# ALBERTA RCMP SEEK PUBLIC ASSISTANCE IN KEEPING EMERGENCY RESPONDERS AND SUPPORT SERVICES SAFE

Alberta RCMP working in areas affected by wildfires are reminding drivers that speeding is a high-risk behaviour which actively puts other road users, community members and emergency responders unnecessarily in danger.

• Pay attention to local signage

• Be mindful that speed limits may change when personnel are working roadside • Fires are unpredictable and you may need to be turned around or take a different route at any time

• Do not bypass barricades preventing access to areas as not all roads are favourable; this increases your risk of needing emergency resources to locate you and your family

• Provide adequate time to travel between destination-sOff Highway Vehicles:

• RCMP would like to remind community members

that in light of wildfire risk, keep yourself up to date with OHV bans and restrictions in your area and familiarize yourself with the Off-highway Vehicle Regulation in Alberta which outlines various offences

• The lack of a spark arrest device and the accumulation of debris around a hot exhaust system presents an increased risk for fire.

RCMP additionally ask community members in all areas affected by wildfires to familiarize themselves with:

 Forest and Prairie Protection (Ministerial) Regulation
 Forest and Prairie Protection Act

• Forest and Prairie Protection Regulation

• Provincial Parks (General) Regulation

Reports of criminal activity are taken seriously and RCMP encourage communities to report any suspicious or criminal activities.

#### Fire Services Continues to Monitor 2 Fire Areas Under the State of Local Emergency

A reminder that May 4, 2023, Lac Ste. Anne County declared a State of Local Emergency (SOLE) for the wildfire in the area of Twp Rd 560. The SOLE was expanded on May 5 to include the Lessard Lake Estates fire.

Under the Alberta Emergency Management Act, a SOLE grants the municipality extraordinary powers for emergency response necessary to mitigate the hazard - these two Wildfires.

As of this printing, both fires remain active and not extinguished, as such the SOLE has been extended. The County will remain under this State of Local Emergency until these fires can safely be deemed non-emergent and safe for our residents.

With the wildfire situation continuing to improve, Alberta's provincial state of emergency is expiring but all resourcing and support remains in place.

Although the wildfire situation remains serious in the northern areas of the province, the extraordinary powers of the Emergency Management Act are no longer required to ensure emergency responders and wildfire firefighters continue keeping Albertans and their properties safe. These efforts will especially continue in the Fort Chipewyan area and other communities where residents remain evacuated.

"Wildfires are still burning

in many parts of northerm Alberta, and hundreds of people are still away from their homes. Although the provincial state of emergency is expiring, we will continue to use all of our resources to fight these fires and protect communities. No community will be left behind, and all the resources of the provincial government will continue to be available to those who need it."

Mike Ellis, Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Services

Alberta is working closely with local authorities and other agencies to ensure the province has the firefighting resources needed for the rest of the wildfire season.

Albertans who have been

evacuated or are returning home should continue to follow updates from their local authorities. Information is also available at Alberta.ca/emergency or by calling 310-4455 any time of the day or night. Evacuees should still register at a local reception centre or at emergencyregistration. alberta.ca. Situation reports will continue to be distributed daily to the public and media.

To help prevent more wildfires from starting, Albertans should check Albertafirebans.ca and abide by any bans or restrictions in their area.

June 3 is also the final day that the Government of Alberta and Government of Canada will match donations to the Red Cross 2023 Alberta Fires Appeal. Every \$1 donated to the Red Cross appeal will become \$3 to support those affected by the wildfires.

The Liberal government finally expelled the People's Republic of China (PRC) diplomat, Zhao Wei, who targeted and threatened elected Conservative Member of Parliament Michael Chong and his family. We know Johnston is a member of the Beijing-funded Trudeau Foundation. Would you not agree that this boils down to a fake job intended to legitimize this Liberal cover-up and disregard the call for a public inquiry?

Consider this - in the House of Commons, every single political party except for the Liberals voted in favour of a public inquiry. Don't you think the actions demonstrated by the Trudeau Liberals throughout this entire affair has been a record of disappointment, mismanagement, and denying Canadians the truth? # PARKLAND RCMP INTRODUCES OPTION IV FOR DISTRACTED DRIVING VIOLATIONS

On May 8, 2023, Parkland RCMP hosted their first session of the Option IV Distracted Driving Program. In Alberta, Distracted Driving violations come with a hefty fine of \$300 and 3 demerit points, which can result in significant increases to your insurance premiums. Previously, driver's had three options: pay the fine, plead not guilty in writing by mail, or appear in person before a Justice on the court date provided.

The Option IV Distractive Driving Program gives drivers a fourth option. If eligible, they can be invited to participate in a 60 minute educational presentation on the dangers of distracted driving. Completion of the session results in the ticket being withdrawn, with no requirement to pay the fine or loss of demerit points.

Parkland RCMP's inaugural Option IV session was hosted by Constable Shawn Lawrence, and Community Peace Officers Jennifer Penner and Adam Wenmen. It received 100% attendance from the nine people who were eligible to participate.

Drivers who receive Distracted Driving violations are only eligible for participating in the Option IV program once, and there must be a session date available in the near future. If Option IV is available, the driver will be notified at the time the violation ticket is issued. Parkland RCMP intends to continue offering Option IV at regular intervals, in the hopes that driver behaviours can be changed.

According to Alberta Health Services statistics, 80% of crashes are a result of driver inattention. Talking on your cell phone makes you four times more likely to get into a collision, and texting increases that risk to 23 times more likely.

"We want to give people a second chance," says Constable Shawn Lawrence. "Texting and driving, in particular, is such a common mistake. But it's a mistake that can be very expensive at best, or fatal at worst. We want to educate people on the dangers that they may not even be aware of."

Alberta Health Services (AHS) continues to closely monitor the provincial wildfire situation, and is reminding Albertans how to access care and support as needed.

Approximately 300 people have been evacuated from healthcare facilities in their home communities due to wildfires, and AHS is ensuring they are cared for and supported until they are able to return home.

AHS is providing healthcare support to reception centres in North, Edmonton, and Central Zones to ensure that those who have been evacuated are safe, comfortable, and cared for. This includes mental health, public health, nursing, home care, and pharmacy staff.

Patients who are expected for assessment or treatment for a cancer diagnosis in an evacuated area should call the Cancer Centre Transition Team toll-free at 1-888-432-8865. Our team will work with you to ensure your assessment or treatment remains as uninterrupted as possible.

All appointments with laboratory services, mental health and public health in evacuated communities are postponed at this time. Clients will be contacted directly by AHS to be rescheduled as soon as possible. Home care clients impacted by evacuations are being contacted to arrange for alternative home visits and support from nursing teams.

Four AHS acute care hos-

pitals – Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre, Edson Healthcare Centre, Fox Creek Healthcare Centre, and High Prairie Health Complex – remain evacuated and closed due to the risk of nearby wildfires. No evacuations were required over the past 24 hours.

In addition, Evansburg Health Centre/Good Samaritan Pembina Village, East Prairie Community Health Services, and Rainbow Lake Community Health Centre were evacuated late last week and remain closed.

Evacuated patients and continuing care residents are being cared for in safe and appropriate settings. All zones are opening care spaces to accommodate those in need.

These relocations took

place using EMS ground and air transport options and chartered buses as required. Whenever possible, patients and residents are being accompanied and supported by staff.

AHS continues to contact families of loved ones to share patient/resident location information, and all zones are actively working to ensure patients and residents are safely cared for in temporary locations.

AHS is also working with provincial and municipal leaders, as well as community partners, to be ready to return patients and residents to facilities as communities reopen. AHS is also prepared in the event that other sites are at risk from wildfire.
