

# LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY ISSUES UPDATE REGARDING ADMINISTRATION BUILDING STRUCTURE ISSUES

### Sangudo, Alberta, Wednesday, May 17, 2023 - Update on Administration Building

The County has made the difficult but necessary decision to replace the Administration Building. This follows extensive expert investigations and assessments, which unfortunately have concluded that repairing the present damage and maintaining the integrity of the building is not feasible. This is very disappointing news we had hoped to avoid. We are now forced to start the process for a new building to ensure we have a quality building to support the important services the County provides.

Details of how we arrived where we are and our plans to minimize the impacts to County residents and ratepayers are discussed below.

### Chronology and general description of the problem

Around the time the Administration Building was being completed in 2017, slab heaving and drywall cracking were observed. The issues were investigated by geotechnical experts and determined to be caused by moisture changes to the high plastic clay that the building is situated on. Recommendations made to regrade and redirect surface water were implemented, and the slab heaving appeared to have stabilized. Following this, it appeared that any deficiencies with the building would be addressed as normal warranty items and no long-term issues were anticipated.

However, as 2018 unfolded, and ever since, the building continued to experience movement and damage despite the remediation measures that were implemented in 2017. The County then arranged for a structural engineering investigation, including surveying and ongoing monitoring of the building's movement to ensure it is safe.

The movement appears to be primarily with respect to the building's floor, which is known as a slab on grade floor. This type of floor sits on the subgrade underneath and is not supported by piles or any other structural component. As such, the slab is susceptible to movement when the high plastic clay beneath it expands with changing moisture levels.

The expansion of the ground beneath the building has occurred to the extent that the floor and other structural components are moving, causing issues with the structural integrity of the building as a whole and critical components. Other resulting issues include significant bowing and sloping of the floor slabs, separation of walls from each other and the foundation, extensive wall and ceiling cracking, vapour barrier damage, notable gaps causing air infiltration and heat loss, damage to fire proofing and fire separations, and damage to the exterior cladding.

In addition, the building is expected to continue to experience differential movement of the interior floor slab. There is a significant risk the known problems will get worse over time, and we may encounter new problems with other components of the building.

In addition to the initial geotechnical and structural investigations described above, the County engaged further experts to monitor the situation, investigate all potential causes, and develop options to remedy the problems.

During 2020-2022, experts continued to monitor the condition of the building, assess the structural integrity, and investigate all potential causes of the problems. They also made short-term and longer-term recommendations to address any immediate concerns. The short-term recommendations were implemented, which included the design and installation of shoring of the mezzanine level of the building and close monitoring of the safety systems of the building that were impacted by the building's movement. During this time period, experts also investigated and reported on potential long-term remedial steps.

During late 2022 and early 2023, work continued to fully develop the feasibility, costs, risks, service disruption, and likely outcomes associated with the long-term options. It was in the course of this further work that our experts advised us of further issues with the building, and the steps required to restore the long-term integrity of the building in accordance with industry standards. Unfortunately, the scope of required rehabilitation would be extensive, including the requirement to essentially remove and replace all interior floor slabs, internal walls, internal finishes, and exterior cladding and weatherproofing.

After extensive review and analyses by a team of experts – including some of the leading structural engineers, geotechnical engineers, architects, and construction contractors in the province – it was determined that repairing the existing building would not be a feasible or reasonable option, leaving the County with the only option of replacing the building.

### Lawsuit

From the outset, the County has been advised by legal counsel with respect to these issues. The problems with the Administration Building were raised with the parties who designed and built the Administration Building. Unfortunately, they failed to address the problems and legal action was necessary to protect the County's interests.

As we previously advised in our periodic updates, a lawsuit was started against the parties involved in the design, project management, and construction of the Administration Building. This lawsuit is ongoing, with the objective of obtaining financial recovery from the parties responsible for this situation in order to offset the cost implications to the County.

Based on advice from the County's legal counsel, only limited information can be shared until the lawsuit is concluded.

Lac Ste. Anne County Council and Administration sincerely thank ratepayers for their understanding and cooperation as they continue their work protecting the County's interests and ensuring that we have a quality building to support the services the County delivers.

The County will continue to provide periodic updates on this matter on its website and social media platforms.

evacuated community, the Alberta RCMP can easily ascertain who's authorized to work in a specific area and who might be unlawfully in the community.

Roving Patrols: With the perimeter secured, marked police car patrols will regularly move through your community actively looking for signs of criminal activities, as well as individuals who are not authorized to be in the evacuated area. To enhance patrolling ability throughout the night, advanced optical and night vision technology mounted on our Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems (drones) are being utilized

to identify and accurately pinpoint any suspicious activity in your evacuated community.

Quick Response Teams: Special Tactical Operations and Emergency Response Teams are in place to rapidly react to any incidents in your community. These members are specially trained officers equipped to deal with the most sensitive and dangerous situations.

Investigative Teams: Experienced investigators will analyze and examine reports of suspicious activity and individuals. Our investigators will conduct targeted investigations of prolific offenders, criminal hot spots and utilize both overt and covert


techniques to actively suppress crime and arrest those looking to take advantage of the evacuation.

Crime Reduction Techniques: Various Crime Reduction equipment and strategies are being implemented within and around the evacuated areas. "Bait" vehicles and equipment for the most opportunistic offenders are being utilized to catch criminals in the act. Specialized Crime Reduction teams utilize covert crime detection and overt crime suppression strategies focusing on the most prolific offenders who are causing the most harm to our communities.

Until you are able to return to your community, your local RCMP officers

are committed to keeping communities that have been evacuated safe and secure. Please help us to keep everyone safe by listening to the advice from local authorities and staying away from evacuated areas until you have been cleared to return. Your patience is greatly appreciated.


### LAKE ISLE COMMUNITY HALL NEWS



During the inspection, the Agricultural Services team inspects all private and County properties for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds as per the Alberta Weed Control Act.

As always, inspection crews will exercise extreme care when entering fields to minimize any potential spread of crop issues from field to field. Precautions include the use of disposable boots and/or disinfection with a bleach solution prior to entering any field.

# GOLF COURSES MANAGE PESTS TO PROTECT THEIR TURF

Golf courses are valuable green spaces in many communities, and the sport is enjoyed by Canadians of all ages.

We want our favourite course to be healthy, but this requires a lot of attention. Despite best efforts, sometimes golf courses are affected by pests. These can include turf diseases like dollar spot and snow mould, which affect normal growth of grass and can cause significant turf loss, according to experts. Turf insects feed on the grass and can inflict severe damage. Weeds are also a threat, because they compete with grass for moisture and affect the playability of a course.

To control pests, golf courses practice integrated pest management, using the right tool at the right time to treat an infestation. This includes pesticides, which are regulated by Health Canada to ensure they are safe and effective in controlling the pests they are designed to target. They help maintain healthy vegetation and playing surfaces, and also offer many envi-

ronmental benefits.

Golf courses are often located in urbanized areas and can be valuable green spaces that help preserve habitats for wildlife and waterfowl. Data show that healthy turf and trees act as natural air conditioners by producing large amounts of oxygen, while removing

carbon dioxide. Did you know that healthy turf grass can sequester almost 900 kilograms of carbon per hectare each year?






