PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE DOUBLE FATAL COLLISION ON IN PARKLAND COUNTY

On Oct. 22, 2023, at about 1:15 a.m., Parkland County Fire Department, AHS and Parkland RCMP responded

to a report of a single vehicle collision roll-over in the area of Township Road 531 and Range Road 22 in Parkland County.

The male driver had fled just prior to police arriv-

ing. Parkland RCMP with the assistance of Edmonton Police Service helicopter Air 1, and RCMP Police Dog Service, were able to locate the driver and take him

renovations would not have been possible without the hardwork of our board members and YOU, the public,

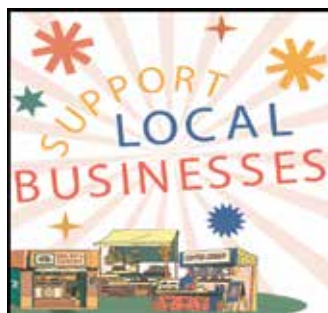

into custody. An RCMP collision analysts attended the scene as part of the investigation.

Life saving efforts were provided to the two passengers who had been ejected from the vehicle. A 22-year-old male from Parkland County was pronounced deceased at the scene. A 25-year-old male, also a Parkland County resident

was taken to hospital in critical condition, but later succumbed to his injuries.

20-year-old driver, Kaden Scheideman, a Parkland County resident, has been charged with the following:

- Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle Causing Death (x2)
- Fail to Remain at Scene of Collision Causing Death (x2)
- Impaired Opera-

tion Causing Death (x2)

- Impaired Operation Over 80 mg% Causing Death (x2)

Scheideman was brought before a Justice of the Peace for a Bail Hearing. Scheideman was released on bail with a number of conditions. His next court appearance is scheduled for Nov. 29, 2023, at the Alberta Court of Justice Stony Plain.

To help them through this difficult time, the governments of Alberta and Canada are partnering on a 2023 Canada-Alberta Drought Livestock Assistance response.

"Many Alberta livestock producers have faced multiple challenges this growing season. This year's drought and excessive heat has resulted

in our ranchers facing extra costs due to lost grazing days. We recognize their stress as the winter-feeding

months approach. This program will help alleviate some of the cost pressures, and support producers in protecting their livelihoods while they continue to put food on tables around the world.”

“I’ve had the opportunity to meet with farmers and producers from across Western Canada and they’ve shared just

how challenging this growing season has been for their operations. With a total federal investment of \$219 million for the western provinces through AgriRecovery, we’re helping them recover so they can continue to feed Canada, and the world.”

Funding for this joint AgriRecovery initiative is cost-shared through the Sustainable Cana-

dian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP), with the federal government providing \$99 million and Alberta’s government providing \$66 million. Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC) will administer the program.

Sustainable CAP is a five-year program, beginning this year, and includes a \$3.5 billion investment by federal, provincial and territorial governments to strengthen competitiveness, innovation and resiliency in the agriculture, agri?food and agri?based products sector. This investment includes \$1 billion in federal programs and \$2.5 billion in cost-shared programs funded 60 per cent federally and 40 per cent provincially-territorially.

livestock sector. We hope this announcement will provoke collaborative and positive change going into 2024 to ensure all agricultural producers have equitable access to Business Risk Management programs.”



For example, eligible producers could access up to \$150 per head for breeding animals. CYANOBACTERIA (BLUE-GREEN ALGAE) ADVISORIES LIFTED

idents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, at any time.

Bylaw 2023-10 Wabamun Hamlet Area Redevelopment Plan

The Wabamun Hamlet Area Redevelopment Plan (HARP) has been completed for the Hamlet of Wabamun as identified under Parkland County's MDP Policy 6.0.9 which requires the County to complete a HARP for any identified priority growth hamlets. The Wabamun HARP provides direction for the hamlet through policy and implementation strategies to support the County in its efforts in future development for the area. Direction from the Wabamun HARP will be reflected through future regulation such as the Land Use Bylaw and subdivision regulations.

Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted in advance to Planning & Development by 4:00 P.M. on November 22, 2023, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services in advance of the public hearing by 4:00 P.M. on November 22, 2023. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.

MANDATORY HOLOCAUST EDUCATION FOR ALBERTA STUDENTS

As Alberta's government continues its work to develop a new social studies curriculum, Holocaust education will be a mandatory component.

During the Second World War, Adolf Hitler and his Nazi government and military systematically targeted, arrested, abused and eliminated people they described as subhuman. At the top of their list were Jewish people. Between Jan. 30, 1933, and May 8, 1945, the Nazis killed about six million Jews in Europe. Every January, the world recognizes International Holocaust Remembrance Day,

and the Jewish community additionally recognizes Holocaust Remembrance Day, or Yom HaShoah, each spring, reiterating the phrase "Never Again."

Alberta's government is ensuring students learn about the Holocaust and its important historical and contemporary significance throughout their education. Alberta Education will work with partners in the education and Jewish communities to explore where and when this content should be covered.

"I firmly believe we must do everything possible to combat rising antisemitism and educate young Albertans about the horrors of the Holocaust. En-

suring all students learn from one of history's darkest chapters will help us confront hate and prevent similar atrocities from occurring."

"Creating an anti-racist society starts at the school-age level and Holocaust education is an important tool in helping our students learn about the underlying ramifications of prejudice, racism and stereotyping. What is happening in our society today is an important warning around the need to teach the universal lessons of the Holocaust, and the consequences of bigotry and hate. We applaud the province for helping to

ensure that our youth will not only learn from but keep the memory of the Holocaust alive."

"This announcement comes at a time when antisemitism has spiked across Canada and around the world. It is crucial that the next generations learn about how hate surfaces. Whether it's distortion of Holocaust history or misinformation about Hamas's terrorist attacks, both are rooted in antisemitism, and this announcement demonstrates that the Alberta government is dedicated to fight hate in all its forms."

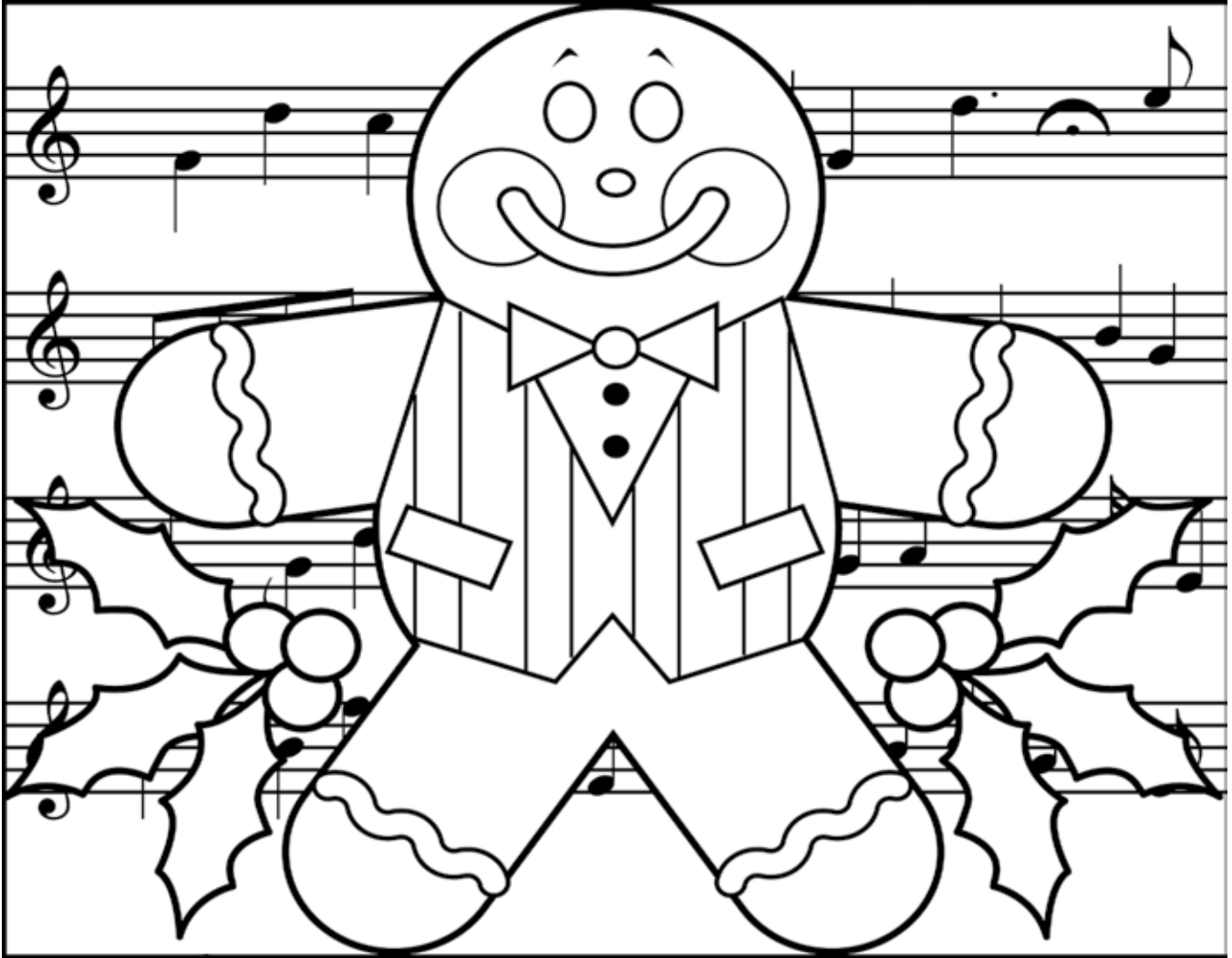
