

NEW STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL LIBRARIES

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government has introduced new standards to ensure school library materials are age-appropriate.

School libraries should be safe and supportive places where students can learn and explore without being exposed to inappropriate sexual content. However, in the absence of a consistent standard for selecting age-appropriate library materials, school boards have taken different approaches, leading to concerns about safeguards in place.

In response to these concerns, and informed by feedback from education partners and the public, Alberta's government has created standards to provide school boards with clear direction on the selection, availability and access to school library materials, such as books.

"Our actions to ensure that materials in school libraries don't expose children to sexual content were never about banning books. These new standards are to ensure that school boards have clear guidance to ensure age-appropriate access to school library materials, while reflecting the values and priorities of Albertans."

The new standards set clear expectations for school library materials with regard to sexual content and require school boards to implement policies to support these standards.

Standards for school library materials

Under the new standards, school libraries are not permitted to include library materials containing explicit sexual content. Non-explicit sexual content may be accessible to students in Grade 10 and above, provided it is age-appropriate.

"Protecting kids from explicit content is common sense. LGBTQ youth, like all children, deserve to see themselves in stories that are age-appropriate, supportive and affirming – not in material that sexualizes or con-

fuses them.

School boards must also regularly review their school library collections, publish a full list of available materials and ensure that a staff member supervises students' access to school library materials. School boards will have to remove any materials with explicit sexual content from their school libraries by October

School board policies and procedures

All school boards must have publicly available policies that align with the new standards for selecting and managing library materials by January 1, 2026. School boards can either create new policies or update existing ones to meet these requirements.

These policies must outline how school library materials are selected and reviewed, how staff supervise students' access throughout the school day, and how a student, parent, school board employee or other member of the school community can request a review or removal of materials in the school library. School boards are also required to clearly communicate these policies to employees, students and parents before January 2026.

"A robust, grade- and age-appropriate library catalogue is vital for student success. We welcome the ministry's initiative to establish consistent standards and appreciate the ongoing consultation to help craft a plan that will serve our families and communities well."





KINDRED SPIRITS: CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF THE EVANSBURG CEMETERY YELLOWHEAD COUNTY, AB

On July 12, 2025, the Yellowhead County Heritage Program commemorated the 100th anniversary of the Evansburg Cemetery. The event, called Kindred Spirits, invited visitors to stop by and take a self-guided tour of the cemetery, enjoy some beautiful views, buy flowers to place on loved ones' graves, and more.

The self-guided tour led people to new features of the cemetery including the look-out, walking trail, and the wind phone, which is a phone "connected only to the wind."

Visitors were also asked to 'name the trail' that featured information panels on overcoming grief, which were created in partnership with Yellowhead County FCSS.

The self-guided tour also involved informative stops by historic gravesites, such as Charlotte Arnup who died on February 5, 1925, although the exact date of her burial is un-

known. The next burial after Charlotte's was Aldina Harke in the fall of 1926. Aldina is the first record in the cemetery register.

"Each cemetery in the municipality has a unique history," said Madison Sharman, Yellowhead County's Heritage Coordinator. "The Evansburg Cemetery is the only one that was a subdivision before it became a burial ground." That subdivision, called Arnupville, was started by Charlotte Arnup's brother and is now entirely taken up by the cemetery.

Another interactive aspect of the event asked visitors to count butterflies that were hidden throughout the trail for a chance to win a prize pack. Staff and volunteer were on site to answer any cemetery questions, and a board showcased recent cemetery upgrades and provided a place for visitors to share their thoughts.

One of the board's prompts asked, "What are your best words of wisdom to live a happy life?" Visitors shared advice

such as "Don't sweat the small stuff," "Stop and smell the roses," and "Go fishing." The question "What advice do you have for someone experiencing grief?" inspired answers such as "Remember them in their good light," and "It gets better over time. Time heals."

Throughout the day, approximately 100 people came to the cemetery to celebrate the anniversary and participate in the activities. "I'm so happy with the turnout. Everyone was so happy and lovely," said Sharman. "This was definitely a highlight for me since working at the County."

Guests enjoyed the event and seeing the beautifully-maintained cemetery. Visitor Joan Melvin said, "A great big shoutout to Yellowhead County for the heartwarming and informative event to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Evansburg Cemetery! The new lookout, walking path, wind phone, and restoring of the headstones have made it a most welcoming place to come

visit loved ones who are no longer with us! The Melvin and McGowan families are very appreciative!"

"By far, the best part of the day was seeing people reconnecting at the cemetery," Sharman said. "Giving each other hugs, talking about loved ones, and celebrating all the life the cemetery represents."

Kindred Spirits was possible thanks to the collaborative efforts of several departments across Yellowhead County, including Parks and Recreation, Transportation, Agricultural Services, FCSS, and Corporate Services.

The self-guided tour is available by QR code which will soon be posted at the cemetery, and can also be found at www. yhcounty.ca. The Tipple Park Museum is also currently featuring an exhibit called A Century of Rest, which highlights the history of the cemetery and is available for viewing until August 31.

LAKEMERE 4-H BEEF CLUB CELEBRATES 75 YEARS OF "LEARNING TO DO BY DOING"

Founded in 1939, the Lakemere 4-H Beef Club is proud to be one of the oldest continuously operating 4-H clubs in Alberta. Since 4-H Alberta's beginnings in 1917, Lakemere has played a key role in developing rural youth through agriculture, leadership, and hands-on learning for over seven generations.

Today, Lakemere continues to thrive with a wide variety of project offerings. These include all beef projects, veterinary sciences, poultry, woodworking, fibre arts, and Cleavers (for members ages 6–8). The club's calendar is filled with activities focused on community engagement and "learning to do by doing"—the heart of the 4-H motto.

To mark this incredible milestone, the Lakemere 4-H Beef Club invites past and present members, families, and community supporters to join a 75th anniversary celebration, taking place September 5–7, 2025, at the historic Muir Lake Community Hall. Over the course of the weekend, guests can look forward to shared memories, honoured achievements, and new connections. Highlights include onsite camping, brunch, speakers, banquet, catered dinner, silent auction, and dance. The cost is \$35/person, and children 5 and under are free. History of Lakemere 4-H Beef

The Lakemere 4-H Beef Club has been an important part of the Stony Plain and Onoway communities for the past 75 years.

Stony Plain today is an extension of Edmonton, but in 1950, Stony Plain was "in the sticks." North of town, many roads were little more than dirt trails. It was in this environment that a local farmer, Ben Huedepohl, felt there was a need to improve the quality of the beef cattle being raised in the area. In order to achieve this. Ben and his neighbor Jake Freitag set out to recruit some local young people. Eventually, they found enough interest to get started, and the Lakemere 4-H Beef Club was launched in 1939

The area stretched from Spruce Grove to Onoway. Ben and Jake often drove the route, picking up the members to take them to club activities. In good weather, this was simply a matter of putting on a lot of miles. This practice of leaders providing bus services lasted for quite a few years. The club took its name from the school district in which several members and the Huedepohl family lived. Meetings were held in the Lakemere school. Since the club membership continued to come from a rather wide area, the location of meetings was changed, and meetings alternated between the Muir Lake and Heatherdown halls. Members' homes were also favoured meeting places off and on over the years, but the Muir Lake Community Hall has become the recognized headquarters for the club.

While the quality of the local cattle was one reason for starting the club, it is evident that Mr. Huedepohl's emphasis was also aimed at the improvement of the young people themselves. The first club trophy that he presented wasn't for the best calf but to the 4-Her who showed the most dedication, commitment, and proficiency in fulfilling the complete 4-H philosophy. After Mr. Huedepohl's untimely death in 1954, his family continued to present the efficiency award in his memory.

Achievement Day in the early years was a two-day event. The calves were first shown in Stony Plain (along with the Spruce Grove and White Rose clubs) at the rodeo grounds or in the skating rink in early July. Following the individual club and interclub

shows, the cattle were trucked to Edmonton. The next day, the club champions took part in the Edmonton region championships in the market steer class as well as in showmanship. For many 4-H members, a trip to Edmonton was a rare occurrence, and thus, achievement day was a highlight of the year. After Stony Plain built an ice arena as a centennial project in 1967, it was decided that it would make it a lot easier on the parents if achievement day could be cut back to a single day (especially during haying season). This was accomplished by holding a sale following the club and interclub competitions in Stony Plain. The clubs involved in the first sale at the Stony Plain arena were Duffield, Lakemere, Sundance, and White Rose. Shortly after the Sundance club folded, we were joined by the Twin Hearts club. Recently, the Stony Plain and District Achievement Day has been hosted by the Lakemere and Duffield clubs at the Stony Plain Heritage Pavilion on the second-tolast Wednesday in May. It marks the beginning of the Stony Plain Farmers Days celebrations.

Every club should have a uniform, and though the uniform of the Lakemere club has been modified several times over the years, blue jeans have remained standard. The first official uniform was a maroon coloured cardigan over a white shirt with a Lakemere crest on one sleeve and a 4-H crest on the other. The uniform was then modernized to a green fleece-lined sweatshirt and a white cowboy hat. Then it was decided that vests would look nice, and the mothers were persuaded to sew a bright green polyester version. After a few years, members chose to purchase blue denim style western style vests, and a new crest was designed to fit on

the back of the vest. This is still the logo used by the club. Today, the uniform is a long-sleeved, collared green shirt with our logo, and of course, blue jeans.

The club went for many years with monthly meetings held on the first Thursday of the month. As members become more involved in outside activities, meeting dates

have moved. Currently, Lakemere meets on the first Wednesday of every month and hosts a reorganizational meeting on the secondto-last Wednesday of September for new members.

The Lakemere 4-H Beef Club is more than just a 4-H club. We like to think of it as a family. All club activities are almost always supported by parents as well as younger siblings. Currently, these younger siblings are enrolled in our very successful Cleaver program. Our 4-H families seem to enjoy each other's company genuinely, and club activities provide many hours of friendship, fellowship, and laughter.

With Jake Freitag's retirement, Ben Huedpohl's son, Chuck, took over as club leader. For most of his life, Chuck has stressed commitment in all areas of the club and encouraged all members to learn to do by doing. He was also heavily involved with 4-H on the district level for many years.

Over the years, many individuals have contributed significantly to the success of our club. Some honourable names include Charlie Parker Sr., Henry Goerz, Hans Strass, and Frank Radcliffe, who were all instrumental in providing our club with long-term leadership, guidance, and support to both members and parents. While these leaders are no longer actively involved in our club, they have left a great impact on our club. Today, we have a multitude of leaders who still carry on the legacy of being Lakemere volunteers. Without this kind of support, running a club would be very difficult.

The Lakemere Beef Club has always been proud of its accomplishments. Perhaps, the people involved in the Lakemere Beef Club can take their greatest satisfaction from the many people who have benefited from participating in the 4-H movement and who have represented the club with their heads to clearer thinking, their hearts to greater loyalty, their hands to larger service, and their health to better living for their club, their community, their country and their world.


