### SECTION 251 - The Municipal Government Act

**TAKE NOTICE** that the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to borrowing Bylaw No. 08-2023 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the said Lac Ste. Anne County to borrow monies from the Province of Alberta or an authorized financial institution by way of debenture issue, to pay for the cost of the following municipal purposes(s), namely the construction of a Wastewater Transmission Line from Darwell to Tri-Village.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to \$11,820,000. After deducting from this cost the amount of \$10,620,000 to be received by way of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) Green Infrastructure Stream Grant, the net amount to be borrowed on the credit and security of Lac Ste. Anne County at large by the issue of debentures is \$1,200,000. The debentures are to be repayable to the Province of Alberta or an authorized financial institution in fifty (50) equal consecutive semi-annual installments of combined principal and interest, the annual interest not to exceed the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Alberta Finance, and not to exceed seven (7.00%) percent.

**NOW THEREFORE NOTICE** is hereby given by the Council of Lac Ste. Anne County that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on Bylaw 08-2023 is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the said Council may pass the said borrowing Bylaw.

All persons interested are hereby notified and they are required to govern themselves accordingly.

### Information for Electors

Pursuant to Section 1(i) of the Municipal Government Act an "elector" means:

A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the Local Authorities Election Act.

Pursuant to Section 47(1) of the Local Authorities Election Act, a person is eligible to vote in an election if the person:

- a. is at least 18 years old,
- b. is a Canadian citizen, and

c. has resided in Alberta for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding election day and is a resident in the area on election day.

A poll may be demanded in Lac Ste. Anne County by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population of 11,300 (1,130 electors), in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the *Municipal Government Act* and in accordance with the provisions of Section 251 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose of the petition". (Further requirements of the petition are provided in Section 224 of the *Municipal Government Act*).


capacity, an air filter improves fuel efficiency while ensuring vehicles accelerate smoothly without taxing the engine. But when air filters are clogged, fuel efficiency is reduced and emissions are increased, a 1-2 punch that costs motorists money and hurts the planet at the same time. Drivers can check their owners' manuals to determine the recommended intervals to replace air filters, but the following are a handful of indicators that suggest it's time to change them. Gas mileage: Un-

your vehicle, you likely know how many miles you can drive on a full tank of gas. If that gas mileage is suddenly slipping and you find yourself visiting the filling station more frequently, then it might be time to replace your air filter. Engine light: .

Drivers may be alerted to engine issues when the "Check engine" lights up on the vehicle's dashboard. This light may come on to indicate a problem with the air filter.

as clogged air filters reduce air flow to the engine, resulting in an imbalanced air-fuel mixture that adversely affects the engine. Starting and idling problems: Vehicles sometimes don't start up as smoothly as they once did, and drivers may also notice vehicles are not idling smoothly. These symptoms may indicate misfiring spark plugs that are being polluted (and made less effective) by a dirty air filter that is reducing the flow of

air to the engine.

culties: Automobiles that are operating at peak capacity accelerate quickly. But dirty, worn out air filters adversely affect acceleration. Drivers who notice that their cars are struggling to accelerate when stoplights turn green or on highways may need to replace their vehicles' air filters.

Dirty air filter: Perhaps the biggest indicator that an air filter needs to be replaced is the filter itself. If you cannot find the air filter on your own, consult your vehicle owner's manual to determine where it

is. Once you find the air filter, examine it in broad daylight. Clean air filters are white, so if the filter has

darkened, it may need to be replaced.

## PERSPECTIVES ON PLANTING

Two commercial vegetable producers talk about their growing practices

If you are thinking about starting a new venture in

growing horticultural crops, you are invited to join an online session on Thursday evening, March 23rd to look at various practices for planting vegetable crops.

Over many years of growing a wide range of crops, Alber-

ta farmers Blaine Staples of The Jungle Farm and Brian Brenneis of 2BK Vegetable Farm have tested and fine tuned a lot of production strategies. During their 30-minute presentations,



each will talk about what they've learned and how their growing, harvesting, and marketing practices influence how they plant their crops.

The counties of Lac Ste. Anne, Leduc, and Sturgeon are partnering to host this 5th session in a series of extension events taking interested growers from planning through to production and marketing of commercial horticulture crops. Previous sessions have looked into the market potential for a range of field and protected crops, choosing land, and essential steps to prepare for planting.

Participants will have time to ask questions of Blaine and Brian and the recorded session will be available for 30 days.




