PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE FROM SNOW, ICE AND DAMAGE FROM THE COLD

Winter can be an unforgiving season. Freezing temperatures coupled with snow and ice can take its toll on people who live in climates where cold weather is a fact of winter life.

While winter can test people's patience, it also can be harsh on cars and trucks. Understanding what components of a vehicle can be compromised by dropping temperatures and snowy roads can help drivers take action to safeguard their automotive investments.

While the Canadian Automobile Association notes that winter can wreak havoc on just about every part of a vehicle, there are some parts that seem to bear the brunt of Old Man Winter's abuse. Properly servicing and caring for a car or truck can help.

Drivers should take their vehicles for a tuneup and inspection before wintry weather arrives. A mechanic will examine the car battery and check antifreeze levels and make sure that the thermostat, defroster, brakes, and even wiper blades are working effectively. Have the tires inspected for adequate tread, which can make navigating roads safer. If the treads are worn, replace the tires.

In addition to visiting their mechanics, drivers can perform some inspections and fixes themselves.

• Check that all of the vehicle's lights

are operational so your car can be easily seen during inclement weather. Exchange your existing windshield washer fluid with one that will not freeze in cold conditions. Check the nozzles on the windshield-washer system routinely and clear out any blockages of ice or debris. While addressing windshield washer fluid, also replace worn out windshield wiper blades with ones that can withstand snow

and icy weather.

• A new coating of wax can serve as a shield against road salt, snow, sleet, and rain. Try a polymer wax to protect the paint. Whenever possible, rinse off salt and grime so it does not dry on the car and gradually wear away at the paint. Some drivers mistakenly believe that salt stops being a problem once it dries simply because moisture is the active ingredient for a corrosive reaction. But humidity in the air is enough to keep the salt eating away at the car's paint, and that can contribute to rust. Be sure to rinse off the undercarriage of the vehicle as well.

• Have your tires' alignment checked toward the end of winter or early spring. A season of traveling over pothole-ridden roads or hitting curbs buried under snow drifts can affect the alignment. Get everything back on track. Similarly, inspect tires routinely, as weather changes can affect tire pressure and strength.

• Use a soft snow brush or a foam brush to clear snow off of the car. Avoid hard plastic scrapers you might use on your windshield, as they can scratch painted surfaces.

• Try to park the vehicle in a garage or under a car port, each of which can protect cars and trucks from the often harsh elements of winter.

Vehicles can be affected by the cold weather. Keep

them running efficiently to prevent damage this winter.
