PARKLAND RCMP AND EDMONTON POLICE SERVICE CHARGED MALE AFTER A SERIES OF BANK ROBBERIES

Investigations by the Parkland RCMP and Edmonton Police Service (EPS) have resulted in a male being charged after

two bank robberies.

On July 17, 2024, at approximately 11:30 a.m., a male suspect entered the CIBC bank located at 100 McLeod Avenue in Spruce Grove, Alta. The male walked up to a bank teller

and handed a note which stated that this is a robbery, he had a gun (not produced) and demanded money. The male then left the bank on foot without further incident.



Parkland RCMP And Edmonton Police Service Charged Male After A Series Of Bank Robberies

The robbery was captured on bank CCTV video.

On July 18, 2024, at approximately 3:05 p.m., EPS responded to a Robbery at the Servus Credit Union bank located at 2315 Rabbit Hill Road in Edmonton. A lone male suspect had walked up to a bank teller stated that this is a robbery,

demanded money and that he had a gun.

Investigators from the two police services quickly determined that both robberies were likely carried out by the same person.

As a result of the investigations, on Sept. 14, 2024, the suspect, Chilliwack B.C. resident Jacob Luke McDonald (30), was arrested in Chilliwack. He was trans-

ported back to Alberta and was subsequently charged with:

- Robbery (x2);
- Disguise with intent (x2).

McDonald is remanded into custody with his next court date set for Sept. 23, 2024 at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

AGRICULTURAL SERVICES APPEAL BOARD [4 positions, 1-year term]

This committee adjudicates property owner appeals of orders and penalties issued by the County's Agricultural Services pursuant to the provincial acts the County enforces. This committee will meet as required. Training required, costs for training will be covered. Term will be January 1, 2025 - December 31, 2025.

AGRICULTURAL SERVICES BOARD [3 positions, 3-year terms]

This five member advisory board provides advice to council on the agricultural programs and services provided within the county. The Board advises on policy issues under the Agricultural Services Board Act, the Weed Control Act, the Pest Control Act, and other provincial statutes. This Board meets 7-8 times per year on the 4th Thursday of the month at 9:30 AM in the Wildwood office.

FCSS BOARD [5 positions + 1 Parkland County position, 3-year term]

This seven member advisory board provides advice to Council and administration for the provision of preventive social services under the Family & Community Support Services Act & Regulation. The Board reviews programs for the volunteer community, seniors, adults, youth and children and reviews and approves grants to community organizations from funds budgeted by Council for preventive services. This board meets 6-8 times per year on a weekday morning in Wildwood County office.

HERITAGE BOARD [4 positions, 3-year term]

This five member board provides advice to Council with respect to the development and maintenance of a heritage program. The board will advise Council on the development of policy, budget, short and long term strategic planning and guidelines for funding projects, museums, community groups, businesses and individuals. This Board meets at the Wildwood County office at 9:30 AM on the 3rd Wednesday of the month, 4 times a year

LIBRARY BOARD [1 position, 3-year term]

This five member management board is responsible for the provision of library services to county residents. The board provides for the library services in the three rural libraries of Evansburg, Wildwood, and Green Grove (Niton) as well as providing funding to the libraries in Edson and Hinton. Board members develop the annual budget, develop library policies and ensure provision of library services as per the Libraries Act of Alberta. The Board meets on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 9:30 AM at the Wildwood Library.

RECREATION BOARD [7 positions, 3-year term]

This nine member advisory board provides advice to council regarding the provision of recreation and parks services. The board reviews grant applications from community groups and determines funding within certain limits. It provides recommendations to council and administration regarding recreation facilities, programs and support to groups providing recreational activities. Board meetings will occur quarterly on Mondays at 9:30 AM at the Edson county office

SUBDIVISION & DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD [1 position, 1-year term]

This board hears appeals of decisions from the Subdivision and Development Authority of Yellowhead County, pursuant to the Municipal Government Act. This board meets at the Edson office as required. This is a one-year term, ending October 31, 2025. Training required. All SOAB training costs covered.

NEW SCHOOL YEAR, NEW MENTAL HEALTH CLASSROOMS

Alberta's government is making progress on its promise to open 60 mental health classrooms across the province, bringing nine more online this September.

Alberta's government is building a full continuum of care for those facing mental health and addiction challenges. With services includ-

ing prevention, intervention, treatment and recovery, Albertans are getting access to world-class mental health care that is helping rebuild and strengthen lives across the province. A primary focus is building the Alberta Recovery Model, which is based on the belief that recovery and wellness is possible, no matter what mental health or addiction challenge someone may face.

As part of the Alberta Recovery Model, the province has partnered with CASA Mental Health to make record-breaking expansions to services for children and youth. Through this partnership, Alberta is investing \$70 million over three years to bring online a total of up to 60 CASA Mental Health Classrooms across the province. This September marks another step towards that goal with the opening of nine class-

rooms in seven communities throughout Alberta.

"Services like this are important to the long-term success and well-being of children and youth who are right now facing some very difficult challenges with their mental health. Every kid deserves to know that help is available, and that they can recover and live fulfilling lives. Our government is going to continue with investments like this that change the lives of children, youth and their families."

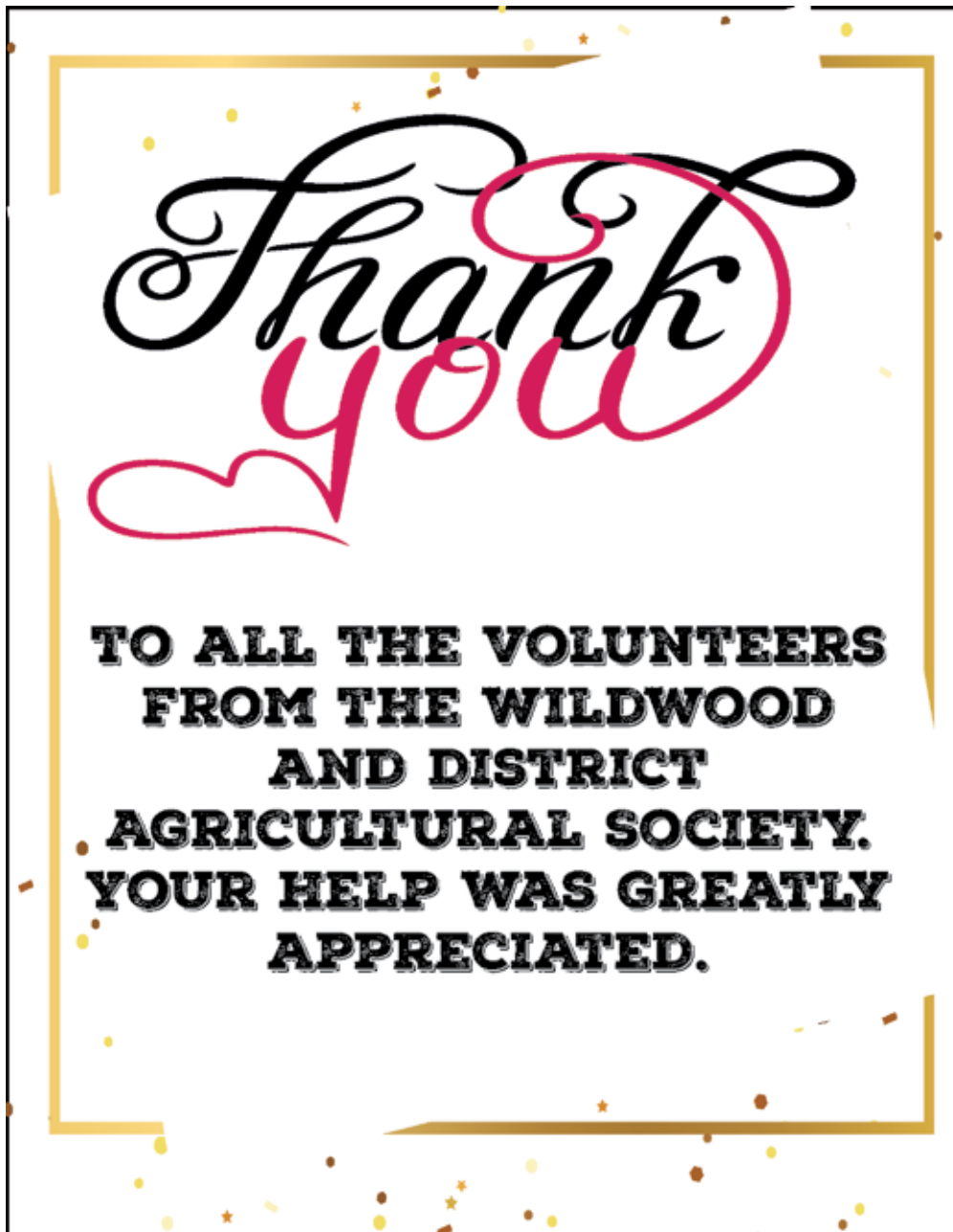

CASA Mental Health Classrooms provide a unique setting in which students facing complex mental health challenges can receive professional care without disrupting their education. Students are also able to maintain their social lives and stay connected to their peers. Each classroom is staffed with a full-time teacher, mental health therapist, mental health aide and other staff who support students in their recovery. Caregivers are also provided with resources to support the child or youth during and after the program.

"This partnership with the Government of Alberta is bringing services closer to Alberta's children and families. The goal is to provide mental health services earlier to more children and youth to prevent treatment in hospitals and empower them to thrive."

IMPROVE INDOOR AIR QUALITY IN ADVANCE OF WINTER

Upon the arrival of winter, people in regions where winter is marked by cold weather tend to spend significantly more time indoors. Because windows tend to be closed during winter, indoor air quality can suffer, making conditions inside a home less than desirable.

According to the American Lung Association, poor air circulation in a home can promote the spread of bacteria and viruses. Once such bacteria or viruses are

inhaled, coughs, colds and flu can spread. In addition, asthma and allergy sufferers may experience worsening symptoms thanks to the presence of endotoxins, which are substances that come from the broken-down cells of dead bacteria.

Because many people spend significantly more time indoors during winter than other times of the year, it's essential that they take measures to improve indoor air quality in the

months ahead.

Cut back on chemicals. It's ideal to avoid heavy chemical usage inside a home throughout the year, but it's especially important to do so during winter. Solvent-based cleaners or cleaning products with strong fragrances can negatively affect indoor air quality and potentially trigger allergic reactions. In lieu of chemically-enhanced cleaning products, use natural products that get the job done with-

out sacrificing indoor air quality.

Stop smoking indoors. Tobacco smoke can affect smokers and nonsmokers alike. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention note that secondhand smoke causes numerous health problems in infants and children. Those include more frequent and severe asthma attacks and respiratory infections. In addition, reports from the U.S. Department of Health and

Human Services have linked second-hand smoke to an increased risk of sudden infant death syndrome. Adults exposed to secondhand smoke are at greater risk for coronary heart disease, stroke and lung cancer. Tobacco smoke contains thousands of pollutants that can greatly diminish indoor air quality, so make sure smokers limit their smoking to outside the home throughout the year, but especially

during winter. Take off your shoes when entering the home. Snowy conditions often require a home's inhabitants and guests to remove their footwear upon entering a home, but it helps to remove footwear in a mudroom or just inside the front door when entering a home even when it's not snowing. Shoes can pick up dirt, dust and a host of other particles during winter, and if tracked inside those unwanted guests can negatively

affect indoor air quality. Routinely inspect bathrooms for mold. During winter, mold can grow in rooms that are exposed to moisture but not properly ventilated. In many homes, that's the bathroom. Even if a bathroom has a ventilation fan, routinely inspect the ceiling and shower for mold growth. Exposure to mold can cause a host of negative side effects, including nasal and sinus congestion and sore throat. Mold also can ex-

acerbate asthma symptoms. Improving and maintaining indoor air quality in winter can help a home's inhabitants stay healthy during the colder months.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR DURING ROOF INSPECTIONS

Cold weather can be tough on a home, and perhaps no part of a home is more vulnerable to harsh winter weather than its roof.

Fallen snow can equate to several pounds of pressure placed on a residential roof. Roofs do not often collapse under heavy snowfall. But adverse winter weather conditions can compromise roofs in other ways. Water leakage and damage to the roof's interior are just two of the potentially problematic is-

ssues that can arise when roofs are battered by cold, blustery weather. That's why many home improvement specialists advise homeowners to conduct roof inspections prior to the start of winter.

Many homeowners can conduct their own cursory roof inspections, but they may not know exactly what to look for. The National Roofing Contractors Association says that there are certain key areas to inspect that may reveal some

telltale signs of roof damage.

• Curled, cracked or missing shingles may prove troublesome. Inclement weather can test the strength of even the most durable roofs. Even though many roofs are designed to last up to 30 years, some may need to be replaced early, particularly when they have been exposed to harsh weather over a period of years. Individual shingles can be replaced as spot treatments, but if the damage is wide-

spread, a new roof may be necessary.

• Attic leaks or water elsewhere might signal issues with the roof. Figure out if water inside the home is coming from the roof. Water stains do not always indicate problems with the roofing, but it's better to be safe than sorry.

• Look for protective granules wearing off. If gutters are filled with the sandy granular material that coats roofing shingles,

that may be a sign of an aging or damaged roof.

Inspect flashing. Professional roofers can recognize properly installed flashing, the material that connects the roof to other parts of the house that adjoin the roof, like skylights or a chimneys. Poorly installed flashing can cause leaks. Stains that appear below chimneys or near attic windows may indicate new flashing, and not new shingles, is needed.

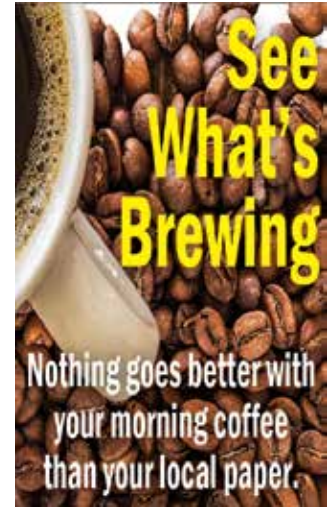
Gutters and downspouts should be in good condition. A roof is the sum of its parts, and that includes downspouts and gutters. If the gutters are clogged or damaged, they cannot direct water away from the house properly. Snow, leaves and other debris needs to be cleared from gutters to help them function at optimal capacity.

Animals and insects can cause damage, too. It's not just poor weather that homeowners

need to consider with regard to roof damage. Boring insects and animals may cause problems with roofs as well. A roof inspection may shed light on potential pest problems. Holes or nesting materials may indicate that an animal or animals are using the attic as a shelter from the elements.

Get to the root of issues with your home's roof before they become bigger problems once winter arrives. A thorough inspection can re-

veal problems that may prove costly if ignored.

Alberta’s government first supported the introduction of CASA Mental Health Classrooms in 2023 and continues to back their expansion to more schools. As of this September, 17 CASA Mental Health Classrooms are operating throughout the province, more than double what was available last school year. Classrooms will continue to open in a phased approach, with a total of up to 60 Classrooms, supporting about 140 Alberta communities by 2026. Once all are online, CASA Mental Health Classrooms will be helping about 1,500 students each year.
