SECTION 251 - The Municipal Government Act

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to borrowing Bylaw No. 08-2023 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the said Lac Ste. Anne County to borrow monies from the Province of Alberta or an authorized financial institution by way of debenture issue, to pay for the cost of the following municipal purposes(s), namely the construction of a Wastewater Transmission Line from Darwell to Tri-Village.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to \$11,820,000. After deducting from this cost the amount of \$10,620,000 to be received by way of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) Green Infrastructure Stream Grant, the net amount to be borrowed on the credit and security of Lac Ste. Anne County at large by the issue of debentures is \$1,200,000. The debentures are to be repayable to the Province of Alberta or an authorized financial institution in fifty (50) equal consecutive semi-annual installments of combined principal and interest, the annual interest not to exceed the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Alberta Finance, and not to exceed seven (7.00%) percent.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on Bylaw 08-2023 is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the said Council may pass the said borrowing Bylaw.

All persons interested are hereby notified and they are required to govern themselves accordingly.

Information for Electors

Pursuant to Section 1(i) of the Municipal Government Act an "elector" means:

A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the Local Authorities Election Act.

Pursuant to Section 47(1) of the Local Authorities Election Act, a person is eligible to vote in an election if the person:

- a. is at least 18 years old,
- b. is a Canadian citizen, and

c. has resided in Alberta for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding election day and is a resident in the area on election day.

A poll may be demanded in Lac Ste. Anne County by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population of 11,300 (1,130 electors), in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the *Municipal Government Act* and in accordance with the provisions of Section 251 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose of the petition". (Further requirements of the petition are provided in Section 224 of the *Municipal Government Act*).

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immediately went to the veteran's house to see what they could do.

Richard quickly identified the problem with the furnace. As the problem was more than they could help with, the SANG emergency line was called and the on-duty technician arrived shortly thereafter. He determined a new part was required. Since the veteran had very limited financial resources, the two Legion members realized it was a perfect fit for the Poppy Fund.

After a quick vote among the available members of the Branch Executive Committee who were also at darts, and having confirmed that funds were available, Scott called Kevin Ouderkirk, CEO of SANG, to arrange for the bill to be sent to the Legion for payment rather than to the veteran. The furnace was quickly repaired by the SANG technician and life returned to normal.

The Poppy Fund provides

financial assistance and support to veterans (including Canadian Armed Forces and RCMP) and their families who are in need. Aside from emergency financial assistance, in recent years the Onoway Legion has also awarded educational bursaries to the children and grandchildren of veterans, and contributed to the recent restoration of a gazebo at the Chateau Lac Ste. Anne, where some veterans or their surviving spouses reside. The Poppy Fund is mainly funded by donations

for poppies in the weeks leading up to Remembrance Day each year, although the Legion receives donations throughout the year.

SANG is Alberta's largest natural gas co-op, and is well known as a strong supporter of the local community in Onoway and Lac Ste. Anne, including the Onoway Legion. The two organizations worked seamlessly to quickly resolve a potentially life-threatening problem.
