#### Notice of Public Hearing – Bylaw 05-2025 Summer Village of Seba Beach Land Use Bylaw

Pursuant to Sections 216.1(1), 606(1), and 692(1) of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, as amended, the Council of the Summer Village of Jarvis Bay hereby gives notice of its intention to consider Bylaw No. 05-2025, a bylaw to repeal and replace the Summer Village's current Land Use Bylaw (Bylaw 2-2008, as amended).

The purpose of this Bylaw is to update and modernize regulations in the Summer Village's Land Use Bylaw to be consistent with:

- · Provincial legislation (specifically with respect to development and subdivision processes and appeals); and
- Approved statutory plans (including the Summer Village's Intermunicipal Development Plan and Municipal Development Plan).

Many differences exist between the current and draft Land Use Bylaw, which may affect some individuals. These include (but are not limited to):

- Updated information about the development permit application and notification processes;
- Updated information about the subdivision process;
- Updated regulations for development and subdivision appeals;
- Updated regulations describing the enforcement process;
- The inclusion of additional and revised definitions to address common terms and land uses;
- Updated regulations affecting major site grading/landscaping;
- Updates regulations affecting development within hazardous or environmentally sensitive areas;
- Updated regulations affecting specific land uses in the Summer Village.

A copy of the proposed bylaw is available on the Summer Village's website and may be viewed by contacting the Summer Village of Seba Beach using the information provided at the bottom of this notice.

Section 692(1) of the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c M-26, requires that a public hearing on a proposed bylaw must be held before the second reading of the bylaw. First reading of Bylaw 05-2025 occurred on May 5, 2025.

## YCE MULTIPLEX GROUNDBREAKING

Groundbreaking Ceremony Construction has begun with on-site preparation and foundational work for the new recreational space on the current site of the Edson & District Leisure Centre. Edson, Alberta, May 21, 2025 - While site preparation started in April, May 21st marks the official groundbreaking of the highly anticipated YCE Multiplex Project, a joint venture between the Town of Edson and Yellowhead County. A special groundbreaking ceremony was held at the project site, attended by residents, the construction team, and representatives from the Provincial Government, Town of Edson, and Yellowhead County. "Edson Town Council is very excited to see the progress being made on the site," said Edson Mayor Kevin Zahara. "This has been a long time coming and we're very happy to see it starting to take shape. This investment in our facility means more recreational opportunities for residents and will go a long way in helping to attract people to our region. We thank Yellowhead County for being at the table as an equal partner in this regional facility." Phase 1 of construction is expected to continue until July 2025 and includes clearing and grading the site, commencing the Aquatics and Lobby foundation, as well as setting up temporary access and parking. Phase 2 will see the remainder of Aquatics construction, including lane and leisure swimming, as well as a new arena and gymnasium, which features an elevated walking track, scheduled for completion in 2027.

The remaining phase will include demolition of the existing pool and completion of the new, renovations to Centennial Arena, and conversion of Memorial into a curling facility. The full project is expected to be completed near the end of 2027. "This groundbreaking is an important milestone in the completion of the new YCE Multiplex," said Yellowhead County

Mayor Wade Williams. "We're very proud of our work together with the Town of Edson in the development of this facility. The facility's new amenities and upgrades will benefit our region's residents and highlights our commitment to working with our regional partners towards our community's continued growth and development." Now that construction is underway, users should be mindful of parking changes and building access. A new temporary access is under construction through the

pool area to accommodate work on the new ice arena, which will be located on the west side of the facility.

This modern, regional facility will provide expanded recreational space and enhance the quality of life for Town and County residents. It is also expected to become a central hub for community gatherings, sports activities, cultural events, and more.

## DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP RESPONDS TO TWO-VEHICLE COLLISION

approximately At 5:15 a.m. on May 20, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP responded to a complaint of a two-vehicle collision on Hwy 22 on the South side of Drayton Valley. The vehicles had been travelling Eastbound when they collided and one rolled over into the Westbound ditch. The driver of the vehicle in the ditch was extracted by Drayton Valley Fire Services and transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening

injuries. Investigation revealed that the collision was due to a "road rage" incident, resulting in the arrest of the driver of the other vehicle. No other individuals were involved in the incident. The highway was partially closed, resulting in slow moving traffic, while RCMP collision analysts attended and conducted their investigation.

As a result of the investigation, Kevin Hornle (55), a resident of Drayton Valley, was charged with Dangerous operation causing bodily harm and Aggravated assault. He was brought before a justice of the peace and released on conditions. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on June 17, 2025.

"We would like to thank the public for their cooperation while we conducted our investigation" said Sgt Dan Ferri, Operations NCO for the Drayton Valley RCMP. "This is a good time to remind the public to be courteous on the road and always drive safely."
