
It's an Early Christmas Dinner!





WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Whitecourt is making it easier for community members to apply for a building permit. Starting January 1, 2024, Whitecourt will work directly with Safety Codes Agencies to create a "one-stop shop" for development and building permits. The change will create a single point of contact for applications, and a more coordinated approach to the permitting process. This move has been made as part of Whitecourt's commitment to reduce red tape. Further information on the new process will be posted on our website for the January launch.

Whitecourt has provided support to Woodlands County for its grant application to fund improvements at the Whitecourt Airport. The County will be applying to the Community Airport Program for runway paving and electrical rehabilitation.

Whitecourt has granted approval to the Soaring Eagle Support Society for use of the Town fi re pit on February 24, 2024 for its "Coldest Night of the Year" event.

The SDAB is an independent quasijudicial body appointed by County Council to hear appeals from those who have been affected by a decision of the local development or subdivision authority.

MPC Meetings are typically held on the first Wednesday of each month and SDAB Hearings are held on an as-needed basis.

Get the County to Clear your Driveway Following a Snowfall To use this service, a Snowplow Flag Hold Harmless Agreement must be in place and digital flag purchased in advance.

The cost is \$70 per flag, per clearing. Private driveway snowplowing will include one pass of the snowplow unit in from the local road to the general parking area of the residence and one pass back out to the local road.
