- Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

- Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from

this lake to your pets.

- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish filets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Nakamun Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will

not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria.

An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz, or globs on the surface of water, cyanobacteria can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible cyanobacteria or who ingest water containing cyano-


bacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to the bacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Nakamun Lake, until further notice.

Please note that waters of Nakamun Lake in

which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.

PARKLAND RCMP ARREST TWO YOUTH INVOLVED IN BEAR SPRAY INCIDENT

On June 23, 2023, at approximately 8 p.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a report of someone being threatened with a firearm and bear spray in the City's center. Police responded

with a number of officers. After a short foot pursuit, two youth males were taken into custody. A number of items were located on the two males which included bear spray, an imitation firearm and a collapsible baton.

The two 15-year-old males

have been charged with several offences including:

- Use of imitation firearm in the commission of an offence
- Possession of a weapon for dangerous purpose
- Carrying a concealed weapon

- Resist arrest
- Fail to comply with Court ordered conditions

The youth were released from custody and have their next Court appearance on August 4, 2023, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Stoney Plain.

BEEFING UP ACCESS TO CAPITAL FOR LIVESTOCK PRODUCERS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is ensuring the province's cattle sector can continue to grow and remain competitive.

Beef is Alberta's biggest agri-food export and raising loan limits will ensure the province's cattle producers are able to continue producing the world's best beef.

Amendments to the Feeder Associations Guarantee Regulation give feeder association members more options to purchase and market livestock and to generate better cash flow for their operations.

The changes raise individual and joint membership loan limits, excluding advances, to \$3 million from \$2 million.

"Feeder associations are an essential part of Alberta's livestock industry and are a proven way to support new entrants in primary agriculture. These amendments ensure thousands of producers across the province have access to the capital they need to keep producing Alberta's world-renowned beef."

Cattle prices have increased 25 per cent since the start of the year and are expected to keep rising. Alberta's livestock producers are in greater need of easily accessible, low-interest capital backed by a government guarantee.

Made up of local livestock producers, feeder associations take in cattle and sheep and feed them to get them to market weight before shipping them for processing.

Alberta's Feeder Associations Loan Guarantee Program helps local, producer-run cooperatives get competitive financing to ensure they can continue being a player in the global market.

"These changes will help to ensure continued sustainable growth in Alberta's livestock feeding sector, providing much-needed

support to our existing feeder members while making this capital-intensive business more viable and accessible to new entrants and young farmers in the current market environment."

These amendments follow last fall's Feeder Associa-

tions Guarantee Program's overall loan guarantee limit increase to \$150 million.

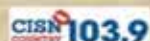

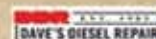

GOLFER'S GUIDE

THESE GOLF TERMS ARE PAR FOR THE COURSE

Golf is a game of sport and skill that can be played at any age. Millions of people in North America participate in golf as a recreational endeavor or a professional pursuit. As of the spring 2016, 25.13 million people in the United States played golf over the previous 12 months, according to Statistica.

People may immediately think Canada's sports-based loyalty favors hockey. However, on the recreational side, golf is king in the country. Canada has the fourth most golf courses of any country in the world, says the National Golf Foundation. Plus, one out of every 10 Canadians play golf - a participation rate

that is more than double that of the United States.

Storied golf history

Although golf can be traced back to the Netherlands during the Middle Ages, many people concur that the modern game of golf - played over 18 holes - is a Scottish invention.

The popularity of the sport began to spread throughout the world from Great Britain. The first permanent golf club in North America was founded in 1873 and was named Canada's Royal Montreal Club. The first 18-hole course in the United States was The Chicago Golf Club.

Golf lingo

Understanding the terminol-

ogy is key to becoming a full-fledged golf fanatic. While golf lingo is extensive, here is a sampling of some of the more popular terms to get novices started, courtesy of the PGA.

Approach: A shot hit towards the green.

Attack: The relative angle at which the clubhead approaches the ball at impact.

Backswing: The motion that involves the club and every element of the body in taking the club away from the ball.

Birdie: A score of one under par on a hole.

Bogey: A score of one over par on a hole.

Bunker: A hollow comprised of

sand or grass that serves as an obstacle.

Carry: The distance a ball will fly in the air.

Chip: A short approach with a low trajectory.

Chunk: A poor shot caused by hitting the turf.

Divot: The turf displaced when the club strikes the ball.

Downswing: The swing forward from the top of the backswing.

Eagle: A score of two under par on a hole.

Golf range: A facility where people can practice golf swings.

Grip: The positioning of hands on the club.

Hole: A round receptacle on the green that the ball is aimed into.

Lie: As it relates to the golf ball, the position when it has come to rest.

Links: Specific term for a course built on linksland, which is land reclaimed from the ocean.

Mulligan: An extra shot taken on a poor first shot.

Par: The score an accomplished player is expected to make on a hole, either a three, four or five.

Putt: A shot on the green.

Stance: The position of the feet.

Golf terms are as varied as the game itself. Knowing commonly used words and phrases makes for a more intimate understanding of the sport.

BACK IN THE SADDLE AGAIN

I want to thank you for taking the time to read this little article, truth be told it's because that you have, that I am back in the saddle again as the MLA of Lac Ste Anne - Parkland, and that we have a conservative government in office. This little paper gives me a chance for us to connect as the reader and the writer on personal terms. Unfiltered, a little rough around the edges sometimes, but with honesty, and with mutual respect and trust. I was taken aback by how many folks I've ran into over the last year, and especially during the campaign that told me they got to know who I was as a person through this article, not what the mainstream outlets may have said. Further to that, because they knew me, they were far less concerned about what the onslaught of adds were saying about the leader of our party.

I was also very impressed to know that the readership of this paper wasn't restricted to the "Grey Hairs" (of which I am a member of, and every grey hair has been earned by the way) it also included believe it or not, teenagers. I was surprised when a mom approached me on the sidewalk as her son wanted to meet me after my speech at Onoway's 100th Anniversary, the young man of 13 years old reads the articles all the time and wanted to shake my hand. That to me, speaks volumes of what kind of a constituency we have, and the great youngsters that will be growing into amazing young men and women, who in turn

are going to make some amazing parents. It gave me hope. It also reaffirmed how important the local media, and traditional mediums are. No censorship or filtering here, just you and I, batting things back and forth, like it should be.

Being sworn back in the second time was no less special than the first, it meant more to me in several ways, because it meant that I kept my word to you, and that you trusted me to be your voice. You trusted me to represent your best interests, understanding sometimes that also meant having me let you know that I disagreed with you on what you may have asked for, but that there may be another way to get you what you need. It meant that my style was also well suited to make things happen in the Legislature on behalf of the folks in our area, and often, for a large number of Albertans. Your voice matters, what matters to you ultimately can help others, because it's often impacting others the same way, however they may not speak up, and if I don't know about it, I can't help fix it. Let's keep the dialogue going.

We are going to be having some town halls in the next couple of weeks to discuss the wildfires, and some of the not so wild fires that could have or should have been prevented. I want to make sure that we have a constructive meeting, try to park the emotions outside so that we can get the good, the bad, and the ugly on the table and we can make some real changes. A post incident lessons learned. You have my commitment that the folks we bring to the table are of the

same mindset, and we will fix what didn't work. I ask that folks understand that we may not have all the answers as we are still working through a number of details, but we will get back to you in a timely manner.

Prior to the election, I had met with a number of seniors in our various lodges, homes, and even at the coffee shops. There were a number of items that were brought up that are not directly in my wheelhouse, but I met with the folks that it was. It will take some coordinating, but we can make some real hands on changes to make sure we address items you brought to my attention. One will be a "Silver Trail" that allows for better access to the amenities, and services in the town. Another will be to spool up a program that takes on successes of a course that has been running for years out in Wildwood and replicating in several other schools. The course will include grade 6 class students and seniors together working on projects. Think of it as a bridge between the generations and hands on learning, only someone who has been there and done that can simplify. Unfortunately, not every kid has a grandparent that is close at hand, and it goes the same for our seniors not having grandkids close. I'd like to see that the "Silver Trail" maintenance, improvements, and even some of the nice spots along the way include students' assistance. More to follow on that as we work out the details with the school board, principals, teachers, students, the town officials, and the seniors, but I'm rather excited about

the program. Stay tuned.

On the work front, I was given a few more things to manage by the Premier. I am now the Government Whip, which is basically like a Construction Manager or Project Manager dependent on your background. I was also added as the Alberta Lead for the Pacific Northwest Economic Region Foundation and allocated to the National Representative for the Council of State Governments, as well as the Midwest. Basically, it means I'll be meeting with a bunch of the elected representatives in the USA, and their trading partners to ensure that we take Alberta's story on the road, and directly to them. I'm very happy to have this ability, as Alberta, and our area has one heck of a good story to tell. I want to make sure we keep our area growing, and that folks in the south know how much of a role we have to play in the wellbeing for both of our countries.

ALBERTA SHERIFFS SHUT PARKLAND DRUG HOUSE

The Alberta Sheriffs have shut down a property in Parkland County that attracted criminal and drug activity to the area.

The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods (SCAN) unit of the Alberta Sheriffs obtained a court order against the owner of Lot 117 at 52318 Range Road 25 that gives investigators the authority to close the property for 90 days, starting at noon on June 22.

The community safety order, obtained in Court of King's Bench, bars people from the property until the closure period ends on Sept. 20. Crews are installing a fence around the lot and boarding up the house to prevent unauthorized access during the 90 days.

"Our government was elected with a mandate to make communities safer throughout Alberta. With support provided by the province's SCAN team, even rural areas are seeing positive changes that will have a lasting impact on the safety of their communities. We still have more work to do to improve public safety across the province, but this is a positive step forward. We value the dedication that our law enforcement shows to protecting Albertans."

The Alberta Sheriffs work with other law enforcement agencies to shut down properties being used for illegal activities. The Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods Act gives sheriffs the authority to target problem properties through

civil enforcement.

Since its inception in 2008, Alberta's SCAN unit has investigated more than 8,000 problem properties and issued approximately 100 community safety orders. Most complaints are resolved by working with property owners to keep criminal activity out of Alberta communities.

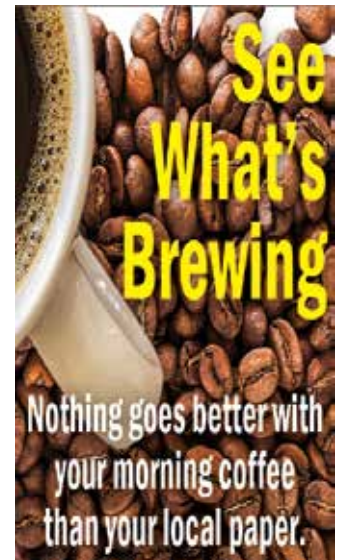
