EVANSBURG RCMP CHARGE REPEAT OFFENDER AFTER FLIGHT FROM POLICE

On Feb. 13, 2024, Evansburg RCMP were conducting proactive patrols in Parkland County when they located a vehicle committing multiple traffic infractions. RCMP attempted a traffic stop but the

vehicle fled in a dangerous and erratic manner into oncoming traffic. Evansburg RCMP, with assistance from Whitecourt RCMP and Mayerthorpe RCMP, were able to arrest both occupants of the vehicle, after the successful deployment of a tire deflation device.

As a result of the investigation, the driver of the vehicle, Christopher Taylor (30), a resident of Edmonton, has been charged with:

The circumstances around the death were suspicious and the Alberta RCMP Major Crime Unit was deployed to take carriage of the investigation.

The deceased was taken to the Office of the Chief

Medical Examiner in Edmonton. Police are treating the death as a homicide. The deceased has been identified as 26-year-old Gordelle Soosay.

On Feb. 11, 2024, at 7:55 p.m. RCMP received a report of a vehicle fire south of Highway 611 near 3 Mile,

on Samson Cree Nation. Officers located an Audi sedan and determined that it belonged to the deceased.

- Explain the difference between "tattling" on someone as opposed to reporting in order to stop someone from getting hurt
- Encourage your child to come up with creative ways to intervene in a bullying situation, such as changing the subject or starting a game
- Set a good example for your child by showing that you care about others

SEVERE WEATHER TOOK A TOLL ON HOMES, BUSINESSES AND VEHICLES IN ALBERTA IN 2023

Claims for insured property damage exceed an estimated \$330 million

The final tally is in and 2023 now ranks as the fourth-worst year for insured losses in Canada due to severe weather with hail, wildfire, wind and flood events having caused over \$3.1 billion in insured damage according to year-end estimates from Catastrophe Indices and Quantification Inc. (CatIQ).

In Alberta alone, damage to property exceeded \$330 million, including over \$100 million paid to repair and replace vehicles following hail and flood events. Since 2020, insured losses due to

severe weather in Alberta has exceeded \$4 billion. Over \$500 million of that went to insurance claims involving damaged vehicles.

“Alberta continues to experience an alarming trend in severe weather events and this was the third straight year in which the province saw significant insured damage from hail, wind and rain,” said Aaron Sutherland, Vice-President, Pacific and Western, Insurance Bureau of Canada (IBC). “The costs associated with these devastating events are placing significant pressure on insurance premiums in the province. It’s more important than ever that we redouble our efforts to better protect

communities to help improve the affordability of insurance coverage moving forward.”

Alberta’s auto insurance market is under considerable strain due to the rate cap implemented last November. With inflation, auto theft, and legal awards continuing to grow, severe weather events add another cost pressure to auto insurance premiums in Alberta, which is why IBC is calling on government to urgently implement reforms that improve the affordability of coverage moving forward.

IBC reminds consumers that damage caused by hail, wind and rain is generally covered by standard home, commercial property and comprehensive auto in-

urance policies, but there can be limitations. Speak to your insurance representative to understand your coverage for weather related events. Insurers continue to work diligently through the claims process to help clients impacted by the 2023 storms. If you have questions about home, auto or business insurance, speak with your insurance representative regarding your specific policy or call IBC’s Consumer Information Centre at 1-844-2ask-IBC for general information.

NAVIGATING AN INTERFAITH WEDDING

Celebrating family histories and traditions is a major component of weddings. During a wedding, two families come together and begin to merge their unique takes on life.

When couples tying the knot come from the same cultural or religious backgrounds, fitting the pieces together may be relatively easy. However, when a wedding must incorporate two different religions - each with its specific traditions and requirements - a couple may not know where to start. These tips may help the process along.

Communication

It is important to open a dialogue with all involved parties at the onset to be able to craft a ceremony and subsequent celebration that aligns with the faiths of the couple and their families. This dialogue shares what everyone expects. Ask everyone to rank the rituals they would like to be included by order of importance, and then use this as a guide when planning the ceremony.

Discuss options

Certain houses of worship may be strict in regard to what they allow during interfaith ceremonies. Conservative congregations may even frown upon marrying outside of one's

religion. That may spark an entirely new conversation about converting so couples can be married in the eyes of the church, temple or mosque. More reformed places may be

open to blending certain traditions from both faiths. Couples often lean toward having one officiant from each faith at the ceremony to incorporate key rites into the wedding.

Neutral ground
Interfaith couples may opt to have the ceremony at a neutral location so they do not appear to

Fire Season Starts MARCH 1, 2024

Starting March 1, fire permits are required for any existing or new burning (except campfires), in the the Yellowhead County Fire Permit Area.

Fire permits help track what is burning on the landscape. If you're burning without a fire permit or outside fire permit conditions, your fire is considered a wildfire.

ST. ALBERT RCMP CHARGE 7 YOUTH WITH VIOLENT OFFENCES

Submitted by St. Albert RCMP

On November 28, 2023 at approximately 3:30pm, St. Albert RCMP responded to a call of an assault in progress outside the McDonalds at 369 St. Albert Trail. Further calls were received to the RCMP reporting weapons were involved and individuals were running from the area. St. Albert RCMP responded quickly and were able to locate the victim as well as arrest numerous suspects in the surrounding area.

The investigation revealed that the victim had been physically assaulted and struck with a baton while having property stolen from him. The victim was transported to the hospital with minor injuries and released from the hospital the same day. Several of the suspects had ran from police but were apprehended. Seven youth, all who reside in Edmonton, have been charged with the following offences:

Four Youth were charged with:

- Robbery S. 344(1)(b) Criminal Code
 - Obstruction S. 129(a) Criminal Code
 - Two Youth were charged with:
 - Assault S. 266 Criminal Code
 - Obstruction S. 129(a) Criminal Code
 - One Youth was charged with:
 - Assault with a weapon S. 267(a) Criminal Code
 - Obstruction S. 129(a) Criminal Code
- All youth were placed on conditions not to contact the

victim and not to attend that McDonald's location. Other conditions for several of the youth was not to possess any weapons. The first appearance for all the accused youth is March 5, 2024. The St. Albert RCMP have had several inquiries from the public as a result of this investigation, however are unable to release further information due to the age of the persons involved.

REGULAR CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING A KEY PREVENTATIVE TOOL

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

Alberta Health Services (AHS) is recommending cervical cancer screening for those between the ages of 25 and 69 who are or have been sexually active. This screening is with a Pap test and is also frequently referred to as a Pap smear.

A Pap test checks the cervix for any abnormal cells that can lead to cervical cancer. It's important to get screened regularly. You should have a Pap test once every three years

unless your healthcare provider tells you otherwise. Regular Pap tests and follow-up care can prevent about 90 per cent of cervical cancer cases. Pap tests can also detect cervical cancer early. Getting screened can save your life. The earlier cancer is found, the easier it is to treat.

Contact your healthcare provider's office or a women's health clinic to book a Pap test. If you do not have a healthcare provider, such as a family doctor or nurse practitioner:

- Visit Alberta Find a Doctor,

- or
 - Use the [screeningforlife.ca](https://www.screeningforlife.ca) locator tool and select "cervical" as the type of test to find screening options near you, or
 - Call Health Link at 811.
- It's important to have regular Pap tests, even if:
- You feel healthy and have no symptoms of cervical cancer.
 - You've only had one sexual partner.
 - You've had the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine.
 - You've been through menopause.
 - You're no longer sexually

active. Almost all cases of cervical cancer are caused by HPV. HPV infections are common, and they usually do not cause symptoms, so most people do not even know they have it. A Pap test doesn't test for other cancers or sexually transmitted infections, such as syphilis, chlamydia, gonorrhea or human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).
