Parkland RCMP Drug And Crime Reduction Units Make Multiple Arrests Of Suspects Fleeing Police

On May 12, 2023, Parkland RCMP Drug and CRU Units investigated an incident of criminal flight from police involved a stolen Dodge Ram in the area of Stony Plain, Alta. With the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services, Edmonton Police Air One, and Parkland General Duty members, 34-year-old Kenneth Wayne Curtis (resident of Drayton Valley) and 44-year-old Daniel Gordon Schacher (resident of Parkland County) were safely arrested in the area of Range Road 30 and Highway 627.

Kenneth Wayne Curtis is charged with dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, and possession of property obtained by crime. He

was released from police custody on conditions, with his first court appearance set for June 21, 2023.

Daniel Gordon Schacher is also charged with possession of property obtained by crime. He was held for a Judicial Interim Release Hearing and subsequently released. His first appearance was set for May 25, 2023.

On May 18, 2023, Parkland RCMP Drug and CRU Units investigated another incident of criminal flight from police, this time involving a motorcycle. With the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services, Edmonton Police Air One, and Parkland General Duty members, a male resident of Stony Plain was safely

arrested in a grocery store parking lot in Spruce Grove.

A search warrant was subsequently completed at a residence in the 51st Street area of Stony Plain. 42-year-old Michael Stephen Simmons (resident of Spruce Grove) was charged with criminal flight from police, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, operation while prohibited, failure to comply with a release order, and driving an uninsured motor vehicle on a highway. These matters were recently resolved in court.

Individuals engaging in criminal flight from police pose an extreme risk to the motoring public. Therefore, alternate strategies such as airborne surveillance

FUEL TAX PAUSED UNTIL DECEMBER 31

Cabinet and Treasury Board have voted to extend the fuel tax pause through the remainder of the year, fulfilling a promise made by Premier Danielle Smith and the United Conservatives during the recent election campaign.

The rising cost of living is a top concern for Albertans and Alberta's government remains committed to keeping everyday life more affordable by saving Albertans 13 cents per litre every time they fill up for the remainder of the year. This will help an Alberta family save between \$6 and \$18 every time they fill up their vehicle.

The fuel tax pause pro-

gram has provided relief at a time of need and will continue to support Albertans. To date, Albertans have saved \$1.5 billion and paid what have often been the lowest fuel prices in the country. Extending the pause will save another \$520 million for Albertans.

"We are committed to keeping life affordable for Alberta families. Saving Albertans money when they fill up is Step 1 of this commitment. We will work every day to ensure that Alberta families can put more of their hard-earned money toward their essential needs."

Alberta's government first introduced a pause on fuel taxes in April of 2022 and paused taxes again in Janu-

ary to help combat high inflation. Now, Albertans will continue to save the full 13-cent tax on every litre of gas and diesel regardless of oil prices until at least Dec. 31, thanks to another extension of the fuel tax pause.

Since beginning the program, Alberta families have regularly paid less for gas than Canadians across all other provinces. Currently, Alberta families pay an average of 141.4 cents per litre, well below the Canadian average of 158.8 cents per litre.

"These savings have and will continue to have a real impact on the pocketbooks of Albertans. This measure is just one of many to help Albertans with the rising cost of living and it's relief we can provide thanks to

Alberta's strong fiscal position."

Alberta's strong fiscal position allows the government to fund affordability measures like the fuel tax relief program while also continuing to save and build on Alberta's economic advantage. Effective Jan. 1, Albertans will continue to benefit from the permanent fuel tax relief program that provides provincial fuel tax savings based on the price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI).

With the federal government's carbon tax increase in April, Albertans are now paying about 31 cents in federal taxes per litre of gas.



PARKLAND RCMP DRUG UNIT MAKE ARREST IN DRUG TRAFFICKING INVESTIGATION

On Apr. 18, 2023, Parkland RCMP Drug Unit initiated an investigation into allegations of drug trafficking. The accused was on house arrest conditions stemming from a prior conviction for drug trafficking at the time.

Through the course of the investigation, Parkland RCMP Drug Unit seized 47 grams of methamphetamine, 13.8 grams of cocaine, and 4.3 grams of MDMA.

On June 14, 2023, 33-year-old James Michael Smith, a resident of Spruce Grove, was arrested in relation to this in-

vestigation. He is charged with four counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, and four counts of possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking.

James Michael Smith was held for a Judicial Interim Release hearing and subsequently remanded into custody. He

is set to appear in Stony Plain court on July 5, 2023.

ALBERTA RCMP REMIND OFF-ROAD ENTHUSIASTS TO SAFELY STORE AND PROTECT THEIR VEHICLES

With summer comes the increase use of recreational off-highway vehicles (OHVs) such as quads, dirt bikes and side-by-sides. Alberta RCMP reminds citizens to safely store and protect their recreational vehicles to deter opportunistic thieves. The more difficult you make it for thieves, the less likely they are to take what's not theirs.

Here are some tips to keep your recreational vehicles

safe:

- Do not leave keys in or near the vehicle when left unattended.
- When you're done riding, store your vehicle in a locked garage or shed.
- Park larger vehicles in front of your OHV to block it from being easily moved.
- Secure OHVs outside with a lock and chain. Cover vehicles with a tarp, and keep them away from the main roads. Out of sight, out of mind!
- For extra protec-

tion, keep outdoor lights on at night.

- If you are storing your OHV for a long period of time, consider removing the fuse, deflating the tires, and emptying the gas tank.
 - Keep track of serials numbers, along with photos, of your recreational vehicles should a theft occur.
 - If you're OHV doesn't already have one, consider installing a GPS tracking system.
- Follow us on Twitter (@RCMPAlberta) and Face-

book (@RCMPinAlberta) for crime prevention tips this month to keep your OHVs safe so you can enjoy them all season long!

Reminder, OHVs are not permitted for use during fire bans. Exhaust systems can heat up to temperatures over 200 degrees Celsius. Debris falling from OHVs can heat up and smoulder, eventually igniting and creating a wildfire.

NEW! Busing Distance Eligibility Update for September 2023

In April 2023, the Alberta Government approved changes to the distance eligibility for transportation service effective for September 2024.

- The eligible transportation distance criteria of 2.4 kms from the student's primary residence to the school will be reduced. **New** distance criteria for eligible service is:

1.0 km or more for children in kindergarten and students in Grades 1-6; and,
2.0 kms or more for students in Grades 7-12 will qualify for transportation service.

As a phased approach to implementing the new service criteria, Grande Yellowhead Public School Division is moving to implement the changes for September 2023.

Families who qualify for eligible service under the new distance criteria are invited to register for busing as soon as possible. The Division will try to accommodate as many newly eligible riders as possible. Registrations received after June 30, 2023, are subject to seat availability.

FEE-BASED SERVICES: INELIGIBLE AND ALTERNATE (SECOND) SEAT REQUESTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

Requests for ineligible bus service should also register by the June 30 deadline; however, please note that eligible students will have priority on all routes.

Based on increased eligible riders, ineligible riders may not receive confirmation of a seat until after September 30, 2023. Additionally, requests for alternate (second) seats on other bus routes may not be confirmed until after September 30, 2023.

The Division is currently looking to recruit and train new bus drivers in anticipation of increases to eligible student ridership once the mandatory service requirement comes into effect in 2024. Please visit the **Careers** page on the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca/working-at-gypsd.

RURAL COMMUNITY UNDERGRAD NURSING DEGREE EXPANDS WAINWRIGHT, DRAYTON VALLEY TO BOTH HOST UCALGARY, AHS PROGRAM

Building on the success of their pilot program in Wainwright, Alberta Health Services (AHS) and University of Calgary (UCalgary) are expanding their Bachelor of Nursing degree to Drayton Valley.

Starting in the fall of 2024, the degree program will accept up to nine students living in the Drayton Valley area who will earn a university degree to become a registered nurse without leaving their home community.

"I am thrilled for Drayton Valley and area, as this program will provide an excellent opportunity for potential students interested in a future in healthcare," says Andrew Boitchenko, MLA-elect for Drayton Valley-Devon.

"It also fills a significant need for skilled nurses in the region, which is good news for patients and families in the community." The Chief Zone Officer for AHS Central Zone agrees.

"Recruitment of nursing staff, especially to rural sites, is challenging across Alberta," says Janice Stewart, Chief Zone Officer with AHS Central Zone.

"By creating opportunities to educate registered nurses in their home communities, we are building capacity for a local, more sustainable workforce into the future."

With its inception in Wainwright in 2021, the Bachelor of Nursing program was developed as a way of reducing barriers to learning, recruiting students to healthcare careers, and en-

couraging graduates to stay in their home communities.

The program will have its third intake of students in Wainwright in the fall of 2023. Once all three Wainwright nursing cohorts (2021, 2022, 2023) have completed their four-year degree, approximately 23 new registered nurses are expected to join the workforce in Wainwright and area.

"Our community partners have been incredibly supportive of this program and have been integral to its success," says Sandra Davidson, Dean of the UCalgary Faculty of Nursing.

"As we continue to provide an excellent academic and clinical experience for students, we are grateful to work with partners who have an important stake in ensuring we are meeting the healthcare needs of our communities across Alberta."

The Town and M.D. of Wainwright have been key partners of the Wainwright program. UCalgary and AHS are working with municipal and health partners in Drayton Valley to replicate that success.

"I commend the municipal and foundation partners in Wainwright and area for championing this program," says Garth Rowswell, MLA-elect for Vermilion-Lloydminster-Wainwright.

"The enthusiasm and support of the community and the success of this program has allowed AHS and University of Calgary to commit to the education of registered nurses for this area for years to come."

The Drayton Valley program will run for two cohorts of students, with intakes in 2024 and 2025, with the goal of preparing 18 nursing graduates. Nursing students will take a combination of both virtual and in-person classes.

To ensure its long-term sustainability, the program will adopt a staggered intake in Wainwright to ensure there are enough qualified potential students and nursing positions within the program's geographic area. Following the fall 2023 intake in Wainwright, the program will open to new students every second year, with next intakes in the fall of 2025 and 2027.


