EVANSBURG RCMP LOCATES AND ARRESTS 4 SUSPECTS BREAKING INTO OIL LEASE SITES

On July 6, 2025, Evansburg RCMP received a call from Inplay Oil field Security that several people were attempting to break into one of their sites. Evansburg RCMP responded and located several individuals who were in the process of committing several criminal offences and, in doing so, failing to comply with current release orders.

As a result of the investigation, these 4 individuals were arrested: •Ryan Piche (40) and Grant Boivin (44), both residents of Edmonton, were charged with: oBreak and enter to commit theft over \$5000;

oMischief over \$5000; and oFail to comply with release orders (x2).

•Erica Bedell (38), a resident of Edmonton, was charged with:

oBreak and enter to commit theft over \$5000;

oMischief over \$5000;

oFail to comply with Release Order.

•Robin Tizzard (38), a resident of Bonnyville, Alta., was charged with Break and enter to commit theft over \$5000

and Mischief over \$5000.

All parties were brought before a justice of the peace with Piche, Boivin and Bedell being remanded into custody, to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg on July 8, 2025, while Tizzard was released on conditions, to appear before the same court on July 28, 2025.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY'S KIDS CAN CATCH 2025

Yellowhead County, AB (July 9, 2025) - Yellowhead County hosted our eighth annual Kids Can Catch event on July 3 at Millers Lake. Kids Can Catch invites families to enjoy a great evening that introduces new anglers to the sport of fishing, as well as brings those with fishing experience out for an evening of family fun.

"I love seeing all the families come out and spend time together, either trying something



new, or participating in an activity that they already enjoy as a family," said Jina Materi, Yellowhead County's Recreation Coordinator and organizer for the event.

"We had a great turnout this year, considering it had been storming all day," added Materi. "The weather cleared up and the sun came out just in time for the event!" Approximately 100 people attended throughout the evening.

Millers Lake was selected as the location for Kids Can Catch in 2018, as it's a "beautiful stocked (trout) lake that has lots of area for people to spread out and fish, either from the large dock or along the shoreline," Materi said. Four fish were caught during this year's event. Kids without rods or fishing experience were still able to take part, with pre-prepared rods to use during the event and free bait. There were also several volunteers on hand ready to share their own knowledge and experience.

"We are lucky to have so many great community partners for this event," said Materi. "Including the Alberta Conservation Association (ACA), Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) staff, Fish & Wildlife officers, Alberta Wildfire, and The Edson Fish and Game Association members."

A free BBQ and snacks were enjoyed by all, and there were several giveaways for participants. Prizes provided by ACA included key chain floats, bobbers, stickers and colouring



books, as well as water bottles and drawstring bags. AIS staff handed out stickers and sunglasses, and Alberta Wildfire firefighters also handed out stickers to the young anglers.

A fishing rod raffle was also held. "We provide free rods to use during the event, and then raffled 15 of them off, as well as two tackle boxes," said Materi. "The kids who won were thrilled to leave with a prize!"

"2025 Kids Can Catch was a great time thanks to all involved. Everyone seemed excited to be out fishing and having a summer BBQ," Materi said. "We would like to thank all the participants who came out to enjoy the evening, as well as all of the community partners and Alberta Conservation Association for their continued support of our event."

ALBERTA RCMP SERIOUS CRIMES BRANCH CONDUCTS ARREST IN HUMAN TRAFFICKING INVESTIGATION

In the summer of 2024, Alberta RCMP and Alberta Employment Standards Office received a report of possible human trafficking at a motel in Fox Creek, Alta., and a gas station in Calmar, Alta. The complaint made its way to the Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch who engaged partner agencies such as: Alberta Employment Standards Office, Occupational Health and Safety, Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA), Alberta Occupational Health and Safety, ALERT CFSEU Money Laundering Asset Forfeiture Team (MLAFT), FINTRAC, and Service Canada. Furthermore, ACT (Action, Coalition on Human Trafficking) Alberta is assisting with the survivors of this investigation.

The investigation uncovered multiple illegal business practises involving several immigrant workers. These practices included, but were not limited to:

•Forcing employees to work 80 to 90 hour weeks without proper compensation;

•Submitting falsified work schedules;

•Exploitative payment practices;

•Overcharging rent and expenses;

•Improper Labour Market Impact Assessment practices; and

•Harassment.

On June 25, 2025, the Alberta RCMP, assisted by CBSA, executed search warrants at two Edmonton residences seizing cash, bank records, business records and immigration agreements, amongst other offence-related materials.

As a result of the investigation, two individuals were arrested:

•Yeon Soo Lee, a 55-yearold Edmonton resident, was charged with:

oTrafficking in Persons (x4); oMaterial Benefits from trafficking (x4);

oCriminal Harassment.

•Joo Hyup Lee, a 26-yearold Edmonton resident, was charged with:

oTrafficking in Persons; and oMaterial Benefits from trafficking.

•Both individuals have since been released and are set to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Grande Prairie on Aug. 11, 2025.

The investigation is ongoing, with allegations of money laundering still being investigated and authorities actively pursuing all related offences. Investigators are committed to thoroughly uncovering the full scope of the operation and ensuring that all individuals involved are held accountable and that supports are provided for the survivors.

"Human Trafficking is the act of recruiting, transporting, holding individuals by means of force, fraud or coercion for the purpose of sexual or labour exploitation." said Inspector Breanne Brown of the Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch. "In this case. the RCMP determined that the suspects took action to harbour and recruit foreign workers by using threats, abuse of power, fraud and deception, all for the purpose of exploiting the labour of these workers. The Alberta RCMP takes these offences seriously and ask the public to keep an eye out for these individuals who, by the nature of their status and situation, are vulnerable to their oppressors. Those who may have information about Human Trafficking (including sex or labour) are asked to please contact their local police of iurisdiction."

"The Employment Standards branch of Alberta Jobs,

Economy, Trade and Immigration investigated multiple businesses owned and operated by Yeon Soo Lee and Joo Hyup Lee for allegations of human trafficking, exploitation of vulnerable workers and violations of the Employment Standards Code" said a message from Employment Standards branch, who often work alongside RCMP in these investigations. "As a result of the investigation, the matter was referred to the RCMP. Employment Standards recovered more than \$160,000 in unpaid earnings for employees and for unauthorized deductions from those earnings. The ministry's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) branch also conducted inspections of these businesses related to compliance with OHS laws. The inspections and follow-up inspections resulted in a \$60,000 administrative penalty issued to the involved businesses for repeated non-compliance with OHS requirements. A \$10,000 administrative penalty was issued to Yeon Soo Lee for hindering and interfering with an OHS officer".

The Alberta RCMP would also like to take the opportunity to acknowledge the creation of the K Division Human Trafficking Unit in 2023 with the establishment of the Provincial Coordinator role along with the two Special Projects Units in 2024.

Temporary foreign workers or persons on visitor visa's make vulnerable targets for labour trafficking as they are often desperate and looking for opportunities to leave their home country. These persons are often recruited through on-line portals, through immigration companies or word of mouth promising them the opportunity for permanent residency or citizenship in Canada. They are recruited, transported, and harboured by bad employers who hold their identification, control their finances and movements through means of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of forced labour or domestic servitude. When employees complain or try to express concerns, they are often met with threats of penalties or deportation, which keep them from coming forward to police.

These investigations are often done in coordination with the Alberta Employment Standards Office, who wanted to share this message:

The Employment Standards branch of Alberta Jobs, Economy, Trade and Immigration investigated multiple businesses owned and operated by Yeon Soo Lee and Joo Hyup Lee for allegations of human trafficking, exploitation of vulnerable workers and violations of the Employment Standards Code. As a result of the investigation, the matter was referred to the RCMP.

Employment Standards recovered more than \$160,000 in unpaid earnings for employees and for unauthorized deductions from those earnings.

The ministry's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) branch also conducted inspections of these businesses related to compliance with OHS laws. The inspections and follow-up inspections resulted in a \$60,000 administrative penalty issued to 682175 Alberta Ltd., operating as Grizzly Motor Hotel, for repeated non-compliance with OHS requirements. A \$10,000 administrative penalty was issued to Yeon Soo Lee for hindering and interfering with an OHS officer.
