First Reading of Bylaw 02.23 – Council gave First Reading to Bylaw 02.23, a bylaw to amend the Land Use Bylaw and rezone Plan 7622234 Block 4 Lot 1 from Country Residential District (CRD) to the Protection District (PD). A Public Hearing for the Bylaw has been set for July 25, 2023 at 9:30 AM.

Hinton Area Grader Beat Tender – Council awarded the 2023-2027 (multi-year) winter and summer gravel road maintenance contract to West Ridge Sand & Gravel Ltd. at the average rate of \$185/hour (GST excluded). This decision allows the gravel road maintenance program to proceed as planned.

Long Lake Road Embankment Slope Failure (Landslide) –Council directed Administration to conduct remedial measures immediately on an embankment slope failure located on the south side of TWP Rd 560, approving an un-budgeted expenditure of \$785,000.00.

East-West Rural Major Connector Roadway Upgrading Options - A site tour of Twp Rd 542 and Twp Rd 544 was conducted on June 20, 2023, for Administration and Council members to discuss potential roadway improvement options. Following discussion on feasibility and the most economic options pertaining to both roadways, Council directed Administration to proceed with the engineering and design process of upgrading Twp Rd 542. This will allow for

future consideration of the construction and paving of this roadway, subject to availability of funds.

Waiver of Penalty on Residential Property Tax – Due to the increased fire activity in the month of June and the additional evacuations experienced by County residents, Council approved the waiver of penalties on all residential properties lo-

cated in Yellowhead County until September 29, 2023.



BACK IN THE SADDLE AGAIN

I want to thank you for taking the time to read this little article, truth be told it's because that you have, that I am back in the saddle again as the MLA of Lac Ste Anne - Parkland, and that we have a conservative government in office. This little paper gives me a chance for us to connect as the reader and the writer on personal terms. Unfiltered, a little rough around the edges sometimes, but with honesty, and with mutual respect and trust. I was taken aback by how many folks I've ran into over the last year, and especially during the campaign that told me they got to know who I was as a person through this article, not what the mainstream outlets may have said. Further to that, because they knew me, they were far less concerned about what the onslaught of adds were saying about the leader of our party.

I was also very impressed to know that the readership of this paper wasn't restricted to the "Grey Hairs" (of which I am a member of, and every grey hair has been earned by the way) it also included believe it or not, teenagers. I was surprised when a mom approached me on the sidewalk as her son wanted to meet me after my speech at Onoway's 100th Anniversary, the young man of 13 years old reads the articles all the time and wanted to shake my hand. That to me, speaks volumes of what kind of a constituency we have, and the great youngsters that will be growing into amazing young men and women, who in turn

are going to make some amazing parents. It gave me hope. It also reaffirmed how important the local media, and traditional mediums are. No censorship or filtering here, just you and I, batting things back and forth, like it should be.

Being sworn back in the second time was no less special than the first, it meant more to me in several ways, because it meant that I kept my word to you, and that you trusted me to be your voice. You trusted me to represent your best interests, understanding sometimes that also meant having me let you know that I disagreed with you on what you may have asked for, but that there may be another way to get you what you need. It meant that my style was also well suited to make things happen in the Legislature on behalf of the folks in our area, and often, for a large number of Albertans. Your voice matters, what matters to you ultimately can help others, because it's often-impacting others the same way, however they may not speak up, and if I don't know about it, I can't help fix it. Let's keep the dialogue going.

We are going to be having some town halls in the next couple of weeks to discuss the wildfires, and some of the not so wild fires that could have or should have been prevented. I want to make sure that we have a constructive meeting, try to park the emotions outside so that we can get the good, the bad, and the ugly on the table and we can make some real changes. A post incident lessons learned. You have my commitment that the folks we bring to the table are of the

same mindset, and we will fix what didn't work. I ask that folks understand that we may not have all the answers as we are still working through a number of details, but we will get back to you in a timely manner.

Prior to the election, I had met with a number of seniors in our various lodges, homes, and even at the coffee shops. There were a number of items that were brought up that are not directly in my wheelhouse, but I met with the folks that it was. It will take some coordinating, but we can make some real hands on changes to make sure we address items you brought to my attention. One will be a "Silver Trail" that allows for better access to the amenities, and services in the town. Another will be to spool up a program that takes on successes of a course that has been running for years out in Wildwood and replicating in several other schools. The course will include grade 6 class students and seniors together working on projects. Think of it as a bridge between the generations and hands on learning, only someone who has been there and done that can simplify. Unfortunately, not every kid has a grandparent that is close at hand, and it goes the same for our seniors not having grandkids close. I'd like to see that the "Silver Trail" maintenance, improvements, and even some of the nice spots along the way include students' assistance. More to follow on that as we work out the details with the school board, principals, teachers, students, the town officials, and the seniors, but I'm rather excited about

the program. Stay tuned.

On the work front, I was given a few more things to manage by the Premier. I am now the Government Whip, which is basically like a Construction Manager or Project Manager dependent on your background. I was also added as the Alberta Lead for the Pacific Northwest Economic Region Foundation and allocated to the National Representative for the Council of State Governments, as well as the Midwest. Basically, it means I'll be meeting with a bunch of the elected representatives in the USA, and their trading partners to ensure that we take Alberta's story on the road, and directly to them. I'm very happy to have this ability, as Alberta, and our area has one heck of a good story to tell. I want to make sure we keep our area growing, and that folks in the south know how much of a role we have to play in the wellbeing for both of our countries.

THESE GOLF TERMS ARE PAR FOR THE COURSE

Golf is a game of sport and skill that can be played at any age. Millions of people in North America participate in golf as a recreational endeavor or a professional pursuit. As of the spring 2016, 25.13 million people in the United States played golf over the previous 12 months, according to Statistica.

People may immediately think Canada's sports-based loyalty favors hockey. However, on the recreational side, golf is king in the country. Canada has the fourth most golf courses of any country in the world, says the National Golf Foundation. Plus, one out of every 10 Canadians play golf - a participation rate that is more than double that of the United States.

Storied golf history

Although golf can be traced back to the Netherlands during the Middle Ages, many people concur that the modern game of golf - played over 18 holes - is a Scottish invention.

The popularity of the sport began to spread throughout the world from Great Britain. The first permanent golf club in North America was founded in 1873 and was named Canada's Royal Montreal Club. The first 18-hole course in the United States was The Chicago Golf Club.

Golf lingo

Understanding the terminology is key to becoming a full-fledged golf fanatic. While golf lingo is extensive, here is a sam-

pling of some of the more popular terms to get novices started, courtesy of the PGA.

Approach: A shot hit towards the green.

Attack: The relative angle at which the clubhead approaches the ball at impact.

Backswing: The motion that involves the club and every element of the body in taking the club away from the ball.

Birdie: A score of one under par on a hole.

Bogey: A score of one over par on a hole.

Bunker: A hallow comprised of sand or grass that serves as an obstacle.

Carry: The distance a ball will

fly in the air.

Chip: A short approach with a low trajectory.

Chunk: A poor shot caused by hitting the turf.

Divot: The turf displaced when the club strikes the ball.

Downswing: The swing forward from the top of the backswing.

Eagle: A score of two under par on a hole.

Golf range: A facility where people can practice golf swings. Grip: The positioning of hands on the club.

Hole: A round receptacle on the green that the ball is aimed into.

Lie: As it relates to the golf ball,

the position when it has come to rest.

Links: Specific term for a course built on linksland, which is land reclaimed from the ocean.

Mulligan: An extra shot taken on a poor first shot.

Par: The score an accomplished player is expected to make on a hole, either a three, four or five.

Putt: A shot on the green. Stance: The position of the

feet.

Golf terms are as varied as the game itself. Knowing commonly used words and phrases makes for a more intimate understanding of the sport.
