CLARIFICATION OF A RECENT COUNCIL MOTION Regarding initiating planning for a new County Administration Office

Lac Ste. Anne County seeks to address rumors circulating on social media channels regarding Council's May 17, 2023 motion to initiate planning for a new County Administration Office.

First, the motion was based on our experts' conclusions that repairing the damage and maintaining the integrity of the building is not feasible. Further, a decision was required, based on advice from legal counsel, to be able to move forward with the lawsuit we initiated in 2019 against the parties responsible for the situation with the building.

Second, the motion was not to start building immediately, but to begin the planning for it.

The current County Administration Office has been fully paid for, and both Council and Administration are hopeful for a resolution of the lawsuit in 2024 that would allow for the construction of a new building with funding from the defendants.

As this matter unfolds, the County will continue to provide updates to the extent legally permissible.

ONOWAY PLAYSCHOOL REGISTRATION OPENS JUNE 5

2023-24 School Year

Registration will be limited to Lac Ste. Anne County area residents; including those living within Town of Onoway, Alberta Beach, or any Summer Village within the County boundaries - including the Onoway Elementary School catchment area.

Registration: Details on how to register will be available prior to the June 5 opening of registration on our website LSAC.ca.

We will offer:

 One-day per week option - combined 3/4 yr class Wednesdays 12:30 - 3:00 pm

Two-days per week options -

Monday & Thursday or Tuesday & Friday

Maximum enrollment per child of two days per week.

Morning classes - two days/week 9:00 – 11:30 am

Designated for three-year olds. Child must be at least three years old before attending, and priority will be given to those turning three by December 31, 2023.

Afternoon classes- two days/week 12:30 – 3:00 pm

Designated for four-year olds. Child must be turning four by December 31, 2023.

Mid-year starts are permitted. Children must be fully potty-trained. Parent Helper Days may be required.

Currently, the Province of Alberta provides Lac Ste. Anne County with access to the Affordability Grant which fully covers the cost of the program. If the Affordability Grant were to cease, parents/guardians would be provided the option to continue in the program and be invoiced for any outstanding fees on a pro-rated basis.

Monday, Sept 11, 2023 – Program commences – a staggered start may be implemented.

Friday, Dec 15, 2023 – last day of classes before Christmas break.

Monday, Jan 8, 2024 – first day of classes after Christmas break.

Friday, Jun 14, 2024 - Program ends.

Onoway Playschool will follow the Northern Gateway Public Schools 2023-24 Official School Year Calendar, and not operate on non-school days.

On May 19, 2023 at 2:45 p.m., Fox Creek RCMP were notified that a male had become stranded northwest of Fox Creek after attempting to use a gravel road to go around a check point.

The large truck that the male was driving had become stuck active fire in the area had surrounded him.

Due to the active fire in the area, it was deemed unsafe for first responders to enter the area. A forestry helicopter attended the location and was able to air lift the male out to safety.

As a result of the investigation, RCMP are currently seeking to lay charges against the male.

"Alberta RCMP continue to be deployed with specialized units to assist with public safety and crime reduction efforts during these fires. Incidents like these only serve to put unnecessary strain on all first responders while threatening the safety of our communities." said S/Sgt District Advisory

ANNUAL WEED AND CROP INSPECTION Scheduled to begin soon

The County's annual crop and weed inspection program to prevent the spread of noxious and prohibited weeds will begin shortly. Weed inspectors will be starting in the NW corner of the County and working eastward throughout the summer. More information about what inspectors are looking for, the Alberta Weed Control Act, and other frequently asked questions can be found online.

During the inspection, the Agricultural Services team inspects all private and County properties for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds as per the Alberta Weed Control Act.

As always, inspection crews will exercise extreme care when entering fields to minimize any potential spread of crop issues from field to field. Precautions include the use of disposable boots and/or disinfection with a bleach solution prior to entering any field.

STAY SAFE WHEN LANDSCAPING

Landscaping is typically viewed as a chore by homeowners, many of who enjoy doing some work on their lawns and gardens. But only few homeowners may recognize the potential dangers of lawn maintenance.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission reports that more than 230,000 people per year are treated for various injuries resulting from lawn and garden tools. Common injuries include loss of fingers, lacerations, broken and dislocated bones, eye injuries, and burns. Many of these injuries are entirely preventable if homeowners prioritize safety when tending to their lawns and gardens.

Understand the equipment

Homeowners should not assume they know how to use all of the tools necessary to maintain lush lawns and bountiful gardens. Familiarize yourself with the proper operation of manual and motorized equipment by reading the owner's manual thoroughly, making special note of recommended safety guidelines.

Take some time to locate the power buttons and other parts by comparing them to illustrations in the guide. Once you feel comfortable handling the equipment, then you can begin to use it.

Wear appropriate protective gear

Failure to wear protective gear can lead to injury. Personal protective equipment includes gloves, eye protection, ear protection, boots, and a hard hat if necessary. When working during visibility conditions or at night, wear a reflective vest.

Other protective items include a hat to shade your eyes from the sun's rays. Sunscreen will protect the skin from UVA and UVB radiation. Long pants and sleeves can guard against flying debris. Watch your surroundings

Thousands of injuries occur to children and pets who get hurt around mowers. It's best if children and pets remain indoors when homeowners are mowing or using other power equipment that may kick up debris. Children under the age of 12 may not have the strength or ability to operate lawn tools. Also, never make a game of riding a child on a riding mower. Nobody under the age of 16 should operate riding lawn mowers.

Get approval before digging

It's difficult to know what is beneath the ground without having a property surveyed and marked. Digging without approval can result in damage to gas lines or water/sewer pipes. Always check with the utility company before digging trenches or holes. Unplug or turn off all equipment

When not in use, keep lawn equipment off. Do not try to repair or fix a snag or obstruction in equipment while it is on. Don't modify the equipment in any way, such as removing protective guards.

Exercise caution with chemicals

Follow manufacturers' safety instructions when using pesticides or fertilizers. Avoid application on windy days or right before a rainstorm, as this can spread the product and damage the ecosystem. Keep people and pets away from treated areas.

Maintaining the yard is both a necessity and a hobby. Homeowners who prioritize safety can greatly reduce their risk of injury.





HELP KIDS LEARN THE GAME OF GOLF

Adults who play golf know just how fun and frustrating the game can be. Whether you're a veteran golfer or someone just learning the links, golf can be challenging.

But as exacting as the game can be, it also can be just as rewarding, even for kids. Children who embrace the game of golf will learn a host of lessons they can apply in all facets of life. A humbling game even for professional golfers, golf can teach kids lessons in humility and the value of persistence even when things aren't going your way.

Golf is also a great way for parents to get kids off the couch and outdoors for some fun in the sun. Instead of spending summer afternoons in front of the television, kids who play golf are out patrolling pristine golf courses while getting some cardiovascular exercise along the way. Golf can also strengthen a child's hand-eye coordination, which can help them in other activities, including many different sports.

Though many people do not begin playing golf until they've reached adulthood, it's never too early for boys and girls to start learning the game of golf. Parents of preschoolers can start their kids off with a toddler play set. Though it's just a toy, a play set can help lay a solid foundation for future golfers. Kids who have watched Mom and Dad play golf or practice their swing can develop their own swings on their play set.

As kids approach school age,

don't overlook the nearby puttputt or miniature golf range as a valuable teaching tool. Miniature golf clubs are small enough for many children to use comfortably, and kids can use miniature golf courses as a place to put any lessons or advice on putting to good use. What's more, a miniature golf course is more than just golf, with creative courses and other fun activities, so kids won't feel overwhelmed with golf.

When kids move on from preschool to elementary school, some might want to tag along with Mom or Dad to the driving range. You should try to avoid overwhelming kids with too much instruction or information. Instead, keep things as simple

as possible, teaching them the basic swing and encouraging them no matter how quickly they adapt.

As kids enter middle school and approach high school, those who are enjoying the game of golf can take advantage of the driving range if they haven't already begun to. A driving range typically has markers that indicate the distance of a regular hole, regardless of which tee you will play from on an actual golf course. Kids can aim for holes at shorter distances to learn how far their drives are going. You can then adjust the lessons you teach your children based on how far youngsters can drive the ball.

As a child gets closer to high school, you might want to buy the child his or her own set of clubs. Look for inexpensive clubs (oftentimes, thrift stores or other secondhand retailers have clubs for sale) because growing children will eventually grow out of their first set of clubs. When your child finds a set of clubs that suits him or her, teach the proper way to swing and consider signing up your son or daughter for lessons. Those first few lessons can prove invaluable, turning a pastime into a passion kids will carry with them throughout their lives.

The creamery was located where the Onoway Park is now – east of the tracks.

At the creamery we got \$11 for one can of cream which more than bought the groceries. Mom cream was always graded special.

Just over the tracks, heading south, you ran into Frank Roberts garage (Oliver dealership). Dad went there for parts for machinery, the binder and mower that was pulled by our horses. Across from Frankie Roberts was Mr. Wismers harness shop where dad got his parts like the tug, lines etc. for the horse's harness. The importance of horses. Mr. John Branting came over in May riding bareback on his percheron stallion to breed the mares (cost \$3 per mare). We needed good pulling horses to go to town and do the field work, so it was important to breed the mares to a high-class stallion. The stallion got 2 eggs from mom to put in a gallon of oats to help give the stallion energy to do his job.

To go to Edmonton, we had to go on the train. The station was located where Bigway Foods is now."

Cooler temperatures and rain have helped in the fight against wildfires in the Whitecourt region.

While the fi re hazard remains very high and fi refighting crews continue to work, the communities of Fox Creek, Swan Hills, Little Smoky and Yellowhead County have all downgraded evacuation orders, and local residents have been allowed to go home. The special air quality statement for the region has ended.

Over the last three weeks. Whitecourt provided evacuation assistance to over 3,000 residents who were displaced due to wildfires. The reception centre at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre was opened on May 6, and officially closed May 25. The reception centre acted not only as the registration centre to account for those forced to leave their home. but also became the hub for a variety of social support services and information for evacuees.

"In many interviews I was asked about the outpouring

of support by Whitecourt residents and businesses to those displaced," stated Whitecourt Mayor Tom Pickard. "I responded that the community of Whitecourt has always stepped up and that is why we live here."

The Town of Whitecourt is grateful for all the sponsors, donors, partners and volunteers that provided their time and support to the evacuees.
