
The legion opens at 3 p.m., for a 6 p.m. dinner. Don't forget to reserve your place

A study is being done by the Competition Bureau (Bureau) on the increase in grocery prices and retail grocery competition in Canada. Please go to: https://www.competitionbureau.gc.ca/eic/site/cbbc.nsf/eng/04688.html

One of the study's purposes is to "examine how governments could act to combat grocery price increases by way of greater competition in this industry."

The final report is expected to be published in June 2023.

As an initial step, the Bureau invites stakeholders to provide submissions-either in writing or via oral interviews with Bureau staff-both in respect of the study questions and any other matters relevant to retail grocery competition in Canada. All written submissions will be made public and posted on the Bureau's website in the language provided unless it is specifically requested that they be kept confidential.

On Nov. 5, 2022, at 4:22 a.m., Maskwacis RCMP responded to a gun complaint in the Samson Cree Nation town site. Upon arrival, officers located a victim with serious injuries. Unfortunately, despite rescue efforts by responding officers and Emergency Medical Services, the victim was pronounced deceased. The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit was dispatched and has taken carriage of the investigation.

The victim has been identified as 19-year-old Maskwacis resident Riley Evan Bull.

The victim has been tak-

en to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner where an autopsy will be performed on Nov. 8, 2022.

Investigators have arrested Cashtin Joseph on the outstanding warrant for first degree murder of Brian Dupe.

At approximately 4:15 pm Oct. 26, 2022 Cashtin Lee Joseph was located and arrested in Millet, Alberta, by the Wetaskiwin RCMP Crime Reduction Unit with the assistance of Wetaskiwin Detachment, Maskwacis Detachment, and Major Crimes. He was taken into custody without incident and will have a bail hearing in the morning of Oct. 27, 2022.

49-year-old Stanley Victor Howse has been remanded into custody on a charge of First Degree Murder and is scheduled to appear in Wetaskiwin Provincial Court on Nov. 1, 2022 at 9:30 am.

Cashtin Joseph (27), and Stanley Howse (49), both residents of Wetaskiwin, have been charged with one count of 1st degree murder in the death of Brian Dupe (63). They have both been remanded in custody with their next court appearances set for Nov. 1, 2022, at Wetaskiwin Provincial Court.

As this matter is now before the courts, RCMP are not able to comment further.

NO FLAG? NO PROBLEM! Lac Ste. Anne Snowplow Flags go digital

We are now offering a digital Snow Flag Program. Any property owner or occupant who resides within the County can now call and have a digital flag placed on their residence, all from the comfort of their own home! No more placing flags outside in the snow and cold.

Why digital flags?

 Digital flags can not blow away. The flag will show up in our GIS maps and only disappears when it is marked completed by the local operator doing the work.

 Digital flags can not be stolen. They show up in the office and field database only.

 Safety – our operators can simply mark complete on their snow flag work order from the comfort of their equipment. No longer do they have to exit the grader and walk in the deep snow to retrieve.

 Going digital allows the Public Works department to monitor the snow flag program from the office to ensure no flagged driveways are missed.

How to obtain a digital flag? 1) Stop by the County Administration Office OR call 780.785.3411 (toll-free 1.866.880.5722) to contact the Public Works department.

 An information form containing a "Hold Harmless" agreement clause must be completed & signed before purchasing digital flags.

3) When you would like your driveway plowed, simply call the Public Works department to have them place a digital flag on your residence in our database.

- Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee.
- Pension plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation.
- Residential lease or mortgage statement.
- Statement of government benefits (for example, employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit).
- Utility bill (for example, telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water).
- Vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate.

A letter or form (attestation) confirming that the person lives at the stated address will also be accepted as valid proof. The letter can be signed prior to the vote by any of the following:

authorized representative of a commercial property management company; authorized representative of a correctional institution; authorized representative of a First Nations band or reserve; authorized representative of a postsecondary institution; authorized representative of a facility that provides services to the homeless; or authorized representative of a supportive living facility or treatment centre.

If a voter's identification shows a post office box number as the address instead of a residential or legal address, it can be accepted as verification of current address if it is in reasonable distance to the voting jurisdiction. The address does not have to be in the voting division or ward. An elected authority could, by bylaw, require additional verification or a combination of verification to establish the person's specific current address.

## ALBERTA SCHOOL BUS DRIVER SHORTAGE AT CRISES LEVEL

Our children could be left out in the cold this winter

Government regulations and lack of funding is a big part of the problem

Every day there are 146,000 Alberta school children and their parents who rely on buses to get safely to and from school.

"Every day, there are fewer busses available and fewer certified operators to drive them." says Mark Critch, president of the ASBCA.

The major crises presently, is the shortage of certified drivers, with areas in the province reporting up to 30% less drivers than are required for adequate service.

Where are all the certified drivers? Bus drivers must complete the Alberta Ministry of Transportation's MELT driver training certification, which ensures that drivers are qualified and competent to drive. The 3 to 4 week course is mandatory for new drivers, costing applicants up to \$5000. They are unpaid for the duration of the course and application process. Following the course, there is a waiting period for scheduling a road exam. There are delays due to a shortage of certified instructors, as well as delays in the processing of certificates. Altogether, it can take up to six weeks of unpaid training time before a prospective driver can even get behind the wheel. Certified drivers will be looking at a

part time job paying as low as \$16.50/hour; and will be taking on the responsibility of driving kids to and from school in all types of road/ weather conditions.

With the shortage of school busses and drivers, Alberta children are being put at serious risk. If a school bus is late, or worse doesn't show, for whatever reason (driver shortage, bus shortage, inclement weather), kids are being impacted by having to wait outside, in various weather conditions. They are at risk of losing valuable learning time, which will impact them for years to come.

"One bus that is 30 minutes late daily, carrying 40 kids, equals 1200 lost minutes per day. Multiply this by 200 buses across the province and that is 240,000 lost instructional minutes per day" says Mark Critch, ASBCA

The Alberta Ministries of Education and Transport could easily work together to solve this issue.

They can reallocate the funds that are desperately needed to fund and assist school bus contractors and their drivers. Financially incentivize people to consider getting trained to become a neighbourhood school bus driver. Who should be expected to pay \$5000 for a course, to certify them for a part-time job paying minimum wage?


