



The rising cost of living is a top concern for Albertans and Alberta's government remains committed to keeping everyday life more affordable by saving Albertans 13 cents per litre every time they fill up for the remainder of the year. This will help an Alberta family save between \$6 and \$18 every time they fill up their vehicle.

The fuel tax pause program has provided relief at a time of need and will continue to support Albertans. To date, Albertans have saved \$1.5 billion and paid what have often been the lowest fuel prices in the country. Extending the pause will save another \$520 million for Albertans.

fuel taxes in April of 2022 and paused taxes again in January to help combat high inflation. Now, Albertans will continue to save the full 13-cent tax on every litre of gas and diesel regardless of oil prices until at least Dec. 31, thanks to another extension of the fuel tax pause.

Since beginning the program, Alberta families have regularly paid less for gas than Canadians across all other provinces. Currently, Alberta families pay an average of 141.4 cents per litre, well below the Canadian average of 158.8 cents per litre. "These savings have and will continue to have a real

will continue to have a real impact on the pocketbooks of Albertans. This measure is just one of many to help Albertans with the rising cost of living and it's relief we can provide thanks to Alberta's strong fiscal position."

Alberta's strong fiscal position allows the government to fund affordability measures like the fuel tax relief program while also continuing to save and build on Alberta's economic advantage. Effective Jan. 1, Albertans will continue to benefit from the permanent fuel tax relief program that provides provincial fuel tax savings based on the price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI).

With the federal government's carbon tax increase in April, Albertans are now paying about 31 cents in federal taxes per litre of gas.

During the month of May 2023, the Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) and Drug Unit found themselves very busy responding to vehicles fleeing from police. Additional resources were able to come together to assist, resulting in the successful arrest of multiple individuals.

On May 12, 2023, Parkland RCMP Drug and CRU Units investigated an incident of criminal flight from police involved a stolen Dodge Ram in the area of Stony Plain, Alta. With the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services, Edmonton Police Air One, and Parkland General Duty mem-

Submitted by Parkland bers, 34-year-old Kenneth Wayne Curtis (resident of Drayton Valley) and 44-year-old Daniel Gordon Schacher (resident of Parkland County) were safely arrested in the area of Range

> Road 30 and Highway 627. Kenneth Wayne Curtis is charged with dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, and possession of property obtained by crime. He was released from police custody on conditions, with his first court appearance set for June 21, 2023.

Daniel Gordon Schacher is also charged with possession of property obtained by crime. He was held for a Judicial Interim Release Hearing and subsequently released. His first appearance was set for May 25,

2023.

On May 18, 2023, Parkland RCMP Drug and CRU Units investigated another incident of criminal flight from police, this time involving a motorcycle. With the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services, Edmonton Police Air One, and Parkland General Duty members, a male resident of Stony Plain was safely arrested in a grocery store parking lot in Spruce Grove.

A search warrant was subsequently completed at a residence in the 51st Street area of Stony Plain. 42-yearold Michael Stephen Simmons (resident of Spruce Grove) was charged with criminal flight from police, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, operation

while prohibited, failure to comply with a release order, and driving an uninsured motor vehicle on a highway. These matters were recently resolved in court.

Individuals engaging in criminal flight from police pose an extreme risk to the motoring public. Therefore, alternate strategies such as airborne surveillance and covert vehicles are utilized to minimize that risk. The individuals can then be apprehended at a time and location safest to do so. The safety of the public is the RCMP's top priority.

With summer comes the increase use of recreational off-highway vehicles (OHVs) such as quads, dirt bikes and side-by-sides. Alberta RCMP reminds citizens to safely store and protect their recreational vehicles to deter opportunistic thieves. The more difficult you make it for thieves, the less likely they are to take what's not theirs.

Here are some tips to keep your recreational vehicles safe:

Do not leave keys in or near the vehicle when left unattended.

When you're done riding, store your vehicle in

Alberta a locked garage or shed.

Park larger vehicles in front of your OHV to block it from being easily moved.

Secure OHVs outside with a lock and chain. Cover vehicles with a tarp, and keep them away from the main roads. Out of sight, out of mind!

For extra protection, keep outdoor lights on at night.

If you are storing your OHV for a long period of time, consider removing the fuse, deflating the tires, and emptying the gas tank.

Keep track of serials numbers, along with photos, of your recreational vehicles should a theft occur

If you're OHV doesn't already have one, consider installing a GPS tracking system.

Follow us on Twitter (@ RCMPAlberta) and Face-(@RCMPinAlberta) book for crime prevention tips this month to keep your OHVs safe so you can enjoy them all season long!

Reminder, OHVs are not permitted for use during fire bans. Exhaust systems can heat up to temperatures over 200 degrees Celsius. Debris falling from OHVs can heat up and smoulder, eventually igniting and creating a wildfire.







Spring 2023 is in the books and it was a busy one for us here at the Alberta Beach library!

Along with all of the lending and other services we offer, we were pleased to host some fun programming for our communities.

We partnered with Lac Ste. Anne County for two terrarium building workshops. Participants could bring a glass container or use one we provided and build their own terrarium with the plants we supplied. Lorraine Taylor with LSAC provided excellent information about the process and the plants and a great time was had by all.

Our book club, going on its 10th year, meets every month. This is a very popular club, with over 25 people reading the book each month and, on average, 15 people coming to talk about it. We tell our participants.... "come to the meeting, even if.....you didn't read the book, you didn't finish the book, you hated the book, your cat ate the book" Part of the purpose of the club is social - come for a little chat with the other members - and part is to learn from others - everyone has a different perspective on each month's selection. That is what is so fun. The books that most people didn't enjoy are the discussions that we remember the best. The best compliment for us planning the book club is when someone says, "I would not have picked that book for myself but I'm glad I read it".

We have a writers group that meets here every couple of weeks to discuss ideas, get feedback, and get inspiration to continue the writing process. Sometimes the participants are challenged to do a task before the next meeting and they find this very motivating to continue working on their project.

Our group of crocheters/ knitters continue to meet every week to share ideas, inspire each other, and have some social time. We love to see the creations from this wonderful group of ladies. Last year they crocheted and knitted enough items so that each person receiving a Lions Christmas Hamper also received a special crocheted/knitted item.

In April we were able to host two nights of water colour painting sessions. These were extremely popular and the spots filled up fast. Similarly, the two soapstone carving classes that we held filled up in record time. We hope to offer more art and carving classes in the fall.

And finally, to cap off our beautiful spring, we welcomed Wallingford Farm's baby animals for our "Read to Baby Animals" fun event. The weather was spectacular and everyone who came out had a wonderful time with the animals. There were several instances when parents were shocked that their child was reading to the animal, because he/ she "never reads". One parent took a picture to send to her child's teacher because it was such an amazing moment. It is these experiences that are so inspiring to us.


Summer planning is now in full gear. Our summer clubs and STEAM fun sessions will run on Wednesdays and Fridays, starting July 5. More details will be provided as soon as all is in place. Through the month of July (until August 9) we be hosting a Value Village FUNDriver fundraiser. We will have a trailer in our parking lot to collect all your unwanted household items, clothes, shoes, books, dvds, tools, etc. - we'll take it all! Value Village will pay us for all the items that we collect and the money will be used to support all of our programs and purchase new library materials. Please bring us your unwanted items - we want them!

And finally, we will once again hold our annual book/dvd sale in our parking lot during Poly Days weekend. Be sure to mark your calendar and come out to support all that we do here at the library. If you can spare a few hours that weekend to help us with set up and take down for the sale (tables set up and book boxes moved in or out of library), we would greatly appreciate the help. It takes a lot of volunteers to put on this event; we can't do it without them.

Stop in sometime and say "hi". We'd be glad to meet you. Library memberships are only \$15 per year and can be used anywhere in the province. If I haven't convinced you yet that we are not "just books", keep reading. We lend puzzles, wifi hubs, magazines, dvds, and audiobooks. We have eaudiobooks and ebooks available through our Libby app., fantastic for trips and long rides in the car. In the winter we lend snowshoes and this year we may add a metal detector to our items for loan. Year-round we have a rack of books you can buy by donation and we sell chocolate bars and ice cold water for \$1.00 each.
