### WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town Of Supports; Whitecourt

The 2023 Municipal Enforcement Annual Report has been accepted as information by Whitecourt Town Council. The report is prepared annually for the Alberta Solicitor General, and outlines activities conducted by Municipal Enforcement Services throughout the year. Over the course of the year, 1,772 activities were logged by the Whitecourt Peace Officer and Bylaw Officer.

Per the Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework Arbitration Award, Woodlands County must provide Whitecourt input on the use of the Whitecourt Fire Department's Aerial Pumper (Tower 1) within the fi re services area. Woodlands County has requested that the Aerial Pumper not be utilized on any fi res within Woodlands County or for any 911 fi re calls within the fire/rescue response area for the 2024 calendar year.

Whitecourt will be submitting a grant application for \$2,754,258 in funding to the Canada Cultural Spaces Fund for construction of the Arts, Culture and Convention Centre component of the Culture & Events Centre. Information on the Culture & Events Centre can be found at www.cultureandeventscentre.ca.

The Government of Alberta has requested municipalities prepare a Housing Needs Assessment so that it can develop solutions to address unique local needs. Over the last several months, Town of Whitecourt representatives have met with key community stakeholders to develop Whitecourt's assessment and the following priorities were identified:

- 1. Non-Market Bachelor/1 Bedroom/2 Bedroom Housing with Tenant Supports;
- 2. Seniors Self-Contained Affordable Housing with

3. Transitional Housing with Support.

The Whitecourt Housing Needs Assessment will be submitted to the Province and utilized by local organizations and for profit companies to support future grant applications.

Alberta Health Services is now providing the Assertive Outreach Services (AOS) program in Whitecourt. The program provides support services to adults living with

severe and persistent mental illnesses. Individuals who qualify for the program will be able to access clinical and outreach services at no cost.

Whitecourt Town Council has approved a \$50,000 payment to the Whitecourt District Agricultural Society to be used for operating.

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the removal of reserve designations on two parcels of land in Festival Park. Once approved by the Alberta Land Titles Registrar,

Whitecourt will be able to proceed with consolidating 13 parcels of land in Festival Park into one large parcel.

New Planning and Development fees will come into effect March 1, 2024. A review of Whitecourt's fee structure was completed to ensure development in Whitecourt remains competitive.

The Mayor and Deputy Mayor will be attending the Alberta Municipalities Spring Leaders Caucus in March 2024.

### COUNTY GRAVEL PROGRAM UNDERWAY

### **Maintaining Gravel Roads**

Roughly 90% of Lac Ste. Anne County's 2033 kilometers of roadways are gravel roads. Each year, County crews perform additional maintenance to approximately 500 kilometers of gravel roadways through our Gravel Program. Which means LSAC gravels a road on average once every 4 years. This includes adding gravel where needed, reshaping and grading the roadway for safety, function and drainage purposes. All these efforts are to protect the integrity of the roadways for the present and future needs of the travelling public and residents alike.

The 2024 Gravel Program is starting up soon and will continue until road bans are determined to be necessary. The remaining work will be completed during the summer season.

Expect to see Gravel Trucks appearing in areas that they may not normally be. Please be courteous and patient when sharing the road with them.

Please allow the trucks and other equipment to do their work. If possible, try to stay clear of work crews by finding alternate routes of travel. If there are no other routes to your destination, please follow the instructions of the crew members on-site and they will get you on your way as quickly and as safely as possible.

If you are driving behind a gravel truck, please maintain a healthy travelling distance between. Rule of thumb is, if you cannot see them in their side mirrors, they most definitely CANNOT see you. Maintaining a safe distance also prevents the chance of any loose debris that may still be on the truck, from hitting your vehicle.

Safety is our number one priority and our main focus in any type of work we do, for our crew members, our contractors and you. Thank you for your cooperation!

### **EXPANDING 2023 LIVESTOCK DROUGHT** RECOVERY SUPPORT

of Alberta

The governments of Canada and Alberta are expanding drought livestock assistance eligibility to help producers maintain breeding herds.

The 2023 Canada-Alberta Drought Livestock Assistance initiative is expanding eligibility to 23 new regions and extending the application deadline. Funding for

Submitted by Government this joint AgriRecovery initiative is provided through the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP).

Livestock producers in eligible regions who altered their usual grazing practices due to drought conditions for more than 21 days this season can apply for financial support to cover losses incurred to manage and maintain female breeding animals such as cattle,

bison, horses, elk, sheep, goats, alpacas, yak, musk ox, deer, water buffalo and llamas. A minimum of 15 animals per type of livestock are required to qualify.

Funding for the new regions will open on Jan. 29. Applicants in this intake may receive payments of up to \$150 per head. The application deadline is Feb. 22 and extraordinary costs can be incurred until March 31. This expansion also gives

producers who were already eligible another opportunity to apply.

Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC) continues to administer the initiative. Livestock producers can get more information and apply by visiting AFSC's website.

### ALBERTA RCMP CHARGES OILFIELD THIEVES OPERATING IN NORTHWEST ALBERTA AND BC

On January 12, 2024, members of the Western Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (WAD CRU), with the assistance of RCMP Air Services, took two individuals into custody following a several-month-long investigation into thefts from oil and gas sites throughout the region. WAD CRU began the investigation in the fall of 2023, monitoring the suspects for involvement in crimes targeting oil and gas sites in the County of Grande Prairie, the MD of Greenview, Big Lakes County. Woodlands Countv. Parkland County and the Peace River District of BC.

Michael O'Bee (44) and Denai Lanz (41), both residents of Grande Prairie, have been charged with multiple offences in both Alberta and BC, including:

- ·Break and Enter;
- •Theft Under \$5000;
- •Possession of Break-In Instruments:

- Mischief Over \$5000;
- ·Possession of a Controlled Substance; and
- Multiple counts of Failing to Comply with Release Or-

O'Bee and Lanz were brought before a Justice of the Peace. O'Bee was remanded into custody and Lanz was released on conditions. O'Bee will appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Grande Prairie on Jan. 29, 2024, while Lanz is due to appear on Feb. 5, 2024.

"The successful outcome

of this file was a result of a combined efforts from several RCMP Detachments in Western Alberta and BC, along with the assistance of specialized RCMP units including Air Services and Police Dog Services" says Sgt. Chris Power of WAD CRU. "Our unit continues to work with local detachments to identify, disrupt, and bring those responsible for targeted oil and gas site thefts before the courts".


