# CHECK THE BOX, SAVE A LIFE

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Starting next year, Alberta's T1 tax form will include a check box so Albertans can request information on the importance of organ and tissue donation.

Hundreds of Albertans are waiting for life-saving organ or tissue transplants. By making it easier to learn more about donation, Alberta's government is helping raise awareness and potentially increasing the number of registered donors across the province.

Starting with the 2025 tax

year, Alberta's T1 tax form will include a check box that allows Albertans to ask for more information about organ and tissue donation. Those who check the box will receive an email from the provincial government with details about how donation works in Alberta and how to register their wishes.

"This simple step can help save lives. The more Albertans who register, the more patients and families can hold on to hope for a second chance. We hope this change encourages more Albertans to start the conversation and register their wishes."

This initiative builds on Bill C-210, introduced by former Alberta MLA and member of Parliament Len Webber. The bill, which received royal assent in June 2021, allows provinces to add a donation information check box to federal tax forms. Alberta is following the lead of British Columbia and Ontario. Ontario has seen a 32 per cent increase in registrations since adding the check box.

In addition, organ and tissue donation programming

will now fall under Acute Care Alberta, ensuring provincewide coordination and enhancing the efficiency of the donation and transplant system.

Alberta's government is committed to raising awareness about organ and tissue donation. Albertans can learn more about organ and tissue donation, and register their wishes on the Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Registry at GiveLifeAlberta.ca.



"I called Candice to tell her, and she didn't believe me, so I had to Facetime her to show her the ticket!" he continued.


MacKay and MacDonald are very excited about all the ways they could possibly spend the win and are already making plans.

Welcome moisture has been received across all areas of the County in recent days; with moderate temperatures and more scattered showers expected.

Fine fuel moisture has increased due to green up conditions. This reduces hazard in our area in light grassy fuels and mixed treed fuels.

As a result of these changes, the Complete Fire Ban status has now been reduced to a FIRE ADVISORY,

Allowed conditional burning in accordance with monitoring and weather conditions permitting is as follows:

- Fire(s) in acceptable fire pits
- Campfires on a non-combustible surface surrounded by a fire ring
- Permitted short-duration open burning with inspection by a Fire Guardian
- Burn barrels where permitted, please see the County's Fire Services Bylaw 29-2020
- · Wood-fired appliances, incinerators
- · Propane powered appliances and pellet smokers
- · Smudge and or ceremonial fires

# Prohibited burning includes:

- Large pile (greater than 16' in diameter), multiple piles, or windrow burning activities
- · Fireworks
- Any burning activity not defined as allowed

Mid-year starts are permitted. Children must be fully potty-trained. Parent Helper Days may be required.

The Province of Alberta currently provides Lac Ste. Anne County funding via the Affordability Grant which fully covers the cost of this program. If the Affordability Grant were to cease, parents/guardians would be provide the option to continue in the program and be invoiced for any outstanding fees on a pro-rated basis.

- Exterior wall systems and glazing, slabs, and interior wall framing are scheduled to be complete by the end of 2025.



# SUPPORTING ALBERTA'S WILDFIRE EVACUEES

Alberta's government provides emergency evacuation payments to assist those who have been forced from their homes for an extended period of time.

Emergency evacuations due to the threat of a wildfire or other natural disaster can cause incredible emotional and financial stress for those affected. To help ease the costs of evacuating and provide some peace of mind, Alberta's government provides emergency evacuation payments to assist those who have been forced from their homes for an extended period of time.

Our government is here to support Albertans every step of the way – helping cover urgent costs and providing reassurance during an incredibly stressful time. We're committed to ensuring families have the help they need, when they need it most."

Each adult resident of an affected community who has been evacuated for seven days or more is eligible to receive a one-time payment of \$1,250 and \$500 for each dependent child under the age of 18. These evacuation payments help pay for temporary accommodations, food and other necessities while evacuees are away from their homes. Most insurance policies will also provide coverage for additional living expenses if the insured are forced to leave due to a disaster.

"Whether flood or fire, evacuations due to natural disasters can be incredibly stressful. As always, our government is working hard to ensure help is there for those who need it and do everything we can to support Albertans through this wildfire season."

Evacuees can apply for the payments online and will have

up to 60 days to apply following the start of an evacuation order for their respective community. Payments will be made by e-transfer within 24 hours of application, which is the fastest and most efficient way to receive these payments. Evacuees unable to apply online or receive e-transfer can call the Alberta Supports Contact Centre at 1-877-644-9992 for assistance and to make alternate payment arrangements.

"In the face of floods and fires, Alberta's government remains committed to providing essential support and resources to protect and assist Albertans during this wildfire season, ensuring that help is always within reach for those affected."




