Cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) has been identified in the waters of Isle Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible.

Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this

lake).

Do not use water contaminated with cyanobacteria to water edible plants. This is particularly important for plants with edible parts exposed to the ground surface (such as cabbage, lettuce, tomatoes, and other salad vegetables).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any

Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible.

Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People **Continued on Page 3**

Cyanobacteria is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz, or globs on the surface of water, cyanobacteria can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible cyanobacteria or who ingest water containing cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to the bacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Isle Lake, until further notice.

Please note that waters of Isle Lake in which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place. If you suspect a problem related to cyanobacteria or if you require further information on health concerns and cyanobacteria, please call Health Link at 811. Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Whitecourt has terminated the State of Local Emergency (SOLE) that was issued on June 20, 2023. The SOLE allowed the Town of Whitecourt to evacuate areas of the community that were affected by high water levels on the Athabasca and Mc-Leod Rivers.

Whitecourt will be providing support to a provincially-lead project that proposes to construct a fireguard to protect critical infrastructure in Whitecourt and Woodlands County. Fireguards create a break in forest fuels driving wildfire; construction of a fireguard surrounding Whitecourt would reduce the threat of wildfire in our community.

The 2023 20-Year Capital and Major Maintenance Plan has been adopted. The Plan, which includes 138 projects, provides a vision for the long-term development of Whitecourt's infrastructure; land development; parks and trails; and, building and recreational/cultural facilities to meet the needs of our growing community. The Plan incorporates projects and timelines identified through engineering studies, planning sessions, workshops, budget deliberations, and public engagement activities. The Plan is available to view at www.whitecourt.ca/yourtown.

The annual review of Off -Site Levies is complete and, based on the study, rates will be changing as of January 1, 2024.

Off -Site Levies are a cost recovery tool that help pay for infrastructure projects that allow the community to grow, including roads, and water and sewage treatment.
