PARKLAND RCMP ARREST 5 PEOPLE IN STOLEN VEHICLE WITH LOADED FIREARMS, WEAPONS AND DRUGS

Parkland County, Alta. - On Jan. 27, 2024, Parkland RCMP with the assistance of Enoch RCMP located a stolen vehicle on Highway 16A just west of Stony Plain. In the in-

terest of public safety, a tire deflation device was covertly deployed. The vehicle traveled another 35 kms before coming to a stop, where five occupants were taken into custody without incident. A search of the vehicle located 118

grams of suspected methamphetamine (estimated value of \$7000), 37 grams of suspected cocaine (estimated value of \$3700), \$590 cash, two loaded shot guns, and several other weapons.



ALBERTA RCMP AUTO THEFT UNIT EXECUTE SEARCH WARRANT IN ST. ALBERT

In late April 2023, the Alberta RCMP Auto theft Unit began an investigation into vehicles that were suspected to be re-VINed and registered in St. Albert. As a result of the investigation, on Jan. 10, 2024, the Alberta RCMP Auto theft Unit

•Fraudulent Concealment (X2)







THE FUTURE OF HEALTH CARE IS IN ALBERTANS' HANDS

Alberta's government is launching a series of provincewide in-person engagement sessions with health care workers and Albertans to help shape the future of health care.

As part of the government's ongoing efforts to refocus the health care system, Albertans are encouraged to register for one of the upcoming in-person engagement sessions, which start on Jan. 23. These sessions are an opportunity for open conversations about the challenges, solutions and innovations that will help build a stronger health care system.

Collaborating with front-line health care workers, regional partners and Albertans is crucial to creating a health system that better supports workers and improves patient care. The input, experiences and feedback received from Albertans will help create a more effective health care system that is there for Albertans when and where they need it.

Members of Alberta's government will attend these sessions wherever possible, including Minister of Health Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Seniors, Community and Social Services Jason Nixon, Minister of Mental Health and Addiction Dan Williams, and Parliamentary Secretary for Rural Health Martin Long.

Health care workers and members of the public are encouraged to register online for an in-person session in their area. Further engagement plans will be announced in the coming weeks. In addition to public sessions, there will be dedicated engagement with Indigenous leaders and other key health care partners. Regularly updated information about new and ongoing engagement sessions is available on the government's online "Shape the way" page.

Minister LaGrange will also be visiting hospitals and acute care facilities across the province throughout this engagement and continuing into the spring. She will hear first-hand from clinical staff and front-line health care workers as she works to identify ways to make both short- and long-term improvements to health care delivery in the province.

Indigenous Pathways Lead Teachers also annually nominate a number of deserving students for the Honouring Spirit: Indigenous Student Awards sponsored by the Alberta School Boards Association. These awards are intended to recognize First Nations, Métis and Inuit students who model strength and commitment in pursuing their personal education path and embrace their gifts, strengths and potential while celebrating the ways of their people.




