



# DO WE REALLY WANT BILL 1?

Premier Smith has promised that no tax rate – neither personal nor corporate – would be raised under the UCP. Bill 1 of a new UCP government would enshrine that promise in law by prohibiting any tax hike without public approval in a referendum.

At first thought that would seem to be a taxpayer's dream, but a second and a third thought show it would be disastrous. Such an act would cripple new measures and new directions. Most likely it would make reaction to an emergency almost impossible. It would even cripple what we have

The elected government has the responsibility to pay

its way. The government, not the electorate who chose them to do so, has to balance what goes out with what comes in. The tax effects of 'bracket creep' are too low to help much, and imposition of greater royalties or fees does not seem to be considered, either. How can the provincial government continue to balance the books?

Referenda are often used by governments to 'pass the buck' onto the populace when they do not wish to face uncomfortable obligations. After all, it is impossible to share all the multitude of possible effects of the referendum prior to the vote on it; the average person has no access to the necessary information available to the MLA's. A public vote on such an issue could only be invalid.

One obvious question is: who would vote to raise taxes? Could Alberta ever again expect corporate or personal taxes to match other provinces? What is the intention here, and what would result after such a referendum?

A frozen tax base would leave a government unable to adjust programs even when needed. It would curtail improvements. It would prevent compensation for population growth or inflation or

downturn in oil revenues. It would hobble government services such as health, education, social services and infrastructure. It would prevent our government from offering in-

centives for sustainable energy programs and the like. It would be a tourniquet on the arteries of Alberta. In other words, it would stifle our economy.

On the other hand, it would ensure that Albertans would have to turn more and more to private services, since the government could not meet its obligations. Perhaps that is the intention.

And when the problems become dire, who is to blame? Not the government, surely! The government response: "We gave them the choice and the citizens chose for themselves"...

•An evacuation order remains in effect for the hamlet of Fort Chipewyan, Mikisew Cree First Nation (Allison Bay, Dog Head and Devils Gate), Fort Chipewyan Metis Nation and Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation. Parts of Sturgeon Lake Cree Nation remain under evacuation order.

•An evacuation alert remains in effect for Woodlands County as of 6:51 p.m. on June 9: north of Township Road 561, west of Range Road 120 south of Groat Creek Road, Township Road 584 west of the McLeod River to Range Road 144 east of the McLeod River to Range Road 123 at Whitecourt Mountain.

•An evacuation alert remains in effect for Grande Prairie County for everyone

# NEW! Busing Distance Eligibility Update for September 2023

In April 2023, the Alberta Government approved changes to the distance eligibility for transportation service effective for September 2024.

- The eligible transportation distance criteria of 2.4 kms from the student's primary residence to the school will be reduced. New distance criteria for eligible service is:
  - 1.0 km or more for children in kindergarten and students in Grades 1-6; and,
  - 2.0 kms or more for students in Grades 7-12 will qualify for transportation service.

As a phased approach to implementing the new service criteria, Grande Yellowhead Public School Division is moving to implement the changes for September 2023.

Families who qualify for eligible service under the new distance criteria are invited to register for busing as soon as possible. The Division will try to accommodate as many newly eligible riders as possible. Registrations received after June 30, 2023, are subject to seat availability.

# <u>FEE-BASED SERVICES</u>: INELIGIBLE AND ALTERNATE (SECOND) SEAT REQUESTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Requests for ineligible bus service should also register by the June 30 deadline; however, please note that eligible students will have priority on all routes.

Based on increased eligible riders, ineligible riders may not receive confirmation of a seat until after September 30, 2023. Additionally, requests for alternate (second) seats on other bus routes may not be confirmed until after September 30, 2023.

The Division is currently looking to recruit and train new bus drivers in anticipation of increases to eligible student ridership once the mandatory service requirement comes into effect in 2024. Please visit the **Careers** page on the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca/working-at-gypsd.

•Alberta currently has approximately 2,700 personnel working on wildfires. This includes support from partner agencies across Canada, the United States, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa, as well as the Canadian Armed Forces.

Members from GYPSD's Learning Services team attended the Western Canada Mental Health Summit in Calgary May 24-26, 2023.

Erin Bezzola B.E.S.T Program Manager - Bringing Empowered Students Together/ Mental Health Capacity Building In School Initiative, Karen Riggs and Lisa Beckstead (BEST Success Coaches), Tara Burdock (Family School Liaison Counselor) and Crystal Virtanen, the Division Psychologist took part in the three day conference.

The summit included over 30 sessions focused on ef-

fective intervention strategies, recent advances, and specific topics to improve the skills and competencies of mental health and education professionals.

Although the highlights were different for each member of the team, everyone agreed that having access to specialists in their field who could provide tangible strategies to support their school communities was the biggest takeaway.

The conference provided a valuable opportunity to also learn what is new and emerging in the field including resources and available supports.

The team has plans to

share their learning with the rest of the counseling team members at a future professional development day in the fall.

# CARE AND SUPPORT AVAILABLE FROM AHS ACROSS PROVINCE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Alberta Health Services (AHS) continues to closely monitor the provincial wildfire situation, and is reminding Albertans how to access care and support as needed.

Approximately 300 people have been evacuated from healthcare facilities in their home communities due to wildfires, and AHS is ensuring they are cared for and supported until they are able to return home.

AHS is providing health-care support to reception centres in North, Edmonton, and Central Zones to ensure that those who have been evacuated are safe, comfortable, and cared for. This includes mental health, public health, nursing, home care, and pharmacy staff.

Patients who are expected for assessment or treatment for a cancer diagnosis in an evacuated area should call the Cancer Centre Transition Team toll-free at 1-888-432-8865. Our team will work with you to ensure your assessment or treatment remains as uninterrupted as possible.

All appointments with laboratory services, mental health and public health in evacuated communities are postponed at this time. Clients will be contacted directly by AHS to be rescheduled as soon as possible. Home care clients impacted by evacuations are being contacted to arrange for alternative home visits and support from nursing teams.

Four AHS acute care hospitals – Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre, Edson Healthcare Centre,

Alberta Fox Creek Healthcare Centre, and High Prairie Health Complex – remain evacuated and closed due to the risk of nearby wildfires. No evacuations were required over the past 24 hours.

In addition, Evansburg Health Centre/Good Samaritan Pembina Village, East Prairie Community Health Services, and Rainbow Lake Community Health Centre were evacuated late last week and remain closed.

Evacuated patients and continuing care residents are being cared for in safe and appropriate settings. All zones are opening care spaces to accommodate those in need.

These relocations took place using EMS ground and air transport options and chartered buses as required. Whenever possible, patients and residents are being accompanied and supported by staff.

AHS continues to contact families of loved ones to share patient/resident location information, and all zones are actively working to ensure patients and residents are safely cared for in temporary locations.

AHS is also working with provincial and municipal leaders, as well as community partners, to be ready to return patients and residents to facilities as communities reopen. AHS is also prepared in the event that other sites are at risk from wildfire.

We are extremely grateful to our frontline staff, physicians, EMS crews and supporting agencies, who have gone above and beyond to ensure impacted patients and residents continue to get the care they need.

We are also grateful for

our partner organizations, including several continuing care organizations, that continue to support these efforts, and are appreciative of our community partners and volunteers who continue to answer when called upon for their support.

AHS has been working to identify additional staffing supports across all zones to ensure patients, residents and our care teams continue to be appropriately supported.

If you have an emergency, please call 911. EMS resources remain in evacuated areas to provide support to those who need.

AHS provides wildfire resources for Albertans at AHS.ca/wildfire, including mental health, air quality, and emergency planning links.







# MP GERALD SOROKA INTRODUCES NOAH'S LAW IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

Submitted by MP Gerald Soroka

MP Gerald Soroka, Conservative Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, moved for leave to introduce Bill C-336, Strengthening Reporting Requirements for Sex Offenders Act (Noah's Law). He said:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to present my first Private Member's Bill, entitled Strengthening Reporting Obligations for Sex Offenders Act, (Noah's Law), which is seconded by the Member for Battle River—Crowfoot.

This bill will empower vulnerable people, such as women and children, by legislating highly-likely repeat sex offenders' compliance with conditions outlined under the Sex Offender Information Registration Act, (SOIRA), under court orders.

For most people, September 16, 2021, was an uneventful day, but for Cody McConnell, his life was destroyed by a tragic event when his 24-year-old fiancé, Mchale Busch, and his 16-month-old son, Noah McConnell, were murdered by a 53-year-old registered sex offender who was deemed highly likely to reoffend. Because of this horrible and devastating event, Cody McConnell does not want anyone else to experience what he went through and still endures every day.

Noah's law would allow a court to order highly-likely-to-repeat offenders to comply with SOIRA for 30 years to protect the public, complete a sexual behaviour rehabilitation/treatment program before the termination of the order, increase the frequency of reporting to a registration centre before moving to a new address and make it an offence if offend-

ers fail to report to a registration centre in accordance with SOIRA.

I would like to acknowledge Laura MacRae, the lawyer and family friend of Cody McConnell who drafted Noah's law. I am also extremely pleased to have Senator Boisvenu introduce Noah's Law into the Senate tomorrow afternoon.

I would like to acknowl-

edge the Member for Red Deer–Lacombe for supporting Noah's law by sponsoring petition e-4460. The petition has only been online for just over a week and already has over 1,100 signatures.

My heart goes out to Cody McConnell and his family and friends. Mchale Busch and Noah McConnell have not been forgotten. Their deaths should lead to meaningful change within Canada's criminal justice system so that no other family will have to go through a tragedy like this again, and this bill will do just that. MPs and senators should quickly pass this bill.

I would also like to thank Cody McConnell and his family and friends who came from Alberta to join us today."

# **HOW TO HELP KIDS GET INTO GOLF**

Golf is a game of skill that can take years, if not decades, to master. Many golfers find their time on the golf course both rewarding and relaxing, even on those days when the fairways seem impossible to find.

Though many players never swing a golf club until they reach adulthood, it's never too early to hit the links. Some of the world's most accomplished golfers, including four-time Masters champion Tiger Woods, began playing as toddlers, and many feel that getting an early start can lead to a more successful game down the road.

Getting kids into golf is a great way for parents to bond with their children while enjoying the great outdoors. Golf can also be used to teach kids humility, sportsmanship and the importance of hard work. Thanks to the often frustrating nature of golf, parents may find it somewhat challenging to instill a love of the game in their youngsters. But there are ways to introduce kids to this wonderful game that kids might just play for the rest of their lives.

• Focus on having fun. Few, if any, golfers at your local golf course on a given weekend could say with certainty that golf has never frustrated them. The challenge of golf may be its most appealing characteristic to older players, but young kids can be easily overwhelmed by the challenges golf presents. By focusing on having fun instead of perfect-

ing techniques, parents can get kids to look forward to their time on the links. The more fun kids have, the more likely they will be to embrace the game and its many challenges. Don't put pressure on youngsters as they develop their games, but encourage them through their struggles and reassure them that you faced the same obstacles when you started playing.

• Hire an instructor with experience teaching children. Instructors with experience teaching children will understand the basics of the game and how learning those basics provides a great foundation for future enjoyment and success on

the course. Instructors who have taught kids in the past also know that teaching youngsters the finer points of golf requires patience and encouragement. Ask a fellow parent or an employee at the club where you play to recommend an instructor for your child. And take advantage of any kids' courses your club offers.

• Purchase the correct equipment. Even the best golfers are bound to struggle when using the wrong equipment. While it might be unwise to invest in especially expensive equipment for youngsters likely to grow out of it in a few months' time, deals can be found on used kids' equipment. Used kids' equipment is

typically subjected to less wear and tear than used equipment for adults, as kids tend to play less often and fewer holes than adults when they do play. But make sure to find correctly sized equipment that kids feel comfortable using.

• Play some holes. Instructors may teach kids the differences between the types of clubs and how to swing and putt. But golf is most fun when players are out on the links going from hole to hole. Instruction is important, but don't forget to play a few holes with your child each week as well.

Golf is a challenging game, but it's one that can be enjoyed by athletes of all ages.

The Enoch recovery community will not only increase the number of addiction treatment beds in the Edmonton region, it will be the start of a new path – and a new life – for hundreds of people every year."
