

ALBERTA RCMP REMINDS RESIDENTS OF THE 9PM ROUTINE

Alberta summers mean late nights with the sun shining bright, however, it's still important to remember a nightly routine. On average, property crime tends to rise during the summer months. In July 2023, in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions, there were 2,798 reports of Theft Under \$5,000.

Property crimes are often crimes of opportunity, and maintaining a nightly routine can help deter thefts. The "9PM Routine" is a movement followed by police services around the world,

Submitted by Alberta encouraging people to follow a nightly checklist to ensure their property is secured.

> A 9PM routine checklist consists of:

- Locking your doors at night (yes, even if you live in a small town).
- Locking your garage or shed.
- Ensuring all yard tools and recreational equipment is safely stored, preferably in a locked garage or shed.
- Removing all keys from vehicles and locking the doors; securely store any off-highway vehicles.
- Consider installing a home alarm; if you

already have one, set your alarm before going to sleep.

Use motion sensor lights on the exterior of your property.

If you have a seasonal property or trailer, there are still 9PM Routine tasks you can follow, such as:

- Using motion sensor lights on your property, especially at the entryways or near your shed or garage.
- Use a hitch lock and ensure it is properly secured.
- Remove the battery from your trailer when you leave for an extended period.
- Ensure all tools

and recreational items are securely stored once you are done with them.

- Ensure your vehicle is locked and the keys and garage door opener are removed.
- Ensure your garage or shed is locked each night.

ANOTHER REGISTRY DISCOUNT FOR ALBERTA SENIORS

Seniors requiring driver's medical examination to renew their driver's licence can now receive a 25 per cent discount from Alberta registries.

Alberta's government promised to help keep life affordable for Alberta's seniors by introducing a 25 per cent discount on some of the services that seniors rely on. In March, Alberta's government announced that seniors would receive the discount when they accessed personal registry services.

A second initiative, a 25 per cent discount on driver's medical exams, is now in effect. Senior drivers are eligible for the driver's medical examination discount, provided they are 65 or older on the day of the exam and the exam took place April 1, 2024, or later. This aligns with the seniors' discount on personal registry services, implemented on April 1.

"We made a promise to make life more affordable for Alberta seniors, and we are keeping it. Ensuring our seniors can maintain the independence that a driver's licence provides, while reducing the cost of complying with licensing requirements, is another way that we are recognizing their contribution to our society."

A driver's medical examination is a routine examination performed by a physician or nurse practitioner. The purpose of the examination is to ensure that a person is medically fit to drive according to provincial guidelines. Seniors are required to get a driver's medical examination at age 75, 80, and every two years after that, starting at 82. Some seniors with a medical condition may be required to get a driver's medical examination at an earlier age.

Seniors who have completed the exam can take their receipt or proof of purchase to any Alberta registry agent to apply for their discount. Seniors will be reimbursed for 25 per cent of the amount paid for the examination through government-issued cheque mailed to them. Driver's medical examinations performed since April 1, 2024, are eligible under the program.

"The past few years have been tough on seniors, who have been struggling with inflation while trying to make ends meet on a fixed income. The discount on the driver's medical exam, combined with the discount on personal registry services, will make their lives more affordable."

Alberta seniors should book an appointment at a primary care physician or nurse practitioner's office. As the examinations are not covered by the Alberta Healthcare Insurance Program (AHCIP), payment is made to the physician. Once payment is complete, seniors can receive their discount by following a few steps:

• Present proof of their driver's medical examination purchase at any registry agent location. Receipts must include their name, service provided, date, physician or nurse practitioner's details (e.g., clinic, address, phone number), and amount paid for the service.

- A registry agent will verify eligibility details and process the reimbursement.
- Reimbursement, in the form of a government-issued cheque, will be mailed to the senior's address on file within 10 business days.

"This additional discount on registry services for seniors will help maintain their driving privileges, making it easier to stay connected with loved ones. By reducing the cost of driver medical exams, we're also helping seniors save money while ensuring

they stay safe on the road. Seniors can visit their local registry office to receive the discount."
