and no evidence was found to substantiate the initial report.





- 51 uniformed officers equipped with carbine rifles (weapons for tactical operations);
- 10 support staff, including dispatchers and analysts;
- four drug patrol dogs, critical to ensure reasonable suspicion to search vehicles;
- 10 cold weather surveillance drones that can operate in high winds with dedicated pilots; and
- four narcotics analyzers to test for illicit drugs.

This team will patrol to detect and intercept illicit drugs, illegal firearms and unlawful attempts at illegal international border crossing.

Alberta's government will also create a two kilometre-deep critical border zone, deemed critical infrastructure, to enable the sheriffs to arrest individuals found attempting to cross the border illegally or attempting to traffic illegal drugs or weapons, without needing a warrant. This critical border zone will be created by amending regulations under the Critical Infrastructure Defence Act. This will not apply to people travelling legally along Alberta highways and roads.

"Alberta's government is ramping up border enforcement. We have long recognized the need for additional capacity to patrol Alberta's vulnerable international borders, where any amount of illegal activity is too much. I look forward to working with our partners in law enforcement and across government as we send a clear message to prospective offenders that criminal activity, such as fentanyl trafficking, will not be tolerated at our borders or anywhere else in our province."

PUTTING FAIRNESS FIRST: REFORMING PHOTO RADAR IN ALBERTA

Getson

For years, we have heard from Albertans who feel that photo radar is less about safety and more about collecting cash. Like many of you, I've seen it as a system designed to catch responsible drivers off guard rather than make our roads safer. That's why the Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors is taking action to ensure photo radar in Alberta is used fairly and responsibly.

Unfair tax for just driving to work to earn a living

We have heard you loud and clear that some of the "Honey Hole" spots out there for the photo radar sites are more like "old Rosco hunting after the Duke boys", than trying to penalize bad driving behaviours and improve safetv..

Alberta has the highest number of photo radar sites

Right now, Alberta has over 2,200 photo radar sitesthat's 70% more than the next highest province. Alberta's government will evaluate and conduct a thorough review of every site, assessing whether it truly improves safety. If a site doesn't clearly improve safety, it will be removed. We anticipate cutting the number of sites by 70%, bringing the total down to about 65, which would better align with other provinces.

How are we going to make it fair for you

Going forward, photo radar will be limited to places where it's truly needed, like playgrounds, school zones, and construction zones-areas where speeding puts lives at risk. If municipalities want to place photo radar outside these zones, they'll need to make a strong case and show

Submitted by MLA Shane that all other safety measures have failed. On top of this, The province will also help make roads safer by providing municipalities with support to re-engineer roads and intersections that have been proven to be unsafe.

Making responsible Albertan drivers navigate a minefield of secret cameras waiting to rob them of their hard-earned money directly contradicts everything we stand for as a government. That's why Alberta's United Conservatives are also eliminating "speed-on-green" traffic light radar. From now on, traffic light enforcement will focus solely on red-light runners, keeping safety the top priority.

Last, but not in the least: this is about fairness

Alberta's government is

putting an end to excessive photo radar enforcement that punishes minor mistakes without improving safety. Together, we're shifting the focus to what truly matters: protecting lives and making Alberta's roads safer for everyone.

WHITECOURT APPROVES 2025 INTERIM BUDGET

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the 2025 Interim Budget. The budget, totaling \$106,288,969, consists of a \$53,481,399 operating budget and a capital budget of \$52,807,570. The budget maintains service levels and funds important capital investments with a 3.77% tax rate increase.

"This budget is about preparing for the future," stated Whitecourt Mayor Tom Pickard. "It includes investments of over \$5.5 million in emergency preparedness and mitigation, and capital investments that will ensure residents needs continue to be met. This budget also includes services and initiatives that are part of the recently signed Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework with Woodlands County, which allows our communities to continue to build new partnerships and endeavors that

will benefit our economy and quality of life."

The 2025 Interim Budget Report can be viewed on the Whitecourt website at www.whitecourt.ca/yourtown.

2025 Capital Budget Highlights:

- The Culture & Events Centre is the biggest capital investment for 2025, and is scheduled to be complete in late 2026.
- A Community Fireguard, approximately 4.5 kilometres long and 100 metres wide, will be constructed on the eastern boundary of Whitecourt.
- Phase One Flood Protection mitigation projects will be completed to protect the Town's water and wastewater infrastructure in the event of a flood.
- Phase 3 of the Centennial Park Pathway Improvement Project will be completed.

2025 Operating Budget Highlights:

• Continue to develop

youth-focused programming, including the Doors Open Program and Teen Week.


- Continuation of the social prescribing services for seniors in the region, with support from the United Way and Health Aging Alberta. This program helps connect seniors with non-medical programs and services in the community to enhance their quality of life.
- The Transportation Master Plan will be completed, and will include an evaluation of the 55 Avenue and Dahl Drive/Mink Creek Road intersection. - A general municipal election will be held in October

- The Wastewater Treatment Plant Study will be completed to provide options to consider to support community growth.
- A comprehensive market analysis of the local business environment attraction and a strategy for retention will be completed.

The 2025 Budget will be finalized in the spring of 2025 once the Provincial budget is adopted, and final assessment figures are established. Specific tax rate impacts will vary by property type depending on the assessed value of a home or business, and will be determined once the fi nal budget is adopted.






