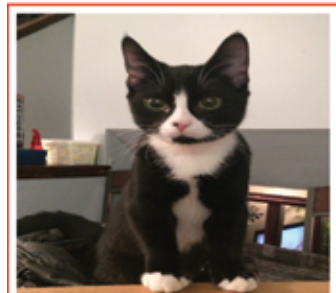

Teacher Consultant. Part of the day included time to learn about new tech tools in the Division's Digital Lending library with over 20 resources and activity ideas teachers can access to enhance learning and engagement with curriculum. EdTech Leads then provided feedback on how the added resources could best be utilized

in a classroom setting. Leads were also introduced to the Tech Team's mini-pilot with the Brisk Teaching platform. They will pilot the digital tool to determine if there is value in bringing it in for teachers' use division-wide. They also reviewed the Brisk platform using the Division's Artificial Intelligence (AI) Guidelines created last school year to practice what kind

of considerations should be thought of before procuring an AI system. a six-sheet curling facility, and a concession, the facility is designed to meet the growing needs of both current and future residents.

The development of the Regional Community Recreation Facility has been a priority for the Town of Stony Plain since the 2017 Indoor Recreation Study, which identified the need for expanded recreation amenities in the Tri-Municipal Region. The facility is designed to accommodate future recreation and leisure additions, including aquatics and ice facilities, growing with the future needs of the region.

“The regional Community Recreation Facility is more than just a space for physical activity. It is a place

where residents can connect, build community, and foster a sense of belonging,” say Mayor William Choy. “This is an exciting day for the region, I look forward to celebrating the opening of the facility with the community in 2026.”

The facility, which is expected to open in late 2026, marks a significant advancement of a key priority of the 2024-2027 Strategic Plan, the development of facilities and amenities that support a vibrant and inclusive community. The Regional Community Recreation Facility will be located next to the new Westview School and west of Glenn Hall Centennial Arena in Old Town South.

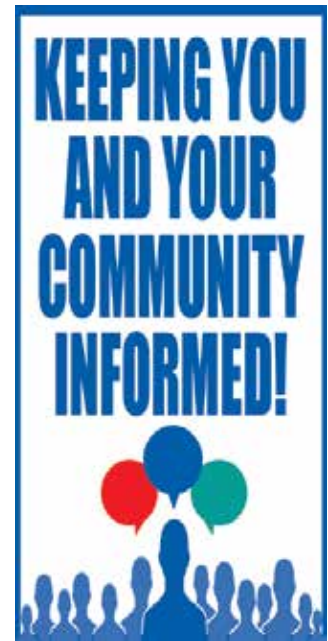
“This facility is an important addition to the im-

proved health and connectiveness of our community,” says General Manager of Community and Protective Services Karl Hill. “Its design and features offer recreation and leisure opportunities that will enrich the lives of our residents for years to come.”

The construction of the facility has a total approved project budget of \$41,651,871, supported by funding partnerships with Westridge Curling Club, local developer contributions, and Parkland County. The facility has been designed by BR2 Architecture and will be constructed by Jen-Col Construction.

PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE FROM SNOW, ICE AND DAMAGE FROM THE COLD

Winter can be an unforgiving season. Freezing temperatures coupled with snow and ice can take its toll on people who live in climates where cold weather is a fact of winter life.

While winter can test people's patience, it also can be harsh on cars and trucks. Understanding what components of a vehicle can be compromised by dropping temperatures and snowy roads can help drivers take

action to safeguard their automotive investments.

While the Canadian Automobile Association notes that winter can wreak havoc on just about every part of a vehicle, there are some parts that seem to bear the brunt of Old Man Winter's abuse. Properly servicing and caring for a car or truck can help.

Drivers should take their vehicles for a tuneup and inspection

before wintry weather arrives. A mechanic will examine the car battery and check antifreeze levels and make sure that the thermostat, defroster, brakes, and even wiper blades are working effectively. Have the tires inspected for adequate tread, which can make navigating roads safer. If the treads are worn, replace the tires.

In addition to visiting their mechanics, drivers can perform some

inspections and fixes themselves.

• Check that all of the vehicle's lights are operational so your car can be easily seen during inclement weather. Exchange your existing windshield washer fluid with one that will not freeze in cold conditions. Check the nozzles on the windshield-washer system routinely and clear out any blockages of ice or debris.

Auto TUNE-UP

Protect Your Vehicle From Snow, Ice And Damage From The Cold

While addressing windshield washer fluid, also replace worn out windshield wiper blades with ones that can withstand snow and icy weather.

A new coating of wax can serve as a shield against road salt, snow, sleet, and rain. Try a polymer wax to protect the paint. Whenever possible, rinse off salt and grime so it does not dry on the car and gradually wear away at

the paint. Some drivers mistakenly believe that salt stops being a problem once it dries simply because moisture is the active ingredient for a corrosive reaction. But humidity in the air is enough to keep the salt eating away at the car's paint, and that can contribute to rust. Be sure to rinse off the undercarriage of the vehicle as well.

Have your tires' alignment checked toward the end of winter

or early spring. A season of traveling over pothole-ridden roads or hitting curbs buried under snow drifts can affect the alignment. Get everything back on track. Similarly, inspect tires routinely, as weather changes can affect tire pressure and strength.

Use a soft snow brush or a foam brush to clear snow off of the car. Avoid hard plastic scrapers you might use on your windshield, as

they can scratch painted surfaces.

Try to park the vehicle in a garage or under a car port, each of which can protect cars and trucks from the often harsh elements of winter.

Vehicles can be affected by the cold weather. Keep them running efficiently to prevent damage this winter.

Disasters can happen in a flash, and having a plan in place for common emergency situations can make it easier to handle adverse conditions, particularly when away from home.

According to MFASCO Health and Safety, a supplier of first aid supplies and kits, 90 percent of people do not carry first aid supplies or other emergency gear in their vehicles. Among those who may carry supplies, 30 percent never check to determine if they're in good working order. The National Safety Council says that drivers should always keep emergency supply kits in the trunks or cargo areas of their vehicles. Kits should be inspected every

six months, and worn out items should be replaced.

Roadside emergency kits can make the difference between getting back on the road safely or being stranded for hours. Such kits also may help prevent or treat injuries, potentially saving lives. Weather should be considered when preparing vehicle emergency kits, which should include the following.

- A properly inflated spare tire and tire-changing equipment
- Jumper cables
- A multipurpose utility tool and/or tool kit
- Flashlight and batteries
- Flares or triangle reflectors

- An extra quart of motor oil
- A first-aid kit containing at the least, gauze, tape, bandages, antibiotic ointment, aspirin, nonlatex gloves, scissors, hydrocortisone, thermometer, tweezers, and instant cold compress
- A blanket
- A tire pressure gauge
- A portable tire inflator
- Paper towels
- Nonperishable, high-energy foods
- Drinking water
- A reflective vest
- Duct tape
- A fire extinguisher
- An ice scraper
- A folding shovel

- Coolant and wash-er fluid
- A phone charger
- Baby/child supplies, if pertinent
- Rope

Keep roadside emergency kits organized at all times. Store items securely in a milk crate, box or backpack so they are always readily available. People should familiarize themselves with the items in the kit so they know how to use them correctly and quickly.

With some planning and organization, drivers can have the supplies they will need to make it through roadside emergencies safely.
