





# **COUNTY DECLARES STATE** OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

# For two separate wildfire events south of the Community of Cherhill

The call rang out the afternoon of May 4, as a wildfire was spotted south of Rge Rd 60 and Twp Rd 560. This grew to an approximately 640-hectare-fire that affected properties in the area of Rge Rd 60 to Rge Rd 63, from Twp Rd 560 to Twp Rd 562. This wildfire affected rural land comprised of farms, hay land, pasture, and wooded areas.

Reeve Blakeman and County Council quickly declared a State of Local Emergency.

A short 24 hours later the focus shifted to a separate blaze located just south of Lessard Lake Estates in the area of Rge Rd 51 and Twp Rd 553. County Fire Services worked in tandem with fire crews from Alberta Wildfire and adjacent municipalities to preserve the 197 residential and recreational properties in the affected area. Despite our best efforts the County was unable to save all properties from the fire.

On May 5, County Council further acted in requesting the Province to declare a Provincial State of Emergency, which the Province announced shortly thereafter.

Mandatory evacuations were activated in both wildfires, with displaced residents registering with the County at a registration centre set up at the Mayerthorpe Diamond Centre.

Both wildfires have since been considered contained but remain active. All evacuation alert notices have been rescinded.

With safety as the priority the County worked quickly to develop a reentry plan for Lessard Lake Estates property owners and occupants. On May 10, Lessard Lake Estates owners/ occupants were granted re-entry to their properties on a restricted access basis.

Our hearts go out to everyone involved in these wildfire events as it is a stressful and traumatic experience.

All updates and directives related to wildfires will continue to be posted to the County website and Facebook page.

# COUNTY-WIDE FIRE BAN REMAINS IN EFFECT until further notice

The Fire Hazard Rating for the area is EXTREME.

This Fire Ban affects all burning, including cooking / warming fires (backyard fire pits and campground fire pits), brush pile fires, slash pile fires AND the use of burn barrels. This Fire Ban also includes backwoods or random camping areas, charcoal briquettes, deep fryers (e.g. turkey fryers), tiki torches and wood fires in outdoor recreation facilities such as group campsites, gazebos, teepees, and wood burning stoves inside tentlike structures. Additionally, Fireworks Discharge Permits will not be issued at this time.

No new Fire Permits will be issued, and all existing Fire Permits are hereby cancelled.

# **ASSISTANCE TO ALBERTA**

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that a Request for Federal Assistance from the Province of Alberta to support their efforts to combat the significant wildfire situation in the province has been approved.

Authorization has been given to the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) to provide:

- · personnel and resources to assist and enable fire fighting;
- · airlift resources for mobility and logistical tasks, including the

evacuation of isolated communities: and

· engineering support, including heavy equipment resources, as capacity allows.

CAF resources will be provided for an initial period of two weeks, with a one-week extension possible following a joint evaluation of the situation to determine if support is still required.

In addition to the CAF deployment, the federal government is also providing the following sup-

· Public Services and Procurement Canada will provide contracting support to the province for supplies or logistics.

- · The Royal Canadian Mounted Police will continue to support with response efforts and, as the contracted police of jurisdiction, support matters of law enforcement.
- · Employment and Social Development Canada will support impacted Canadians with enhanced Service Canada hours, outreach to evacuees, and deployment of mobile units to evacuation centres to support applications for services, such as employment insurance.
- · Indigenous Service Canada's

tance Program (EMAP) will support the response and recovery efforts for Alberta's on-reserve First Nations communities currently experiencing the effects of the wildland fires. Affected communities require prompt coordination of actions to protect the health, safety or welfare of all, and limit damages to property, infrastructure, and the environment. EMAP supports impacted communities through agency response via the wildland fire and the emergency management service agreements with the Province of Alberta, resource coordination, organizational structure and evacuee supports. Once the response phase is over, the Program will provide recovery support for repairs to on-reserve community infrastructure to restore to pre-event conditions, mitigation measures to infrastructure to minimize future impacts and personal losses.

Emergency Management Assis-

- · Public Health Agency of Canada's National Emergency Strategic Stockpile is engaged and has already shipped requested supplies and is standing by to provide more if required.
- · Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada is working with the province of Alberta and telecommunications service providers to keep people connected.
- Parks Canada is sending an 18-member Incident Command Team to support the Province of Alberta. These wildland fire management specialists are trained to manage complex fires and other incidents. This deployment is being coordinated through the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre.

If you are trapping beavers, please make sure to follow the Code of Responsible Trapping, available at albertaregulations.ca. Finally, as stated in the 2022-23 Alberta Guide to Trapping Regulations, Fur-bearing animals must be trapped using methods that are proven to avoid unnecessary pain and suffering. The manner in which animals are trapped is a concern of many Albertans, including trappers.





# PARKLAND RCMP AND RCMP ALBERTA MAJOR CRIMES UNIT CHARGES LAID IN HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION

Second Degree Murder charge has been laid in relation to the death of a Paul Band First Nation resident. On May 2, 2023, 33 yearold Saundra Bearhead was discovered by police suffering from a serious knife wound injury. Saundra was transported to an Edmonton hospital but succumbed to her injuries on May 7, 2023

The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit entered into a homicide investigation and, as a result of evidence collected, Blake Bird, age 28, was arrested. Bird has been charged with one count of Second Degree Murder. Bird has been remanded into custody and is scheduled to make his first appearance in Stony Plain Provincial Court on May 10, 2023.

# HELPING WILDFIRE EVACUEES REPLACE MISSING ID

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is removing costs for wild-fire evacuees who need replacement identification so they can access services they may need as soon as possible.

Evacuees of the Alberta wildfires who lost or left behind their Alberta driver's licence, ID card or birth certificate between April 29 and June 29 will be able to replace these documents free of charge.

Evacuees must visit a registry agent office in person to replace their documents at no cost.

Registry agents will follow procedures to confirm an applicant's identity and ensure they are from an area under evacuation before ordering replacement documents at no charge.

Replacement cards and certificates will be sent to an address specified by the applicant. Applicants can choose to send replacement identification to an alternate address that is not a post office box, including evacuation centres and registry agents. The replacements will arrive in about five business days.

Replacing a driver's licence or ID card

Registry agents

will validate an applicant's identity by looking up their image and signature to ensure both match what is on file.

- Registry agents will validate an applicant's evacuee status by comparing their address on their motor vehicle file, with a government list of affected areas that is updated daily.
- The agent will ask personal knowledge verification questions that only the applicant can answer.

Replacing a birth certificate

• Birth certificates can be replaced by applying in person at a registry agent office if an applicant has other ID; however, if that too is missing, an applicant will need to bring someone who can vouch for their identity, having known them for more than one year. The registry agent can assist with this process.

Alberta's Emergency Management Cabinet Committee continues to meet regularly to respond to the current wildfire situation across the province. Cabinet continues to have decision-making abilities and will make decisions as needed to deal with this emergency.

# **HOW TO KEEP ANIMALS OUT OF YOUR GARDEN**

Many gardeners understand the frustration that stems from seeing a garden destroyed by wildlife. While protecting wildlife is a cause that's near and dear to many gardening enthusiasts, even the most ardent wildlife supporter does not want to see his or her garden trampled, eaten or adversely affected by animals.

Safeguarding gardens from local wildlife can require some trial and error. Animals may find ways to circumvent gardeners' initial efforts to protect their gardens, but the following methods might just do the trick the first time around.

• Erect physical barriers around gardens. Barriers may not be gardeners' first choices, as some people feel barriers such as wire cages or mesh coverings make it more difficult to tend to gardens and rob gardens of some of their aesthetic appeal. But coverings and wire cages can effectively prevent wildlife from trampling or eating plants while still allowing the gardens to get adequate sunlight. Make sure barriers extend to the ground so animals cannot access gardens by entering beneath the barricades.

· Fight intruders with odor. Stray cats may mistake gardens for litter boxes and enter them to relieve themselves. Preventing such intrusions can be as simple as placing items around the garden to reduce the likelihood that gardens will be mistaken for litter boxes.

Peels from oranges and lemons or coffee grounds can be placed in the garden and can emit odors strong enough to deter cats.

Install motion detecting lights around gardens. Motion detection technology might be enough to deter nocturnal wildlife from trampling or eating gardens. Animals might be spooked and run away when lights suddenly turn on. A similar approach can be taken using noise instead of lights. Gardeners who hope to avoid erecting barriers around their gardens can put up posts instead, attaching aluminum cans or wind chimes to the posts that will make noise when animals come near. Much like light, noise can be enough to deter animals.

- Consider raised garden beds. When small critters, such as moles, are the main problem, then raised garden beds with wood or plastic bottoms and sides can be enough to safeguard gardens. Raised garden beds might not be accessible to small critters, though such beds likely won't deter larger animals from getting into gardens that are not barricaded.
- Erect fencing around the yard. Though fencing is expensive, fencing in a backyard or side yard where gardens are located can deter wildlife big and small from trampling or eating gardens.



# **ONEIL CARLIER OPINION EDITORIAL**

What are We Waiting For? For generations Alberta has been a destination of choice for global investment. This has led to robust economic growth, low unemployment, and some of the best paid jobs in the country.

But the downturn in the price of oil, combined with the COVID-19 epidemic resulted in a drop in employment and investment.

Thankfully we have seen energy prices increase as the global economy recovers, but here in Alberta this is not translating to the good jobs and good wages the past.

A recent report from Alberta Central concluded that the Alberta Advantage is "melting away" under the UCP because wages are not keeping pace with inflation. In fact, under the UCP, Alberta has had among the slowest wages growth in the

country since 2019.

We can't continue looking to the ideas of the past. We need to look ahead to the future. Thankfully, Alberta is uniquely positioned to be a leader in the future economy. We are blessed with abundant natural resources, a highly skilled workforce, and an entrepreneurial spirit.

With the right policies in place, we can address the challenges of today and build a more prosperous tomorrow. That is what the NDP's Jobs Strategy is all about. # MILITARY DEPLOYED TO ALBERTA

The Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) has begun to move out to support Alberta as the province battles unprecedented wildfires.

Troops from 3rd Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (3PPCLI) and 1 Combat Engineer Regiment (1CER) are moving out to establish bases of operations in the province.

Army reserve soldiers drawn from across Alberta will deploy this week.

Over the next few days, these units will deploy to the Grande Prairie, Fox Creek and Drayton Valley areas.

Albertans will see this movement by vehicle on roads and in the air, as some forces and equipment will be moved by Royal Canadian Air Force fixed-wing aircraft and helicopters.

This movement and the establishment of these positions will create bases of operations for the forces to conduct fire mitigation efforts under the supervision of Alberta Wildfire personnel.

The capabilities the CAF can bring to support Alberta are firefighting support to aid in mop-up operations and basic firefighting duties. Airlift resources for increased mobility and

logistical responsibilities, such as evacuating isolated communities, will also be provided. Engineering support will be provided where required, incorporating heavy equipment resources.

The Canadian Armed Forces has been working closely with the Alberta Emergency Management Agency and conducting significant planning and reconnaissance throughout Alberta to determine where they are most needed.

Alberta's Emergency Management Cabinet Committee continues to meet regularly to respond to the current wildfire situation across the prov-

ince. Cabinet continues to have decision-making abilities and will make decisions as needed to deal with this emergency.

The most up-to-date evacuation information is available at alberta.ca/emergency, Alberta Emergency Alert or by downloading the Alberta Emergency Alert mobile app, which immediately pushes all alerts out to subscribers. Albertans seeking information or supports can call 310-4455.

Anyone who has been evacuated due to wildfires is asked to register at local reception centres or at emergencyregistration. alberta.ca.


