ALBERTA RCMP COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM RECOVER STOLEN VEHICLES IN WABAMUN

On Nov. 22, 2024, police were notified of a GMC Sierra that was stolen near Entwistle Alta. and was being GPS tracked by its owner. Officers from the Alberta RCMP Community Response

Team, Parkland and Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Units were able to locate the vehicle. When a safe opportunity presented itself, officer moved in and arrested all 3 occupants 2 of which attempted to flee on foot. Continued investigation led officers

to a stolen Subaru Outback at a nearby residence associated to the three individuals.

PUTTING AN END TO THE PHOTO RADAR CASH COW

Alberta's government is ending the photo radar cash cow, eliminating areas where photo radar is used to generate revenue with no traffic safety benefit.

Many Albertans have expressed growing frustration with photo radar, questioning its focus on revenue rather than safety. In response to these concerns, Alberta's government paused the introduction of new photo radar equipment and locations on Dec. 1, 2019. Now, after thorough analysis and consultation, Alberta's government is taking bold steps to restore public trust.

Effective April 1, 2025, ticketing on numbered provincial highways will end as photo radar will be restricted to school, playground and construction zones. Intersection safety devices in Alberta will also be restricted to red light enforcement only, ending the 'speed-on-green' ticketing function.

Municipalities will also be able to request that the province approve additional photo radar locations on an exceptional basis, for high collision areas and where other safety measures cannot be implemented effectively. These types of exceptions will be subject to an audit every two years to assess the effectiveness of photo radar at the site in reducing collisions.

"This is great news for Alberta drivers. These changes will once and for all kill the photo radar cash cow in Alberta. Albertans can be confident that photo radar will only be used to improve traffic and roadside worker safety and not to make money."

The next step for government is to review every existing photo radar site in the province over the next four months. As part of that review, those that are deemed ineffective, or outside of a school, playground, or construction zone, will be removed. This is expected to reduce the current 2,200 approved sites by 70 per cent, which would also better align the amount of photo radar with other provinces. Currently, there are about 70 per cent more photo radar sites used in 24 Alberta municipalities than the next highest province. Allowing these changes to be implemented over the next four months provides municipalities time to transition, update equipment and adjust contracts with vendors.

"I'm happy to see the province focusing photo radar on playground and construction zones. We need to prioritize safety where it matters most - protecting our children and workers on Calgary's roads. I'm proud to support this vital step toward safer communities."

"It is vital we maintain safety where it matters most—around our schools, playgrounds and construction zones. These are areas where enforcement can genuinely protect lives, not just generate revenue. With this new policy change, we'll see more officers back in neighbourhoods and that visibility will help tackle the growing issues of crime and disorder - a top priority for Edmontonians and Albertans."

Municipalities will be encouraged to use traffic-calming measures to improve traffic safety, including speed warning signs, speed tables (large flat speed bump), public education campaigns and other tools designed to improve traffic safety. The province will also help make roads safer by providing municipalities with support to reengineer roads and intersections that have been proven to be unsafe.

CYANOBACTERIA (BLUE-GREEN ALGAE) ADVISORIES LIFTED

Recent weather has cooled lake and reservoir water temperatures to such an extent that cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) is no longer a health concern, including in six water bodies in Edmonton Zone, which had previously been placed under cyanobacteria advisories.

Effective immediately, Alberta Health Services has lifted the cyanobacteria advisories for:

- Half Moon Lake
- Hastings Lake
- Isle Lake
- Jackfish Lake
- Wabamun Lake

Wizard Lake
Wabamun Lake Provincial Park Beach

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

KNOW WARNING SIGNS OF POTENTIAL SUICIDAL THOUGHTS, PLANS

World Suicide Prevention Day, and Alberta Health Services (AHS) reminds Albertans that recognizing the risk factors and potential signs of suicidal thoughts is important and can be helpful in preventing death by suicide.

In adults, warning signs of potential suicidal thoughts or plans include:

- Talking or writing about wanting to die or to hurt or kill themselves or someone else.
- Saying they feel hopeless, trapped, without purpose, in pain, or like they're a burden to others.

- Looking for ways to harm themselves. For example, they might buy a gun or stockpile medicines.
- Increasing their use of alcohol or drugs.
- Withdrawing from family, friends and activities.
- Seeming angry, grumpy, anxious or depressed.


- Eating or sleeping less or more than usual.

- Doing risky things, such as driving too fast.
- Giving away their belongings.

People can also be more at risk of suicide when they experience barriers accessing

Yellowhead County Municipal Election 2025

Thinking of running in the upcoming Municipal Election? Here are some things to consider:

Under the MGA, elected officials have the duty to:

- Participate in council meetings, committee meetings and meetings of other bodies you are appointed to by Council.
- Participate in developing and evaluating the policies and programs of the municipality.
- Consider the welfare and interests of the municipality as a whole.
- Bring to Council's attention anything that would promote the welfare or interests of the municipality.
- Obtain information about the operation or administration of the municipality from the Chief Administrative Officer
- Keep in confidence matters discussed in private at Council meetings until discussed at a public meeting.

Qualifications to run for Council include:

- Must be at least 18 years of age on nomination day.
- Must be a Canadian citizen.
- For position of Mayor, you must have been a resident of Yellowhead County for the six months preceding nomination day.
- For position of Councillor, you must have been a resident of the electoral division of Yellowhead County for which you intend to run for the six months preceding nomination day.



social and health services, mental illness, traumatic life events, family violence, discrimination or have a diagnosis of a serious physical illness. Talking about suicide is one of the most effective means of reducing stigma and supporting those in need.

Albertans are encouraged to use the REACH Pathway to help remember what you can do to support someone who is struggling:

- Recognize when someone is struggling.
- Engage in conversation and listen with empathy.
- Ask directly

about suicidal thoughts and feelings.

- Connect to support and resources.
- Heal yourself by taking care of your own mental health.

Together, we can help prevent suicide by showing understanding and compassion and by encouraging people experiencing

mental health challenges to reach out for support.


