

Mayerthorpe RCMP Arrest Three In Attempted Theft Of Bank ATM

suspects fled in a second stolen truck. RCMP followed the vehicle and deployed several tire deflation devices. Once the vehicle was disabled, four suspects fled on foot, followed by RCMP officers and PDS. Three of the four suspects were arrested without incident.

As a result of the investigation, Durant Kenneth Thomas Shale (24), a resident of Edmonton, Jolayna Nancee Grace Bearhead (23), a resident of Stony Plain, and Keisha Latka (29), a resident of Edmonton, were charged with 11 offences, including:

•Break and enter;

•Theft over \$5000;

•Possession of proceeds of crime over \$5000;

•Possession of proceeds of crime under \$5000;

• Firearms-related offences (x2);

Obstruct police;

•Mischief over \$5000;

•Assault on police officer; and

•Possession of break and enter instruments.

Furthermore, Shale was charged an additional 12 offences, including:

•Driving a motor vehicle while prohibited;

•Dangerous driving;


•Failure to stop for police; •Failure to comply with re-

lease order (x6); and •Possession of metham-

phetamine. All three accused were

brought before a justice of the peace. Shale and Bearhead were remanded into custody and are to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Mayerthorpe on Jan. 11, 2024. Latka was released on conditions and will appear before the same court on Feb. 8, 2024.

One suspect has yet to be identified or arrested.

January 10, 2024 LAC STE. ANNE FOOD BANK AND SANTA'S HELPERS

The food bank in Onoway is setting records this Christmas. Officially called the Lac Ste. Anne East Food Bank, they are preparing 35 percent more Christmas hampers this year than last. 2022 was a busy year when they prepared 59 hampers, but this year they are providing Christmas hope and hampers to 80 individuals and families. The hampers go to people from the Darwell highway to Rich Valley to Sandy Lake, and including the Alexis **Beserve**

Christmas Hampers are a major focus for the Lac Ste. Anne East Food Bank. Board Chairman Janet Fluet says it takes a lot of preparation, donations and a small army of volunteers to provide the Christmas hampers. "We have about 20 volunteers who come out for three days to assemble and present the hampers. We start on Monday and finish up on Wednesday just before Christmas every year."

Fluet says they are committed to supporting local suppliers. "We buy all our groceries through Bigway," says Fluet, "and they are so accommodating of our needs." According to Fluet, "working with Bigway allows us to be sure the expiry dates are acceptable and provide consistent food hampers." Fluet says Big-way delivered three truckloads of food to the Baptist Church where the hampers were being assembled. "They go above and beyond to help us. They even ensure there will be stock of some items that might be less available at this time of year." The Food Bank also enjoys great support from other community minded businesses like SANG and Calahoo meats.

The Lac Ste. Anne East Food bank recently hired Melanie Hartwig to take care of the increasing administrative needs. Other than Melanie, an energetic board ensures the Christmas and weekly food hampers provide essentials for families throughout the region. Fluet says the number of hampers they prepare weekly (other than August) have gone way up the last couple of


years. She points out that while the need for hampers went down about 6 months into COVID, they are back to pre-COVID levels and bevond. The Food Bank provides about 20 hampers each and every week.

The Christmas season is a critical time for the Food Bank. Donations of food and money come in during the Christmas period in a big way, but they dry up almost completely from January through March, leaving them to survive off the Christmas rush.

Those who donate can be sure their generosity is put to good use. What is in a Christmas hamper? The average Christmas hamper includes an abundant box of food, including a turkey or ham, fresh produce, eggs, and baking. SANG and a few individuals sponsor special hampers for selected families with significant needs, ensuring an extra dose of Christmas blessing. Each family with children will also receive toys and other gifts, thanks to Santa's helpers.

Santa's Helpers has been serving the Onoway area for over 40 years. Head elf Holly Durand and her helper Kerri Grierson coordinated toys for almost 100 children this year through Santa's Helpers. Speaking nearly perfect English, with the slightest trace of Elvish, Durand says, "donations came in from all over the area for the toy donations. We live in an amazing community that is incredibly generous. It makes the work of us elves so much fun!"


President's Message

ALBERTA RCMP AND LAW ENFORCEMENT PARTNERS LAUNCH OPERATION COLD START

As the temperatures drop and the snow starts to fall, the Alberta RCMP will once again be partnering with law enforcement partners across the province for Operation Cold Start from Jan. 8 – 12, 2024. Operation Cold Start is designed to work with the public to reduce the theft of idling vehicles during the winter months.

Law enforcement agencies will be preforming a variety of tasks to help keep vehicles safe. They will be checking on unattended, idling vehicles to see if the keys are in them, and whether or not they are properly secured. Officers will also be participating in educational efforts to teach the public ways to keep their property safe.

"Warming up your vehicle briefly before your commute might seem convenient, but this convenience can turn into a serious problem when your vehicle is stolen. Vehicle-related crimes often occur due to opportunistic situations," says Cpl. Mike Fulton of the Alberta RCMP's Community Safety and Well-being Branch. "In 2021, 8.3% of vehicles stolen in Alberta RCMP jurisdiction were left idling. The goal of Operation Cold Start is to reduce crime by educating Albertans on steps they can take

to help keep their property safe."

Vehicle theft doesn't only effect vehicle owners; it has an impact on the greater community. Not only do thefts increase the cost of insurance across the province, but stolen vehicles can also be used for further crime, or even be put back on the market and sold to unsuspecting Albertans.

The Alberta RCMP offers the following tips for vehicle safety:

- If you can't park in a garage or driveway, ensure that you're parking in a visible well lit area.

- Visible anti-theft devices like steering wheel locks can help mitigate vehicle thefts and break-ins. - If possible, look into automatic car starters as an option to warm your vehicle.


- Never leave your vehicle unattended if the keys are in it.

- Always lock your vehicles doors even if you're parked in a drive way or garage.

- Never leave valuable items like wallets, keys, purses, or even change visible in an unoccupied vehicle.

- Most modern engines do not require a 'warm-up' period. If your vehicle does need to warmup, do not leave it unattended.
