cupants. One 36-year-old male from one vehicle and a 35-year-old woman from another vehicle were deceased at scene. 3 other occupants were taken to hospital with varying injuries.

RCMP remained on scene investigating. The investi-

gation into the cause of the collision is ongoing.

Drayton Valley RCMP Responds To Firearm Complaint

as well as Police Dog Ser-

vices (PDS), were called in to assist.

Prior to the execution of



the warrants, the suspect fled the scene. Attempts to locate the suspect were conducted by Drayton Valley RCMP, Alberta RMCP ERT and PDS. While the search was ongoing, Wetaskiwin RCMP located a suspicious vehicle, later discovered to be stolen. Further investigation resulted in identifying and arresting the suspect.

The search of the residence revealed an open gun safe containing four imitation firearms.

As a result of the investigation, Shane Curtis Seely (35), a resident of Drayton Valley, was charged with:

- Uttering threats (x2);
- Uttering threats towards police;
- Possession of stolen property over \$5000; and
 - Robbery.

Seely was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

"I want to take the opportunity to thank the various units and detachments who came together to assist on this file" said S/Sgt. Ryan Hoetmer, Detachment Commander of the Drayton Valley RCMP. "This just goes to show the resources and the reach that your Alberta RCMP has within the province and how, by being one police force, we can effectively communicate and coordinate, resulting in the arrest of those who would cause harm within our communities."





New Nisku Booster **Station Expands Water Capacity For Region**

Water for Life grant from the Government of Alberta.

"Alberta's government recognizes that water is a vital resource to support a high quality of life and attract investment and development in our communities," says Devin Dreeshen, Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors. "We are pleased to have provided \$2.3 million through the Water for Life program to support the new Nisku booster station which will ensure communities in the region have reliable access to water to support sustainable population and economic growth."

"As our communities grow, so does the demand for water," says Lars Hansen, CRSWSC Chairman. "The new booster station ensures we can continue delivering dependable, clean water services to families and businesses for years to come."

Classification: Protected A The construction of the booster

station is an important milestone in the CRSWSC Masterplan to ensure water continues to reach the region's communities in the future. The booster station, constructed by Maple Reinders and designed by Associated Engineering, includes a new pump station and 900-millimetre diameter water supply and discharge lines. The station is designed to meet peak water demand projections of 390 litres per second-the equivalent to 13.5 Olympic-sized swimming pools of water passing through the station per day and almost 5,000 pools per year. The CRSWSC, established in 1984, oversees the supply of potable water to its members: City of Leduc, Leduc County - including the Edmonton International Airport (EIA), the City of Beaumont, Town of Calmar, Village of Hay Lakes, Camrose County, and the Town of Millet.



ALBERTA FIRST TO ADD CITIZENSHIP TO LICENSES

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta is the first province to add a Canadian citizenship marker to driver's licences and ID cards, giving residents a single, secure card to access programs and services.

This fall, legislation will be introduced to implement the addition of Canadian citizenship sta-

tus to Albertans' drivers licences or ID cards. This change is part of a broader initiative to give Albertans a single, secure document that confirms both identity and Canadian citizenship. By combining identity and citizenship on one document, Albertans will no longer need to carry multiple pieces of ID to access services.

Adding a Canadian citizenship marker to Alberta's drivers licenses will also strengthen Alberta's election system by helping ensure that only eligible citizens cast ballots, protecting the integrity of our democratic process. It also positions Alberta to respond quickly to future legislative changes and aligns with international standards.

"This is about more than convenience, it's about trust. With a single, secure card proving both identity and citizenship, Albertans will face fewer hurdles when applying for government services. This will also strengthen the integrity of elections and other systems that rely on proof of citizenship."

This modernization builds on recently announced changes to incorporate Alberta health care numbers onto drivers licenses in late 2026. Currently, there are more than half a million more health care numbers registered than there are people living in Alberta, based on second quarter 2025 population estimates. Through this process, Alberta's government will be able to identify which health care cards continue to be actively in use and better understand why there is such a large discrepancy.


