





LSARA CARES

Please find attached the presentation to council that was made on February 8, 2024. Although the questions were provided to Council and Administration on January 31, 2024, there were no responses provided to the questions. Council indicated that an audit is being conducted shortly and the results will be published to all Ratepayers. This, in our opinion, will not satisfy any of the questions that were asked. We remain hopeful that we will receive response to the questions we posed in their entirety.

All of these questions were provided to the Council on the February 8, 2024.

- When will council release a final total of the true costs to date on this building? These costs would include but not be limited to:
 - a. Construction Management
 - b. Total engineering costs from inception of design to completion of construction
 - c. Monitoring costs as the building began to have structural issues
 - d. Any and all repairs facilitated to the building, foundation or the land
 - e. Any and all consulting contracts prior/during, and post construction
 - f. All true legal fees and total administrative costs assigned to the project
- September of 2015, council passed a motion to utilize \$9,090,200 from MSI and future grant funds for the years 2014 to 2019.
 - a. What was the total amount of the Grant funds that were used?
- b. What programs/projects /infrastructure were dropped to facilitate the movement of these grant funds or is this the reason for the increases to property taxes?
- 3. A short-term borrowing bylaw was passed in 2015 in the amount of \$5,112,800 for purpose of interim financing pending MSI grant funds for construction.
 - a. Has the short term borrow been repaid?
 - b. Was the administration building completely paid for prior to the settlement being accepted?
- 4. What is the actual short fall between the true and final cost of the Building and the Settlement? The actual must be the difference between the final true costs minus the settlement. To be accurate, the shortfall must also include the administrative costs assigned to the project.
- 5. The existing building is it the intent of this council to provide documentation to support any changes to the existing administration building?
- 6. If the information indicates the status of the administration building is now and/or perceived to be in the future as not repairable, will council choose to abandon the building?
 - a. If so, what is the timeline and what is the plan?
 - b. If this juncture is reached, where is the proposed location of the administration of LSAC?
- c. In the settlement, was there consideration given to the possibility of having to rent space and continue to rent space to house administration?
- 7. As part of the compensation, were the true costs of the administration building considered?
 - a. What is the estimated cost, in today's dollars to replace the building?
 - b. Has there been any monies spent on a new proposal?
- 8. What are the next steps?
- a. Will council include the Ratepayers of Lac Ste Anne County through public engagement, open houses, forums and by way of plebiscite on location, design and cost prior to making any decisions that have the ability to impact the Ratepayers of LSAC?



ST. ALBERT RCMP CHARGE 7 YOUTH WITH VIOLENT OFFENCES

On November 28, 2023 at approximately 3:30pm, St. Albert RCMP responded to a call of an assault in progress outside the McDonalds at 369 St. Albert Trail. Further calls were received to the RCMP reporting weapons were involved and individuals were running from the area. St. Albert RCMP responded quickly and were able to locate the victim as well as arrest numerous suspects in the surrounding area.

The investigation revealed that the victim had been physically assaulted and struck with a baton while having property stolen from him. The victim was transported to the hospital with minor injuries and released from the hospital the same day. Several of the suspects had ran from police but were apprehended. Seven youth, all who reside in Edmonton, have been charged with the following offences:

Four Youth were charged with:

- Robbery S. 344(1) (b) Criminal Code
- Obstruction S. 129(a) Criminal Code

Two Youth were charged with:

- Assault S. 266 Criminal Code
- Obstruction 129(a) Criminal Code

One Youth was charged with:

- Assault with weapon S. 267(a) Criminal Code
- Obstruction 129(a) Criminal Code

All youth were placed on conditions not to contact the victim and not to attend that McDonald's location.

Submitted by St. Albert Other conditions for several of the youth was not to possess any weapons. The first appearance for all the accused youth is March 5, 2024. The St. Albert RCMP have had several inquiries from the public as a result of this investigation, however are unable to release further information due to the age of the persons involved.

STATE OF THE COUNTY

This message is our way of giving folks an update on our happenings throughout the last year. It's an opportunity to provide context behind important Council decisions, regional matters and events.

Well, 2023 was a year like no other for Lac Ste. Anne County! In bidding farewell to the past year, it is with wonder that I reflect on the emotional journey we've shared as a community in 2023. The past twelve months have brought challenges and triumphs, fostering a spirit of resiliency and unity that defines the heart of Lac Ste. Anne County residents, staff, and Council.

Taxation

From 2020 - 2022 Lac Ste. Anne County implemented the bare minimum of tax rate increases. There was just so much going on in the world around us – COVID-19, supply issues, job losses and more – so the County worked hard to lessen hardships within our community. Looking back from a social perspective, it was a good idea; financially, it may not have been the best.

Last spring, Council faced the tough decision of a tax rate increase of 5.56 %. This was met with great public pushback. You were right, and we were listening! Small increases aligned with inflation rates lessens the impact on our ratepayers while maintaining current programs and services expected by the community. That is what our 2024 Budget will reflect.

Inflation continues to impact the lives of every resident in Lac Ste. Anne County. With rising housing, utilities, and food costs, it is no secret that 2023 was a financial challenge and that County operations were not exempt from it. 2023 closed with a yearly inflation rate of 3 %. While this is a decrease from the 6 % in 2022, the County continues to feel the inflationary effects.

Public Safety and Resilience

Mother nature was hard on us this past year - fires, flooding and drought. We experienced it all! In the face of unprecedented wildfires, our community demonstrated unwavering resilience. County Fire Services strove to prevent loss of life and minimize damage to property and infrastructure. I'm proud of the County's reaction in the face of disaster – from administration and staff, to the entire Fire Services team and our residents. Together we faced the challenge with determination and efficiency, proving that strength lies in teamwork.

Mutual aid from neighbouring municipalities fire services contributed largely to our response. This allowed us to work more effectively and efficiently; ultimately keeping the community safer.

Thanks to the cooperation and respect exhibited by our residents, we navigated through these challenging times with a shared commitment to adapt and increase resilience to wildfire.

Business and Development Growth

Again, this past year we've seen growth in development applications and permits. Land sales have continued in an upward trend. Local businesses seemed to adapt and thrive, showcasing the resilience of their entrepreneurial spirit. For proof, just visit ShoptheCounty.ca – it boasts over six hundred local businesses and is growing daily. And residents are supporting local like never before! So before you take a trip to the city, check it out to see if you can find what you're looking for closer to home.

Operations and Public Works

The County typically replaces three graders each year from a fleet of fifteen, ensuring that the equipment is replaced before we're faced with the burden of repairs beyond the warranty period. Each year, we compare whether to capitalize on a guaranteed buy-back program or sell them at auction. This year, the auction option brought us a better amount.

Since 2020, the price of heavy equipment has risen substantially. The greatest increase occurred between 2022 & 2023, when the County saw a 30 % increase in the cost of replacement graders for Operations. Council moved to purchase three new graders totalling \$1,940,400.00 (\$646,800.00 per grader). Expensive, yet vital to maintaining the County's gravel roads year-round.

Agricultural Services

Our committed Agricultural Service Board continues to promote and protect viable and sustainable agriculture practices throughout the region. The County continues to partner with innovative farming initiatives like Farming Forward (formerly the West Central Forage Association), the ALUS Program, and Gateway Research Organization. We also vehemently advocated for local farmers by lobbying the government to add our municipality to the 2023 Canada-Alberta Drought Livestock Assistance initiative.

Administration Building Lawsuit Settlement

Council voted to take the \$8.45 million offer to settle its lawsuit against companies involved in the design, engineering, project management, and construction of the County Administration Building. This dollar amount was recommended by the mediator and our legal counsel advised we accept.

By accepting the settlement we've alleviated further costs associated with a prolonged legal process, not to mention the uncertainty of the outcome.

We're investing the funds in a secure growth savings account and it will remain there until Council evaluates our options regarding the future of the Administration Building. NO PLANS HAVE BEEN MADE TO REBUILD AT THIS TIME.

COUNCIL IS CONTENT TO STAY IN THIS FACILITY FOR THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE. That said, our Infrastructure department closely monitors and inspects the building to ensure it remains safe for staff and the public.

This Council assures you that direct public consultation will take place in advance of future decision making regarding the Administration Building.

Community Engagement

While my fellow Councillors and I attended many functions from local family celebrations to municipal initiatives, we enjoyed meeting with people. Should you see us at an event, stop, introduce yourself and tell us what's important to you. We like to hear from folks and we've learned that listening to our public is never a bad thing.

Looking Ahead

Stepping into this new year we can build on our achievements learn from our experiences and make the County an even better place to live, work, and play.


