EVANSBURG RCMP INVESTIGATE COLLISION WITH TRAIN

On Aug. 13, 2023, just after 9 p.m., Evansburg RCMP responded to a collision involving a SUV and a train. The SUV was southbound on highway 22 when it pulled out and passed several vehicles that were waiting for the train

to clear the tracks. Both the crossing arms and flashing lights were engaged. The SUV collided with the moving train and caught on fire.

Due to some quick acting members of the public, the lone male occupant was removed from the vehicle and was taken, in serious condition, via STARS, to an Edmon-

ton hospital where he remains in serious condition.

The matter is still under investigation by the Evansburg RCMP.

The Evansburg RCMP would like to thank the members of the public who pulled the driver to safety and provided immediate first aid.

Cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) has been identified in areas of Wabamun Lake, located within the

Edmonton Zone of Alberta Health Services. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Avoid all contact with cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

Cyanobacteria (Blue-Green Algae) Advisory Issued For Wabamun Lake

- Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible.

- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Wabamun Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An al-

ternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria is naturally occurring and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smells musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible cyanobacteria or who ingest water cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three

hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, the advisory will remain in effect for Wabamun Lake until further notice.

Please note that areas of Wabamun Lake in which the cyanobacteria is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.

QUESTIONS OFTEN ASKED ABOUT THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL



Q. When are schools open in August to register my children?

A. Families can register online for school on the website at any time. As of Monday, August 21st, school staff are also ready to assist.

Q. How do I register my child for the bus?

A. It is now mandatory that all new and returning students requiring transportation must register each year but we made it easy for you! This helps to keep everyone healthy and well! If they answer yes to any of the questions, they are asked to stay at home until they are feeling better.

ARTICLE FROM MLA BOITCHENKO

When Danielle Smith was first elected premier, she wasted no time getting to work on fixing longstanding issues in Alberta's health care system.

In addition to signing a public health guarantee, Premier Smith signed a \$24 billion, 10-year health care funding agreement with the federal government, ensuring no Albertan will ever have to pay out of pocket to see their doctor. She also invested an additional \$1 billion into Alberta's health care budget, to build a stronger and more resilient system for the future. Most importantly, however, Premier Smith replaced the AHS board with Dr. John Cowell, who she tasked with overseeing major reforms to improve EMS response times, decrease emergency wait room times, reduce

surgery wait times, and restore local decision making – a move that is already showing positive results.

This past week, Premier Smith showed more leadership on health care, when she and Health Minister Adriana LaGrange announced that thousands of new community lab appointments are being made available for Albertans, to help reduce the wait times associated with accessing critical lab services.

There is no question that patients across Alberta are waiting too long to access routine lab services, which are a critical part of a patient's health care journey from diagnosis to treatment. To ensure Alberta patients can get medical testing, when and where they need it, our United Conservative government has worked with AHS and DynaLife to immediately allow Alberta Precision

Laboratories (APL) to offer more community lab appointments.

This decision will add 2,000 new lab testing appointments per week in Calgary alone, where wait times are especially bad, and thousands more across the province. APL is also hiring more staff to expand its capacity and provide more service to Albertans.

I look forward to watching our health care system continue to improve under the leadership of Premier Smith and Minister LaGrange. Recently, Minister LaGrange reiterated her commitment to restoring local decision making in the health care system, saying, "Albertans need faster, better care, and that simply is not possible if hospitals – whether in rural Alberta or downtown Calgary – are fighting layers of bureaucracy in order to make simple decisions ... central to fostering

this environment is increasing the capacity for local decision-making. By empowering frontline health-care professionals, we open the door to valuable insights and expertise that can drive meaningful common-sense improvements at the local level."

Unlike the NDP – who just threw more and more money at Alberta's health care issues, and who watched as wait times increased and issues worsened – Premier Smith, Minister LaGrange, and our entire United Conservative team are working tirelessly to fix the issues that have hindered our health care system for years.

We won't kick the can down the road on fixing these problems. We understand the importance of fixing Alberta's health care system right now, and we are doing the work.

HELP FOR FARMERS IMPACTED BY WILDFIRE AND DROUGHT

The AgriStability program has reopened for late participation so producers affected by wildfires and drought can consider enrolling to manage business risks.

Alberta producers can sign up for AgriStability until Sept. 29. The Government of Alberta and Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada have reopened the program recognizing that wildfires and extremely dry conditions have affected many farmers and ranchers since the April 30 enrolment deadline. This gives affected producers more time to review and manage the business risks associated with these challenging situations.

AgriStability protects Canadian producers against

large declines in farming income due to production loss, increased costs and market conditions. The program is offered through the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP), which is a shared commitment between federal, provincial and territorial governments.

"Our government has listened to farmers and ranchers who have been impacted by wildfires and drought. We know they need support options to make it through this growing season. Allowing late participation in AgriStability will enable them to reassess their business risks and make an informed decision about signing up to protect their operations and livelihoods."

Enrolling in AgriStability can provide producers with access to other credit options like the federal Advanced Payments Program, which offers low-cost cash advances.

"Alberta's producers have shown great resiliency and the ability to rise to the extreme challenges brought on by wildfires and drought. Risk management programs like AgriStability are essential to help producers manage these threats to their operations, and we want to ensure they have the time they need to make decisions that are right for their business."

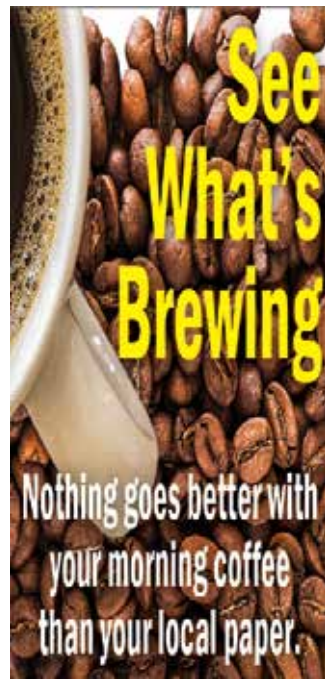
