currency to the police. The Bank of Canada has the following advice for dealing with counterfeit currency:

•Politely refuse the note and explain that you suspect that it may be counterfeit. •Ask for another note (and check it too).

•Advise the person to check the note with the local police.

•Inform your local police of a possible attempt to pass suspected counterfeit money.

•Be courteous. Remember that the person in possession

of the bill could be an innocent victim who does not realize that the note is suspicious.

Additionally, a dog was located on the property with injuries to its legs.

RCMP charged Brazeau County resident 64-yearold James Allan Kurz with: •Assault on a Peace offi-

cer;

•Obstruction/Resist arrest (x2);

•Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose;

•Cruelty to animals;

•Disobeying a court order. Kurz was initially taken before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody for his next court appearance. He has since been released and his next court appearance is set for Jan. 7, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley.

The Nomination period runs January 1, 2025, through to Nomination Day, which takes place September 22, 2025, from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Prior to Nomination Day, you must book an appointment with the Returning Officer to submit your completed nomination form. Nomination Papers can be submitted earlier to the Returning Officer by appointment. A \$100 deposit must be provided to the Returning Officer with your Nomination Paper.

The appropriate Nomination Paper and Candidate's Acceptance form must be signed by at least five (5) eligible electors. The Returning Officer is required to refuse a Nomination Paper that has been signed by fewer than five electors as per the Local Authorities Election Act. •In September, Alberta's government announced a generational commitment of \$8.6 billion to build schools now. This investment will award up to 90 new schools and up to 24 modernizations or replacements over the next three years.

oln addition, a new in-budget approval process has been introduced for school construction that will accelerate project progression through development stages, reducing project timelines by as much as six months.

•In 2024, 10 schools were built across the province, creating space for more than 9,600 students in nine communities, including:

oBlackfalds, Calgary, Coaldale, Edmonton, Fort Vermillion, Grande Prairie, Langdon, Leduc and Wabasca-Desmarais.

•Entering the new year, another 82 school projects are underway, progressing through various stages of planning, design and construction.

Health Facilities

•As announced in Budget 2024, a modern, standalone Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton remains a key priority with \$20 million budgeted over the next three years for early planning.

•Redevelopment of Calgary's Rockyview General Hospital Intensive Care Unit, Coronary Care Unit and Gastrointestinal Clinic were completed in 2024.

•Renovations of operating rooms and support areas in Rocky Mountain House through the Alberta Surgical Initiative (ASI) wrapped up this past spring. oThrough the ASI, 31 projects are

oThrough the ASI, 31 projects are underway in planning, design or construction in Brooks, Calgary, Edmonton, Innisfail, Lethbridge and Olds.

•Another 53 health projects are underway going into 2025.


oThis includes awarding the construction manager contract for the Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre (RDRHC) this past summer and making progress on the new patient tower and redevelopment.

The procurement process for the RDRHC Ambulatory building is ongoing, with contractor selection expected in spring 2025 and groundbreaking in summer 2025. Government Facilities

•The Lakeview Recovery Community in Gunn completed construction and was handed over to Mental Health and Addiction

for operations.

oConstruction of the Calgary Recovery Community is anticipated to be complete in early 2025.

•The new \$203-million Red Deer Justice Centre completed construction and will provide the community with 12 courtrooms when it officially opens in the first quarter of 2025.

·Another 20 new government facility projects are underway, such as recovery community facilities in Grande Prairie and Edmonton, and campus upgrades to the Yellowhead Youth Centre.

Capital Maintenance and Renewal

•Work done through Capital Maintenance and Renewal (CMR) helps upgrade existing government facilities and assets. In 2024, work finished on 85 CMR projects, including construction of the new reflecting pool and fountain at the Alberta legislature grounds in time for Canada Day celebrations.

•Another 212 CMR projects are underway at government facilities going into the new year, with an additional 516 specifically at health facilities.

Public-Private Partnership (P3) Awards

•In May, Alberta's government completed construction of five high schools in Blackfalds, Langdon, Leduc and two in Edmonton.

All finished on schedule, on budget and ready for the 2024-25 school vear.

oThis bundle received a Silver Award for Design & Construction at the 2024 National Awards for Innovation and Excellence in P3s.

·Procurement is underway to deliver another bundle of new Alberta schools in Airdrie, Blackfalds, Calgary, Chestermere, Edmonton and Okotoks.

•The Evan-Thomas Water and Wastewater Treatment Plant in Kananaskis won Best Operational Project at the P3 Partnerships Bulletin awards.

Legislation

•In May 2024, Infrastructure's Real Property Governance Act received roval assent. The act helps increase transparency and reduce red tape by creating consistent rules across government for the disposal of property and creates a centralized inventory of public lands and buildings to help government better manage these assets for Albertans.

·In November 2024, Alberta's government introduced amendments to the Public Works Act (PWA) that mandate payment timelines and invoicing provisions for public infrastructure work, helping ensure contractors and subcontractors are paid fairly and promptly.

PUTTING FAIRNESS FIRST: REFORMING PHOTO RADAR IN ALBERTA

For years, we have heard from Albertans who feel that photo radar is less about safety and more about collecting cash. Like many of you, I've seen it as a system designed to catch responsible drivers off guard rather than make our roads safer. That's why the Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors is taking action to ensure photo radar in Alberta is used fairly and responsibly.

Unfair tax for just driving to work to earn a living

We have heard you loud and clear that some of the "Honey

Hole" spots out there for the photo radar sites are more like "old Rosco hunting after the Duke boys", than trying to penalize bad driving behaviours and improve safety..

Alberta has the highest number of photo radar sites

Right now, Alberta has over 2,200 photo radar sites-that's 70% more than the next highest province. Alberta's government will evaluate and conduct a thorough review of every site, assessing whether it truly improves safety. If a site doesn't clearly improve safety, it will be removed. We anticipate cutting the number of sites by 70%,

bringing the total down to about 65, which would better align with other provinces.

How are we going to make it fair for you

Going forward, photo radar will be limited to places where it's truly needed, like playgrounds, school zones, and construction zones-areas where speeding puts lives at

risk. If municipalities want to place photo radar outside these zones, they'll need to make a strong case and show that all other safety measures have failed. On top of this, The province will also help make roads safer by providing municipalities with support to re-engineer roads and intersections that have been proven to be unsafe.

Making responsible Albertan drivers navigate a minefield of secret cameras waiting to rob them of their hard-earned money directly contradicts everything we stand for as a government. That's why Alberta's United Conservatives are also eliminating "speed-on-green" traffic light radar. From now on, traffic light enforcement will focus solely on red-light runners, keeping safety the top priority.

Last, but not in the least: this is about fairness

Alberta's government is putting an end to excessive photo radar enforcement that punishes minor mistakes without improving safety. Together, we're shifting the focus to what truly matters: protecting lives and making Alberta's roads safer for everyone.

TIPPLE PARK MUSEUM JANUARY UPDATE AND HISTORY TIDBITS

When I first started working at the museum last year, it struck me both how vital the Pembina Mine was to the early development of Evansburg, but also how few objects we have at the museum from its operation. We're not completely certain why this happened, but we have a theory.

The company that owned the

Pembina Mine from 1934-1936. when the mine closed, was the Royalties Oil and Share Corp. Ltd. Around the same time that they were closing the Pembina Mine, this company was opening another mine at Nacmine in the Drumheller Valley. According to Foley Trail, many of the miners from Evansburg moved to Nacmine to continue working for the company.


I was also doing some research in the Provincial Archive recently

when I came across a telegraph from March 31, 1936 that may shed some light. This was a correspondence between A. A. Millar, Chief Inspector of Mines for the province, and Jeffrey Manufacturing Co., a manufacturer of coal mining equipment. Millar stated that the Pembina Mine operators wished to, and came across a telegraph from March 31, 1936 requesting advice for the transfer of two battery locomotives used in Evansburg to

another mine. Which mine would be receiving the locomotives is not stated, though it was another mine that had been using safety lamps as a way to test for air quality.

We may no longer have these tools and machines in our community, but it is interesting to think about how much of the equipment went on to have another life at a different mine.




