



## ENERGY TRANSITION: ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL

I am writing this week's column as I sit at a desk in my hotel room at 12:33 AM in the city of Essen, Germany. I was brought here three days ago as a guest of the German Government, through the Trans-Atlantic Climate Bridge, a member of the **Energy Sub Committee for** the Confederation of State Governments. Two fellow MLAs are also in attendance: one from my own caucus, and one from Ontario. A few Senators and representatives from the USA are also a part of the Legislative Study Tour, and it has been a very enlightening excursion thus far.

Germany is through a transformative change in their use of energy, what is acceptable to them, and what will be used by other European Union Members. Germany, which is half the size of Alberta, has 85 million people, and they are not energy independent. Through their political process, they have made the commitment to no longer use nuclear energy that they produce themselves, and they no longer will be using their "brown coal" (Lignite) thermal power plants past 2030. They want to transition using green electricity and being a hydrogen powered nation. They want to only import energy that meets those tight standards. This is one heck of a tall order, but they are all in.

They won't be able to do this alone though. Germa-

ny will need the EU members, as well as Canada and the USA, to achieve these goals. At the federal level, the three governments have signed an agreement to meet these objectives and to transition their energy.

Here is the wrinkle: Canada, specifically Alberta, is not in an energy crunch. Heck, we account for 99 per cent of the USA's imported natural gas, and 53 per cent of their total imported oil. We are sitting on roughly 80 per cent of Canada's coal, and it's not the low thermal "brown coal" (of which Germany has about 200 years left of electrical generation). We have very low sulfur thermal coal and metallurgical coal. We are sitting on 223 trillion cubic feet of gas, and the fourth largest known oil reserve on the planet. What we are not in a position of is an ocean, nor a ton of rivers, that we can dam off to create hydro power like some of our other provincial friends down east, out west, or far up north. We are not interconnected like they are in the EU, so simply balancing a load between countries isn't as easy for us. We are also sitting on a large potential for hydrogen production, as well as lithium extraction.

So... why in the heck would we, or our friends in the USA, buy into the definitions that are being made over in Europe regarding how we should use our energy assets, and produce our own power? The short answer: we shouldn't. There is another

wrinkle former premiers who signed the constitution back in 1980 had foreseen that basically gave us a huge leg-up for freedom. The provinces control their resources, inclusive of electrical generation. You see in Germany, that does not exist. The states and municipalities must do what the federal government says.

So, it has become abundantly clear to me why our own federal government wants to box in Alberta and Saskatchewan. They want us to fall in line and do as they say, and it's driving them crazy that we are saying no. There must be a made in Alberta solution for Albertans. I believe that we can broker the deals with our fellow provinces and states when it comes to the definition of "clean energy", and I can tell you it is not the same as a highly populated country in Europe. We are simply not in the same position as they are, and we don't need to put ourselves in that corner. In fact, we can help them out as trading partners, but we need to close the gap on the trade differential. We need to define what their overall needs are, and not just in energy, but what they need for their industries for raw and refined materials. We can help bridge investment opportunities by relocating some of their industries to North America, reducing the carbon footprint by putting manufacturing closer to the resources, and where energy is still economical.

Electricity here is at

\$0.40 per kwh, and we do not need to get into a position of "saving the planet". We need to make sure that we reduce pollution, conserve where needed, do things smarter, but we cannot pretend that what works in Europe is what will work for us. I believe we can work collaboratively to solve several collective challenges, wean ourselves of dependency from other countries that are at odds with our values as a nation, but we simply can't hold hands and jump off the same cliff.

Alberta started a campaign across Canada called "Tell the Feds". A campaign to voice the concerns of all Canadians that we don't want to be left cold in the dark. To raise awareness that we are not just stamping our feet for no reason; we are advising them of what the real impacts are going to be if we allow them to step on our constitutional rights. They are taking an approach to make it illegal for us to generate electricity from anything they deem to be "non-green". I've now seen firsthand over here what that definition is, and for us, it does not look pretty. The feds won't relent; they have drunk the Kool-Aid and are out of touch with what our North American reality is. Please take the time to tell the feds that this is not right. We need to allow our provinces to do what is right for them, not for Europe, or for the out-of-touch-CN-Tower-climbing environment minsters' delusional ideas.

## 3 WAYS TO CONSERVE FUEL DURING YOUR DAILY COMMUTE

Commuting is a part of daily life for many working professionals. According to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2011 American Community Survey, the average American spends 25 minutes commuting to work each day. However, Citi's 2015 Thank You Premier Commuter Index says the average commute time in the United States is 45 minutes. The reasons for that disparity are unknown, though if one accepts the latter statistic as more accurate than the years-old Census Bureau data, it's fair to

say Americans spend far more time getting to work than their neighbors to the north. But commutes in Canada also can be lengthy, as Canada's National Household Survey found that, in 2011, commuters in Canada spent an average of roughly 25 minutes traveling to work each day.

While many people enjoy their daily commutes, feeling it's a time to prepare for the day ahead and, if using public transportation, to relax and let someone else do the work, it's fair to say the

majority of commuters would like to spend less time getting to and from work. Many would also like to spend less money getting to and from their offices, and finding ways to conserve fuel is an effective way to do just that.

1. Maintain your vehicle. Poorly maintained vehicles endure undue stress that can be prevented by adhering to routine maintenance schedules. Peruse your vehicle's owner's manuals to determine the recommended intervals to change the oil and replace the air filter and

spark plugs. These simple maintenance tasks are easy and inexpensive, but they make it easier for engines to run smoothly and make efficient use of fuel.

2. Keep tires properly inflated.

Properly inflated tires reduce drag on the engine. Engine drag makes the vehicle work hard to move, and that wastes fuel. But the type of tires a vehicle has also can affect how efficiently it uses fuel. According to the Transportation Research Board, tires that

reduce rolling resistance by 10 percent can improve gas mileage by as much as 2 percent. While that figure might seem insignificant, that 2 percent savings can add up to a substantial amount of money for commuters who spend 50 minutes every day getting to and from work.

3. Drive a vehicle with stop/start technology.

Stop/start systems, in which engines shut off automatically when drivers brake and restart automatically when the driver lifts his or her foot off the

brake pedal, can make more efficient use of fuel. Once exclusive to hybrid cars, stop/start technology is now more widely available and can cut back on fuel consumption and vehicle emissions. That's especially attractive to eco-conscious commuters who live in big cities where stop-and-start traffic is unavoidable. What's more, many modern air conditioning compressors operate off electricity and not via a car's engine, meaning vehicles with stop/start technology will stay cool in the summer even when the engine

shuts off.

Commuting to and from work may not seem like the most eco-friendly daily ritual. But there are

ways to commute and conserve fuel at the same






