Police located a large machete knife, and noted that tens of thousands of dollars in damage had been done to the house.

Winnard Raymon Campbell, a 48-year-old man from the area, was arrested and charged with the following Criminal Code offences in relation to the event:

> Break and Enter Mischief (X4)

Possession of a weapon dangerous to the public

Uttering threats (X6)

Campbell remains in custody and his next court date set for August 14, 2023, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg.

On July 17, 2023, RCMP received a report that the suspect's home was broken into and damage done therein. Initial investigation indicates that the suspects home was damaged as retaliation to the earlier events.

While RCMP investigate this newest report, we caution individuals about vigilantism. This information is only being shared to raise awareness about violent occurrences in your community. This information is not to be used to carry out unlawful and harmful acts against this person.

GYPSD's Indigenous Pathways Team - which includes the Indigenous Lead (IL) Teacher from each school and members of the Learning Services department - has been learning from Canada Research Chair and University of Alberta Secondary Department Chair and Curriculum Scholar, Dr. Dwayne Donald.

This year's four-session course helps educators explore and deepen their learning and application of curriculum through an Indigenous lens. Additionally, Learning Services distributes an Indigenous Pathways Newsletter each month to connect all of the IL teachers around resources, professional development opportunities, and links to enrich their practice for all of GYPSD's learners. Annually, GYPSD hosts an Indigenous Education Camp with attendees from across the province.

GYPSD's Trustees have also taken the Indigenous Canada course, available for free through the University of Alberta MOOC for anyone committed to learning about Indigenous histories and contemporary issues in Canada.

Alberta families and non-profit organizations can now apply for funding from the Every Kid Can Play program.

Sports play an important role in the early stages of a child's life. They teach teamwork, build confidence and promote healthy lifestyles that can last well into adulthood. Unfortunately, registration fees can make participation in sports unaffordable for too many families.

Albertans can now apply for funding from the Every Kid Can Play program to access affordable sport, physical activity and recreation programs for children and teens. To support the program's success, Alberta's government is providing \$3 million to KidSport Alberta to subsidize registration costs for families that are struggling financially. "Sport and recreation opportunities should be affordable and accessible for all, especially young children and youth. Government Of Canada Funds Three Projects In Alberta To Empower Seniors To Age In Their Homes

Today, the Minister of Seniors, Kamal Khera, announced \$1.68 Million in funding for three projects in Alberta under scaling-up for Senior's stream of the Age Well at Home initiative. The Minister made the announcement while visiting the Drive Happiness Seniors Association in Edmonton, which will receive \$563,537 for their Rural Access to Transportation Expansion. The Drive Happiness project will expand volunteer-assisted transportation for seniors and increase access to in-home supports in urban and rural settings in Alberta and Saskatchewan.

The selected projects will make a real difference in the lives of seniors. For example, the Parkinson Association of Alberta, which has also received funding, will expand support services for people living with and affected by Parkinson disease. Additionally, the Calgary Immigrant Women's Association will provide services aimed at helping low-income racialized immigrants and newcomer seniors age in place.

Through the Age Well at Home initiative, various organizations are being funded that meet the needs of diverse groups of seniors, including seniors who have a low income, are Black or racialized, Indigenous, members of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, seniors who live in rural and remote settings, members of official language minority communities (OLMCs), newcomers, or seniors who speak a language other than English or French.

This announcement builds on the Government's commitment to improving the quality of life of seniors. To strengthen the financial security of the most vulnerable seniors, the Government of Canada increased both the Old Age Security by 10% for seniors aged 75 and older, and the Guaranteed Supplement Income up to \$947 annually for low-income single seniors. Importantly, these benefits are indexed to ensure they can keep up with the cost of living and they can never go down. Budget 2023 introduces the new Canadian Dental Care Plan which will become accessible to eligible seniors by the end of 2023. Upon full implementation, the program will help up to 9 million uninsured Canadians to get the dental care they need and help ensure they don't have to choose between

taking care of their health and paying the bills at the end of the month. Through Budget 2023, the Government is also providing onetime Grocery Rebate to help the Canadians hardest hit by the rising of food prices. Seniors were among those who received additional funds in their pockets on July 5th.

DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch 1. Stand with feet

shoulder-width apart. 2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back. 4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch 1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.

3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds. 5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

Alberta's government will provide more than \$10 million to Indigenous partners through the new Bridging Classrooms to Communities pilot program.

Alberta Education is committed to improving education outcomes and creating opportunities for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students. Creating welcoming environments, demonstrating cultural awareness and providing system supports through the Bridging Classrooms to Communities program will help support Indigenous students' success in and out of the classroom.

This new pilot program will help Indigenous partners such as the Alberta

Submitted by Government Native Friendship Centres Association (ANFCA) build relationships with local school authorities to advance reconciliation and support the hiring of community connection workers to strengthen student relationships with Indigenous communities.

> The new Bridging Classrooms to Communities pilot program will provide \$10.5 million over three years. ANFCA will receive \$7.5 million to distribute to friendship centres within their network. The remaining \$3 million is earmarked for eligible Indigenous organizations to support community connection projects in urban and rural areas across Alberta.

By creating meaningful connections, this pilot program will help Indigenous students and their families feel heard, respected and involved in Alberta schools.

Recipients will receive up to \$100,000 per year to hire community connection workers who will work with school authorities to:

·Develop Indigenous-centered school events, programs and supports.

•Provide guidance to teachers and school leaders to strengthen communication with Indigenous students, families and communities.

•Make timely referrals to external support systems and services.

•Improve access to transportation, technology, tutoring, social activities, sports and other supports and services.

"With this support from Alberta Education, friendship centres are able to weave Indigenous knowledge and culturally responsive educational supports to increase positive learning environments and urban Indigenous students' academic and future success."

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 121 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 45 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 44 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 44 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because

this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.

Budget 2023 adds \$12 million for new beds and dedicated staff to provide better access to pediatric hospital care.

Alberta Children's Hospital in Calgary and the Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton will be better equipped to care for the youngest Albertans, particularly when cases of respiratory illness spike in the fall and winter months.

Alberta has the best frontline health care workers in the world, and Alberta's government is committed to putting the right supports in place for Albertans of all ages, so they get the care they need when and where they need it.

The respiratory illness season this past winter highlighted that additional surge capacity is needed in children's hospitals. By adding more dedicated frontline health care workers, Alberta's hospitals can provide a better level of care for patients and a better working environment for health professionals.

The additional funding will create 10 new surge beds and six pediatric intensive care unit beds at Alberta Children's Hospital, as well as 12 new surge beds and one pediatric intensive care unit bed at the Stollery Children's Hospital. Funding will also expand the hours of short stay surgical units at both hospitals so they are open on the weekends.

"The new funding will help ensure AHS has predictable staffing and flexible bed capacity to meet increasing seasonal demand for inpatient pediatric care. These additional resources will support us in continuing to provide the best in care and treatment to our youngest Albertans."

Alberta Health Services will also hire an additional 113 permanent, year-round critical care positions to support the increase in beds – 61 in Calgary and 52 in Edmonton. The new staffing resources provide additional capacity at children's hospitals to meet the increasing demand for inpatient pediatric care.

"For me, this announcement will help ensure myself, my team, and pediatric care providers throughout Alberta, are better equipped to ensure our young patients have the care they need, when it is needed most. These resources will not only benefit our patients but will also have a significantly positive impact on the well-being of health care workers like myself."

The Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) program supports nearly 12,900 individuals with access to disabilty support services such as home living supports to help with daily activities, respite care, community access supports, education and employment supports, and specialized support to help with additional needs due to mental health and behavioural issues. Total funding for the program in Budget 2023 is more than \$1.1 billion.

Increased investments through Budget 2023 will help increase access to the Persons with Developmental Disabilities program to reduce the wait list, enabling more Albertans to get the help they need. The PDD program helps eligible adults with developmental disabilities plan, coordinate and access services to live as independently as possible in their communities.

This additional funding will support about 500 individuals currently on the wait list, as well as any new applicants entering the program this year.

To maintain fairness and to get people connected to supports as quickly as possible, Albertans who have been waiting the longest will be connected to supports first.

Budget 2023 secures Alberta's future by transforming the health-care system to meet people's needs, supporting Albertans with the high cost of living, keeping our communities safe and driving the economy with more jobs, quality education and continued diversification.
