
in the show. Ruth would also like pictures emailed to her (rlotholz@gmail.com) of Legion current events to add to the slide show.

The cost is \$70 per flag, per clearing. Private driveway snowplowing will include one pass of the snowplow unit in from the local road to the general parking area of the residence and one pass back out to the local road.

Les Dunford, of Westlock, Alta., has been photographing and reporting on the Farm Family Awards at Farmfair International for over 30 years. It is an event he looks forward to every year, as he enjoys learning about the histories of the pioneering families who helped make Alberta the agriculturally rich province it is today. Although it is becoming more difficult to find multigenerational farms now, there remains families in virtually every county who work together to produce cattle, grow grain and raise families.

Les feels it is important for hard working farm families to be recognized as they make a big contribution not only in the food they produce, but in the way they support their local communities. As Les likes to say, "without farms, you are not going to eat very well."

Farmfair has evolved over the years, but the BMO Farm Family Awards has fundamentally not changed in its purpose and importance. It still honours those that work the land and put food on our tables.

Farmfair's expanded focus on

educating school children about where their food comes from and encouraging urban families to get up close with farm animals, is more important than ever, as many of us lose connection with farming. You do not need to own a farm to experience one – just come to Farmfair!

Many purebred cattle producers from all over Albera have shown their prized animals at Farmfair over the years. Colleen Prefontaine's father raised purebred Hereford cattle, which Colleen remembers bringing to Farmfair International to groom and show, which was always an exciting time for her and her family. It was a winning go in the calf scramble though, where she was feisty enough to grab hold of a Limousin calf, that turned her attention to the newer breed. Colleen grew up, married Bernie Prefontaine and they raise cattle – Limousin cattle – which their children showed at Farmfair, starting when their youngest daughter was just seven years old. Colleen was Barn Boss of

the Limousins for years, and later became the smiling, ever-so-helpful face in the show office. Now in Legal, Alta., and originally from Busby, she has been a volunteer at Farmfair International for over 25 years. She is proud to be one of five generations that showed cattle at this long-standing event.

Colleen would love to see more people from the city come to Farmfair to "meet" the farm animals and see how well treated these animals are. She laughed and said



rental with a ski or bike rack Ñ or one that can fit such accessories. Those concerned with the environment may want to rent an eco-friendly model.

Shop around. Major car rental agencies are located all over the world. However, depending on where you travel, locally owned companies may offer comparable service and lower rates. Lower operating costs (think no franchise fees or big advertising budgets) mean these rentals typically cost 15 to 30 percent less than rentals from mainstream agencies. Research lesser-known

rental companies beforehand to compare prices and read any reviews to see if these businesses are up to the standards of larger, better-known chains.

- Avoid renting from an airport. It may be convenient to step off a plane and grab a rental right there. However, rental car agencies operating at airports may pass on airport surcharges to their customers. Try a car rental service away from the airport and take a shuttle or cab to get there.
- · Understand mileage caps. According to Angie's List, some rental car companies offer unlimited

miles for a rental period, while others may employ mileage caps. Read the fine print of the agreement, especially if you'll be using the rental for long-distance driving.

- Ask about membership affiliation. Inquire about discounts for any major national organizations, frequent flier programs and credit card programs to which you may belong. If you're employed by a company that frequently rents cars, they may have a negotiated rate for employees.
- · Investigate insurance coverage. You may be able to decline extra insur-

ance coverage at the rental desk. Some personal automotive policies will cover collision damage and personal liability for temporary use of a rental car, according to MileCards.com, a travel rewards card comparison website. What is not covered by your insurance may be covered by secondary insurance offered by the credit card used at booking.

Rental cars are a major component of travel. Consumers can save money and make trips even easier by understanding some of the basics of renting.
