It runs to Remembrance Day on Saturday, November 11, 2023.

This campaign runs across Canada. Each of the over 1,400 individual Legion Branches conducts their own campaigns, run by local volunteers. The familiar Poppy box that you will see at various local businesses and offices in Onoway, Alberta Beach and other locations in the local area provide the opportunity for residents and visitors to obtain a poppy as a mark of respect and Remembrance of our war dead.

While you do not need to pay anything to obtain a poppy, we hope that you will choose to make a donation. The financial contributions that people choose to make are deposited directly into our local Poppy Trust Fund. Through your donations to the Legion Poppy Fund, the Legion provides financial assistance and support to Veterans, including Canadian Armed Forces and RCMP, and their families who are in need. Poppy Funds may be used for:

- Grants for food, heating

costs, clothing, prescription medication, medical appliances and equipment, essential home repairs and emergency shelter or assistance for veterans and their families in need

- Housing accommodation and care facilities for veterans
- Funding for Veteran Transition Programs that are directly related to the training, education and support needs of veterans and their families

• Comforts for veterans and their surviving spouses who are hospitalized and in need

- Veterans' visits, transportation and day trips

• Accessibility modifications to assist veterans with disabilities

- Educational bursaries for children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of veterans

• Support of cadet units

- Veteran drop-in centres and services in communities where veterans would benefit

• Community medical appliances, medical training and medical research which will assist in the care of veterans in the com-

munity

• Support for the work of Legion Command and Branch Service Officers across Canada in assisting and representing veterans free of charge

- Donations for relief of disasters declared by federal or provincial governments which impact veterans in those communities

• Promotion and administering of Remembrance activities to ensure Canadians never forget the sacrifices of Canada's veterans

COUNTY SNOWPLOW FLAG PROGRAM

Underway for the Season

Each year the County helps property owners clear snow from their private driveways through its Snowplow Flag Program.

To use this service, a Snowplow Flag Hold Harmless Agreement must be in place and digital flag purchased in advance.

The cost is \$70 per flag, per clearing. Private driveway snowplowing will include one pass of the snowplow unit in from the local road to the general parking area of the residence and one pass back out to the local road.

MPC Meetings are typically held on the first Wednesday of each month.

SDAB Hearings are held on an as-needed basis.

OK, so what all this fancy language means is that County owned lands have been identified and removed from municipal reserve designation and as a continuation in process now require redistricting to residential parcels in preparation for sale to the public.

rental with a ski or bike rack or one that can fit such accessories. Those concerned with the environment may want to rent an eco-friendly model.

- Shop around. Major car rental agencies are located all over the world. However, depending on where you travel, locally owned companies may offer comparable service and lower rates. Lower operating costs (think no franchise fees or big advertising budgets) mean these rentals typically cost 15 to 30 percent less than rentals from mainstream agencies. Research lesser-known

rental companies beforehand to compare prices and read any reviews to see if these businesses are up to the standards of larger, better-known chains.

- Avoid renting from an airport. It may be convenient to step off a plane and grab a rental right there. However, rental car agencies operating at airports may pass on airport surcharges to their customers. Try a car rental service away from the airport and take a shuttle or cab to get there.

- Understand mileage caps. According to Angie's List, some rental car companies offer unlimited

- Ask about membership affiliation. Inquire about discounts for any major national organizations, frequent flier programs and credit card programs to which you may belong. If you're employed by a company that frequently rents cars, they may have a negotiated rate for employees.

- Investigate insurance coverage. You may be able to decline extra insur-

ance coverage at the rental desk. Some personal automotive policies will cover collision damage and personal liability for temporary use of a rental car, according to MileCards.com, a travel rewards card comparison website. What is not covered by your insurance may be covered by secondary insurance offered by the credit card used at booking.

Rental cars are a major component of travel. Consumers can save money and make trips even easier by understanding some of the basics of renting.
