CUTTING RED TAPE FOR EMPLOYERS PROTECTING TEMPORARY FOREIGN WORKERS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise the launch of the Recognized Employer Pilot (REP) under the Temporary Foreign Worker (TFW) Program. REP is a three-year initiative that will help to address labour shortages and reduce the administrative burden for repeat employers participating in the program who demonstrate a history of complying with program requirements.

Under REP, eligible employers will gain access to Labour Market Impact Assessments (LMIA) that are valid for up to 36 months, while also benefitting from

a simplified LMIA application, should they need to hire additional workers from the same occupation during the Pilot.

This will help employers better plan for their staffing needs and reduce the number of different LMIA's they need to submit over three years. Recognized employers will also benefit from a Job Bank designation that shows their recognized status to prospective workers.

To participate in REP, employers must have a minimum of three positive LMIA's for the same occupation over the past five years from a list of occupations that have been designated as in-shortage based on Canadian Occupational Projection System data.

These employers will be subject to a more rigorous upfront assessment process based on their history and track record with the program, ensuring that REP targets employers with the best recruitment practices.

REP will be rolled out in two phases: first, primary agriculture employers will be able to apply starting in September 2023, while all other employers will be eligible to apply in January 2024. Employer applications for REP will close in September 2024.

REP is one measure being launched alongside a series of other initiatives aimed at improving the TFW Program.


WHITCOURT ACCEPTING EVACUEES FROM NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

"Our conditions and resources allow for us to be able to answer the call to help those in the Northwest Territories," stated Whitecourt Mayor Tom Pickard. "Just as we have with other communities, Whitecourt has not only extended a hand in firefighting efforts, but we have also assisted by providing a temporary home for those who have been evacuated."

The Allan & Jean Millar Centre opened as an evacuation centre for Yellowknife residents on August 17, and has assisted over 300 people displaced by the Yellowknife wildfire emergency.





EARTH-FRIENDLY TIPS FOR AUTUMN

Autumn is upon us, and with the change of seasons comes the fall to-do list that must be completed before the arrival of winter weather. Many outdoor jobs are best completed before

temperatures drop, while others can be tackled indoors to help save energy and prepare for increased time spent inside the home.

Outdoor cleanup

Autumn means leaves are falling from trees and littering landscapes. Cleaning up leaves can be a time-consuming task, but it's necessary to promote the health of lawns and other plants. Grass that is completely matted down with leaves can become starved for light and moisture,

and lawns may even rot when forced to spend winter beneath fallen leaves.

One eco-friendly time-saver is to shred leaves with a mower (a manual mower is preferable) and leave them as top-dressing for the lawn. As long as the grass blades can be seen within the leaves, the lawn should be fine. Shredded leaves will decompose and add necessary nutrients and organic matter to the soil naturally.

when cleaning.

Keep some short-sleeved shirts accessible so you can layer them under sweatshirts and

sweaters. The heat from layering will be trapped against your body and keep you cozier, reducing your reliance on HVAC systems to stay

Home repairs

Check the roof for any missing shingles. In addition, look for spots where animals or insects

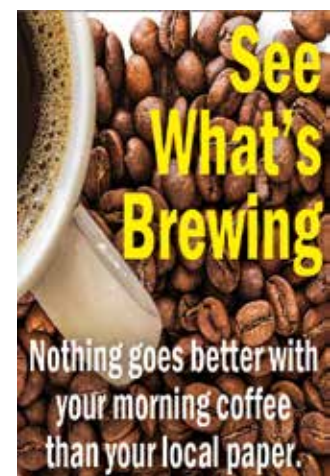
