
Wildwood students have been very busy this year with a number of engaging and fun learning activities with community members.



### **DEAR EDITOR**

Our Premier must believe she is omniscient and omnipotent, that she must tell the Prime Minister what to do for her province on her behalf.

To "reset the relationship," she insists that Mr Carney must address nine ultimata. Apparently she sees her position as above that of a Prime Minister; she does not seem to see such a need for herself in "resetting the relationship." Furthermore, she seems not to know that we have over three hundred federal elected officials to convince, not just the one at the top who takes the blame for what they legislate.

Let us examine the nine.

One; Mr Carney is to guarantee unfettered oil and gas routes. This would, of course, ignore other jurisdictions and their other priorities, including authority over their lands. And "unfettered"

means a free rein wherever applied, which would be ridiculous. Perhaps there should first be a better royalty return on current productions, which might actually pay for programs and allow growth in the Heritage Fund.

Two: He is to repeal Bill C-69, which UCP calls the "no new pipelines" act. Let us keep to reality. It actually deals with reducing or limiting harmful effects on environment, health, social and economic factors, and encouraging sustainability.

Three: He is to remove the tanker ban off the B.C. coast. Shouldn't British Columbia have some say in that? Also, are there no environmental concerns?

Four: He is to eliminate the emissions cap on oil and gas, because UCP sees that instead as a production cap, despite the Pathways Alliance and other fossil fuel companies recognizing the need for reducing emissions and working to sequester them. Perhaps using hydrogen (stripped from hydrocarbons instead of burning them) is also not OK.

Five: Mr Carney is to scrap the "Clean Electricity Regulations." What could be wrong with clean energy? One argument for this is to stabilize the electrical grid, but Alberta is woefully behind others in recognizing that there is always wind blowing in many parts of Alberta, and only the enforced provincial delays and restrictions prevent us from exploiting this free source of energy (among others) to stabilize the grid.

Six: The prohibition on single-use plastics must end. Obviously Ms Smith does not like paper bags or reusable straws. What is the argument, if any, for preventing development of plastics replacements? Perhaps single-use plastics need to end. Seven: Canada must aban-

don the net-zero vehicle

possible rather than saving them for multiple uses by future generations.

Eight: Oversight of the carbon tax is to be returned to the provinces. This is a silly one, since the tax began in Alberta and was later turned over to the federal govern-

ment for management. Why

would we want it back? Nine: Federal censorship of energy companies must end. What censorship is that? No Canadian government has tried to prevent production. It probably doesn't have to do with the federal government (generously interfering by) building a 35 billion dollar pipeline to the coast for Alberta to use (no other province received such help)? Or the generous federal offer to help clean up the problem of old, dead wells,



## FOREST TENT CATERPILLARS

Forest Tent Caterpillars have been spotted throughout the province this spring. While Yellowhead County has not seen as many as other locations, the insects are present in our area.







### What to Know:

- Populations peak approximately every 10 years, with outbreaks lasting from 2 to 5 years.
- They are easily identified by the blue stripes running down the length of the body, and a row of white, key-shaped markings down the back.
- They often appear in large clusters and feed on host trees.
   Once a cluster has completely defoliated a tree, they will move together to a new location.
- While healthy trees usually survive an infestation, you may wish to remove them. To do so, you can scrape the caterpillars off the host tree, or use a strong jet of water to blast them off.


