# YELLOWHEAD COUNTY WILDFIRE UPDATE

Submitted by Yellowhead County

Over the past 25 days, Yellowhead County has been dealing with

multiple large wildfires. Combined, these fires have impacted more than 232,000 ha in communities across the County.

Several areas have been evacuated over this time, with some communities having to evacuate more than once. Devastatingly, there have been homes and other structures lost and damaged by the wildfires. Yellowhead County thanks everyone for their strength and resilience throughout this situation.

Today at 3:00 p.m., it was announced to residents that were in the evacuation zone near Shiningbank Lake that residents could return home at 4:00 p.m. today (May 23rd).

Residents from west of the McLeod River will no longer be under an evacuation alert upon their return. Residents east of the McLeod River will remain on a 30-minute evacuation notice in case conditions change. These areas will only allow local traffic to enter due to the active wildfire and the hazards that currently exist in the area, such as dangerous trees and potentially downed power poles.

The recent change in weather, including some much-needed precipitation, has the many crews and organizations working in the wildfire complexes feeling cautiously optimistic. They will continue to make strategic decisions to take as much advantage of these conditions as they can.

Structural protection will be removed from some areas in Yellowhead County over the next week. This will only be done in areas where crews are confident that it is safe to remove. It is important to have this

• Food trucks, including live entertainment and a dining area, will be centrally located around the traffic circle.


The changes are rooted in three priorities:



### NEW! Busing Distance Eligibility Update for September 2023

In April 2023, the Alberta Government approved changes to the distance eligibility for transportation service effective for September 2024.

 The eligible transportation distance criteria of 2.4 kms from the student's primary residence to the school will be reduced. New distance criteria for eligible service is:

1.0 km or more for children in kindergarten and students in Grades 1-6; and,2.0 kms or more for students in Grades 7-12 will qualify for transportation service.

As a phased approach to implementing the new service criteria, Grande Yellowhead Public School Division is moving to implement the changes for September 2023.

Families who qualify for eligible service under the new distance criteria are invited to register for busing as soon as possible. The Division will try to accommodate as many newly eligible riders as possible. Registrations received after June 30, 2023, are subject to seat availability.

## FEE-BASED SERVICES: INELIGIBLE AND ALTERNATE (SECOND) SEAT REQUESTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Requests for ineligible bus service should also register by the June 30 deadline; however, please note that eligible students will have priority on all routes.

Based on increased eligible riders, ineligible riders may not receive confirmation of a seat until after September 30, 2023. Additionally, requests for alternate (second) seats on other bus routes may not be confirmed until after September 30, 2023.

The Division is currently looking to recruit and train new bus drivers in anticipation of increases to eligible student ridership once the mandatory service requirement comes into effect in 2024. Please visit the **Careers** page on the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca/working-at-gypsd.



Our spare drivers are usually booked in advance to cover routes or drive charter trips but may be called upon with short notice to cover illness or other emergencies. Typical hours of work are within 6:30-9 am and 3-5 pm depending on the length of the route.

#### PAY

Routes pay \$80-120/day depending on distances. You also get paid for any extra work or travel that you do.

### STAY SAFE WHEN LANDSCAPING

Landscaping is typically viewed as a chore by homeowners, many of who enjoy doing some work on their lawns and gardens. But only few homeowners may recognize the potential dangers of lawn maintenance.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission reports that more than 230,000 people per year are treated for various injuries resulting from lawn and garden tools. Common injuries include loss of fingers, lacerations, broken and dislocated bones, eye injuries, and burns. Many of these injuries are entirely preventable if homeowners prioritize safety when tending to their lawns and gardens.

Understand the equipment

Homeowners should not assume they know how to use all of the tools necessary to maintain lush lawns and bountiful gardens. Familiarize yourself with the proper operation of manual and motorized equipment by reading the owner's manual thoroughly, making special note of recommended safety guidelines.

Take some time to locate the power buttons and other parts by comparing them to illustrations in the guide. Once you feel comfortable handling the equipment, then you can begin to use it.

Wear appropriate protective gear

Failure to wear protective gear can lead to injury. Personal protective equipment includes gloves, eye protection, ear protection, boots, and a hard hat if necessary. When working during visibility conditions or at night, wear a reflective vest.

Other protective items include a hat to shade your eyes from the sun's rays. Sunscreen will protect the skin from UVA and UVB radiation. Long pants and sleeves can guard against flying debris. Watch your surroundings

Thousands of injuries occur to children and pets who get hurt around mowers. It's best if children and pets remain indoors when homeowners are mowing or using other power equipment that may kick up debris. Children under the age of 12 may not have the strength or ability to operate lawn tools. Also, never make a game of riding a child on a riding mower. Nobody under the age of 16 should operate riding lawn mowers.

Get approval before digging

It's difficult to know what is beneath the ground without having a property surveyed and marked. Digging without approval can result in damage to gas lines or water/sewer pipes. Always check with the utility company before digging trenches or holes. Unplug or turn off all equipment

When not in use, keep lawn equipment off. Do not try to repair or fix a snag or obstruction in equipment while it is on. Don't modify the equipment in any way, such as removing protective guards.

Exercise caution with chemicals

Follow manufacturers' safety instructions when using pesticides or fertilizers. Avoid application on windy days or right before a rainstorm, as this can spread the product and damage the ecosystem. Keep people and pets away from treated areas.

Maintaining the yard is both a necessity and a hobby. Homeowners who prioritize safety can greatly reduce their risk of injury.

# **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS**

Submitted by Yellowhead County

2023 Summer Gravel Program – Yellowhead County Council awarded the 2023 Summer Gravel Program contract to McLeod Valley Sand and Gravel Ltd. in the amount of \$847,646.50 (GST excluded). They were the lowest bidder, were found to be fully compliant, and best satisfied all the terms and conditions of the tender documents. 2023 Final Budget – Yellowhead County adopted the 2023 Final Budget in the amount of \$180,322,089.00. The 2023 Interim Budget had planned a 2% increase for the municipal mill rate, however after seeing the overall assessment Yellowhead County will have a 0% increase in the mill rate instead.

Bylaw 01.23 – Bylaw to Authorize Rates of Taxation for the 2023 Taxation Year

1. Council provided first,

second, and third readings to Bylaw 01.23, authorizing Rates of Taxation for the 2023 Taxation Year. Historically, due dates have fallen on June 30th in Yellowhead County. As a result of the 2023 spring wildfires, tax due dates have been pushed to July 31st, 2023.

2. Council also approved waiving any outstanding tax penalties until September 29, 2023 for those evacuated fire areas identified as the Evansburg (Zone 1), Wildwood (Zone 3), and Shiningbank (Zone 4) areas, as well as the expanded evacuation area including Hattonford.

3. Council directed Administration to bring back a report to Council next month to waive 2023 taxes on residential homes destroyed in the 2023 spring wildfires.
