YELLOWHEAD COUNTY WILDFIRE UPDATE

Submitted by Yellowhead County

Over the past 25 days, Yellowhead County has been dealing with multiple large wildfires. Combined, these fires have impacted more than 232,000 ha in communities across the County.

Several areas have been evacuated over this time, with some communities having to evacuate more than once. Devastatingly, there have been homes and other structures lost and damaged by the wildfires. Yellowhead County thanks everyone for their strength and resilience throughout

this situation.

Today at 3:00 p.m., it was announced to residents that were in the evacuation zone near Shiningbank Lake that residents could return home at 4:00 p.m. today (May 23rd).

Residents from west of the McLeod River will no longer be under an evacuation alert upon their return. Residents east of the McLeod River will remain on a 30-minute evacuation notice in case conditions change. These areas will only allow local traffic to enter due to the active wildfire and the hazards that currently exist in the area, such as dangerous trees

and potentially downed power poles.

The recent change in weather, including some much-needed precipitation, has the many crews and organizations working in the wildfire complexes feeling cautiously optimistic. They will continue to make strategic decisions to take as much advantage of these conditions as they can.

Structural protection will be removed from some areas in Yellowhead County over the next week. This will only be done in areas where crews are confident that it is safe to remove. It is important to have this

Summer is right around the corner, and kids are getting ready to leave school. Now they need something to do! Why not stop by the Tipple Park Museum this summer? We have lots of programs for all interests.

We have a three-day Pioneer Camp happening on July 26, 27,

and 28th, 1:00 – 2:30, for ages 7-13. The cost is \$20. Students will learn how to make butter, ice cream, biscuits, candles, and old-fashioned crafts. They will also participate in 1920s school games, 1900s washing skills, scavenger hunts and a 1920s school lesson.

NEW! Busing Distance Eligibility Update for September 2023

In April 2023, the Alberta Government approved changes to the distance eligibility for transportation service effective for September 2024.

- The eligible transportation distance criteria of 2.4 kms from the student's primary residence to the school will be reduced. **New** distance criteria for eligible service is:

1.0 km or more for children in kindergarten and students in Grades 1-6; and,
2.0 kms or more for students in Grades 7-12 will qualify for transportation service.

As a phased approach to implementing the new service criteria, Grande Yellowhead Public School Division is moving to implement the changes for September 2023.

Families who qualify for eligible service under the new distance criteria are invited to register for busing as soon as possible. The Division will try to accommodate as many newly eligible riders as possible. Registrations received after June 30, 2023, are subject to seat availability.

FEE-BASED SERVICES: INELIGIBLE AND ALTERNATE (SECOND) SEAT REQUESTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Requests for ineligible bus service should also register by the June 30 deadline; however, please note that eligible students will have priority on all routes.

Based on increased eligible riders, ineligible riders may not receive confirmation of a seat until after September 30, 2023. Additionally, requests for alternate (second) seats on other bus routes may not be confirmed until after September 30, 2023.

The Division is currently looking to recruit and train new bus drivers in anticipation of increases to eligible student ridership once the mandatory service requirement comes into effect in 2024. Please visit the **Careers** page on the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca/working-at-gypsd.

TRAINING

GYPSP provides FREE Class 2S Mandatory Entry Level Training (MELT), Monday-Friday 9:00 am to 2:30 pm, Classes are on-going and include 6 days in class, 24 hours of driving and 11 hours in the bus yard. And GYPSP pays you to take the training!

YOUR EXPENSES

You will need to obtain a driver's medical and pay the costs of testing at registry (written and road test).

HOURS OF WORK EXPECTATIONS

Our spare drivers are usually booked in advance to cover routes or drive charter trips but may be called upon with short notice to cover illness or other emergencies. Typical hours of work are within 6:30-9 am and 3-5 pm depending on the length of the route.

PAY

Routes pay \$80-120/day depending on distances. You also get paid for any extra work or travel that you do.

HAVE PRESCHOOL CHILDREN AT HOME?

No problem! Parents can bring their preschool children with them on the bus when driving a route.



We try to schedule our spare drivers in the areas in which they reside. If you are willing, there could be opportunities to travel to other zones.

We currently transport students in Hinton, Edson, Fulham, Niton Junction, Wildwood, Evansburg, Jasper, and Grande Cache.

Typically, only one pouch is needed for singular lone standing trees. If you have a stand of multiple trees, you can place pouches on any high object (2.5-3.5 meters above ground) every 10 to 15 meters throughout the stand of Pine.

GOLFER'S GUIDE

HELP KIDS LEARN THE GAME OF GOLF

Adults who play golf know just how fun and frustrating the game can be. Whether you're a veteran golfer or someone just learning the links, golf can be challenging.

But as exacting as the game can be, it also can be just as rewarding, even for kids. Children who embrace the game of golf will learn a host of lessons they can apply in all facets of life. A humbling game even for professional golfers, golf can teach kids lessons in humility and the value of persistence even when things aren't going your way.

Golf is also a great way for parents to get kids off the couch and outdoors for some fun in

the sun. Instead of spending summer afternoons in front of the television, kids who play golf are out patrolling pristine golf courses while getting some cardiovascular exercise along the way. Golf can also strengthen a child's hand-eye coordination, which can help them in other activities, including many different sports.

Though many people do not begin playing golf until they've reached adulthood, it's never too early for boys and girls to start learning the game of golf. Parents of preschoolers can start their kids off with a toddler play set. Though it's just a toy, a play set can help lay a solid founda-

tion for future golfers. Kids who have watched Mom and Dad play golf or practice their swing can develop their own swings on their play set.

As kids approach school age, don't overlook the nearby putt-putt or miniature golf range as a valuable teaching tool. Miniature golf clubs are small enough for many children to use comfortably, and kids can use miniature golf courses as a place to put any lessons or advice on putting to good use. What's more, a miniature golf course is more than just golf, with creative courses and other fun activities, so kids won't feel overwhelmed with golf.

When kids move on from pre-

school to elementary school, some might want to tag along with Mom or Dad to the driving range. You should try to avoid overwhelming kids with too much instruction or information. Instead, keep things as simple as possible, teaching them the basic swing and encouraging them no matter how quickly they adapt.

As kids enter middle school and approach high school, those who are enjoying the game of golf can take advantage of the driving range if they haven't already begun to. A driving range typically has markers that indicate the distance of a regular hole, regardless of which tee you will play from on an actual golf course. Kids can aim for holes at shorter distances to learn how far their drives are going. You can then adjust the lessons you teach your children based on how far youngsters can drive the ball.

As a child gets closer to high school, you might want to buy the child his or her own set of clubs. Look for inexpensive clubs (oftentimes, thrift stores or other secondhand retailers have clubs for sale) because growing children will eventually grow out of their first set of clubs. When your child finds a set of clubs that suits him or her, teach the proper way to swing and consider signing up your son or daughter for lessons. Those first few lessons can prove invaluable, turning a pastime into a passion kids will carry with them throughout their lives.

Lawn & Garden

STAY SAFE WHEN LANDSCAPING

Landscaping is typically viewed as a chore by homeowners, many of who enjoy doing some work on their lawns and gardens. But only few homeowners may recognize the potential dangers of lawn maintenance.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission reports that more than 230,000 people per year are treated for various injuries resulting from lawn and garden tools. Common injuries include loss of fingers, lacerations, broken and dislocated bones, eye injuries, and burns. Many of these injuries are entirely preventable if homeowners prioritize safety when tending to their lawns and gardens.

Understand the equipment

Homeowners should not assume they know how to use all of the tools necessary to maintain lush lawns and bountiful gardens. Familiarize yourself with

the proper operation of manual and motorized equipment by reading the owner's manual thoroughly, making special note of recommended safety guidelines.

Take some time to locate the power buttons and other parts by comparing them to illustrations in the guide. Once you feel comfortable handling the equipment, then you can begin to use it.

Wear appropriate protective gear

Failure to wear protective gear can lead to injury. Personal protective equipment includes gloves, eye protection, ear protection, boots, and a hard hat if necessary. When working during visibility conditions or at night, wear a reflective vest.

Other protective items include a hat to shade your eyes from the sun's rays. Sunscreen will protect the skin from UVA and UVB ra-

diation. Long pants and sleeves can guard against flying debris.

Watch your surroundings

Thousands of injuries occur to children and pets who get hurt around mowers. It's best if children and pets remain indoors when homeowners are mowing or using other power equipment that may kick up debris. Children under the age of 12 may not have the strength or ability to operate lawn tools. Also, never make a game of riding a child on a riding mower. Nobody under the age of 16 should operate riding lawn mowers.

Get approval before digging

It's difficult to know what is beneath the ground without having a property surveyed and marked. Digging without approval can result in damage to gas lines or water/sewer pipes. Always check with the utility company before digging trenches or holes.

Unplug or turn off all equipment

When not in use, keep lawn equipment off. Do not try to repair or fix a snag or obstruction in equipment while it is on. Don't modify the equipment in any way, such as removing protective guards.

Exercise caution with chemicals

Follow manufacturers' safety instructions when using pesticides or fertilizers. Avoid application on windy days or right before a rainstorm, as this can spread the product and damage the ecosystem. Keep people and pets away from treated areas.

Maintaining the yard is both a necessity and a hobby. Homeowners who prioritize safety can greatly reduce their risk of injury.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Submitted by Yellowhead County

2023 Summer Gravel Program – Yellowhead County Council awarded the 2023 Summer Gravel Program contract to McLeod Valley Sand and Gravel Ltd. in the amount of \$847,646.50 (GST excluded). They were the lowest bidder, were found to be fully compliant, and best satisfied all the terms and conditions of the tender documents.

2023 Final Budget – Yellowhead County adopted the 2023 Final Budget in the amount of \$180,322,089.00. The 2023 Interim Budget had planned a 2% increase for the municipal mill rate, however after seeing the overall assessment Yellowhead County will have a 0% increase in the mill rate instead.

Bylaw 01.23 – Bylaw to Authorize Rates of Taxation for the 2023 Taxation Year

1. Council provided first,

second, and third readings to Bylaw 01.23, authorizing Rates of Taxation for the 2023 Taxation Year. Historically, due dates have fallen on June 30th in Yellowhead County. As a result of the 2023 spring wildfires, tax due dates have been pushed to July 31st, 2023.

2. Council also approved waiving any outstanding tax penalties until September 29, 2023 for those evacuated fire areas identified as the Evansburg (Zone 1),

Wildwood (Zone 3), and Shiningbank (Zone 4) areas, as well as the expanded evacuation area including Hattonford.

3. Council directed Administration to bring back a report to Council next month to waive 2023 taxes on residential homes destroyed in the 2023 spring wildfires.
