

Voting will take place on **Election Day**, the 21 day of November, 2022, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. **Election Day Voting stations** will be located at:

Division 4 Cherhill Community Hall AND Darwell Centennial Hall

B. In order to vote, you must produce identification for inspection. The identification must be one or more of the following as required by section 53 of the Local Authorities Election Act.

Any of the following documents that has the voter's name and address on it will be accepted as valid proof:

- Identification issued by a Canadian government, whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of that government, that contains a
 photograph of the elector and their name and current address.
- Bank or credit card statement or personal cheque.
- Government cheque or cheque stub.
- Income or property tax assessment notice.
- Insurance policy or coverage card.
- Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee.
- Pension plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation.
- Residential lease or mortgage statement.
- Statement of government benefits (for example, employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit).
- Utility bill (for example, telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water).
- Vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate.

A letter or form (attestation) confirming that the person lives at the stated address will also be accepted as valid proof. The letter can be signed prior to the vote by any of the following:

authorized representative of a commercial property management company; authorized representative of a correctional institution; authorized representative of a First Nations band or reserve; authorized representative of a postsecondary institution; authorized representative of a facility that provides services to the homeless; or authorized representative of a supportive living facility or treatment centre.

If a voter's identification shows a post office box number as the address instead of a residential or legal address, it can be accepted as verification of current address if it is in reasonable distance to the voting jurisdiction. The address does not have to be in the voting division or ward. An elected authority could, by bylaw, require additional verification or a combination of verification to establish the person's specific current address.







VIGILANCE KEY AS WILDFIRE SEASON ENDS

Albertans should continue to exercise caution, as the threat of wildfire lingers in some parts of the province.

Albertans' shared sense of responsibility for our forests has decreased the percentage of human caused wildfires in 2022, but there is still work to do.

While Oct.31 marked the end of the legislated wildfire season in Alberta, it is essential that people remain alert and responsive to conditions. The recent warm, dry weather was enjoyed by many across the province, but prompts a reminder to everyone that wildfires can start and spread at any time of year.

In the 2022 wildfire season, 56 per cent of wildfires were caused by human activity, around 38 per cent were caused by lightning and roughly six per cent are still under investigation.

"Diligence this summer resulted in a more than 10 per cent decrease in human-caused wildfires and we recorded fewer wildfires than the previous year overall. Wildfire staff work tirelessly keeping our forests safe and it's great to see that their efforts have been supported by the public's responsible behaviour. We're not out of the woods yet, though – warm, dry fall conditions in some parts of the province mean that it's still important for folks to stay alert to risks. Preventing wildfire is the duty of all Albertans." Todd Loewen, Minister of Forestry, Parks and Tourism

When enjoying the province's beautiful forests outside of wildfire season, Albertans should remain cautious. Fall may be in the air, but wildfires can still occur. Until there is sufficient moisture on the ground, the threat of wildfire remains. Alberta Wildfire has resources strategically placed across the province that are ready to respond.

Recent weather has cooled lake and reservoir water temperatures to such an extent that blue-green algae is no longer a health concern, including in six bodies of water in the Edmonton Zone, which had previously been placed under bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) bloom advisories.

Effective immediately, Alberta Health Services has lifted the blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom advisories for:

Half Moon Lake

Hastings Lake Isle Lake Pigeon Lake Wabamun Lake Wizard Lake

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, at any time.
