

What would happen if Alberta became an independent country? Some members of our province seem to think of the possibility with great fervour, believing that all conditions would rapidly improve for them, that new freedoms could arise, and that all problems would

diminish or cease to exist. What a wonderful opportunity, without having to deal with an entire federated family! An immediate permanent paradise!

Not so! Many difficulties must be overcome. Many obligations arise, both internal and foreign. Everything that is now Canadian national responsibility would be-

come Alberta's, of course, in full. Perhaps the most immediate need would be to establish relationships with Canada. That would include border agreements (and security) over such things as water supply and travel and citizenships, trade agreements, shared costs like railway maintenance, establishment of a permanent em-

bassy, removal of Alberta from all Canadian social security aspects, and formulation of a constitution for the new country, along with the multitude of laws to create it, of course. That is just to start - to open the door, if you will.

Some new responsibilities would include Alberta's new judicial system and set of basic laws, a monetary system, a police system, an international relations commission, a pension plan, a social service and benefits package, development of an international credit rating, import/export regulations within and beyond Canada, compensation for Canadian buildings and investments within Alberta, and much more. And if Alberta has a hard time covering costs of education and health care now. what will it do when federal transfers are no longer helping?

How soon could Alberta start its own pension fund (with at most 17% of the CPP value, not an impossible and unrealistic 53%), and social security arrangements, its postal service, tax department, national police force, and so on? What arrangements could be made for those who do not wish to stay in the new country; perhaps transferring pension benefits (and investments) back to Can-Negotiate pension ada? transfers based on month by month contributions during a worker's lifetime? Many new departments would be needed.

How soon could Alberta start its own military? Thankfully, it would be landlocked, so no navy is required, but can a five million population build and sustain a substantial army and airforce with all necessary equipment, or will contribution arrangements have to be made to sustain Canada's forces and NORAD and NATO?

How soon and at what cost could new currency be minted and foreign relations with multiple countries be negotiated? Might Alberta have to pay back the 35 billion or so dollars for the Trans Mountain pipeline it would surely want to keep? It must certainly


renegotiate its passage to the coast! Would Alberta miss the involvements with G7? Would it envy Canada's participation in international games or discussions? Could it afford numerous ambassadors and embassy staff in countries with which we would trade? And more...


Those would be new Alberta National obligations. All current obligations like education, health programs, infrastructure, environmental protections, forest fire controls, and much more would still have to be maintained and planned for the future.

Of course, corporate taxes would soon have to rise to Canada's average, and royalty rates would have to be increased on fossil fuels. Subsidies and deferrals for such things would have to end, and there will be no-one to blame for problems except Alberta's own government. Albertans will want to know why the Heritage Fund has barely grown while oil profits have boomed, why no balancing fund smoothed out the waves as oil prices rose and fell, what to do about taxes owed to municipalities, why professional workers left the province before the separation, why Alberta does not use more free green energy sources, why climate change is not considered worth studying, why vaccines cost more than anywhere else, and so on. Suddenly the answers must all come from Alberta's leaders without blaming elsewhere.

For those who think that joining the United States could be of benefit, remember that Alberta is about 11% of Canada's population, and would have far less influence as less than 1.5% of the United States IF that country even accepted Alberta as a state. As a territory, it would have even less than that.

The suspects are described as:


• One male wearing grey pants and a grey shirt





Lac Ste. Anne Ratepayers Association

I, Chris Yeoman, am the President of LSARA. Lac Ste Anne and area Rate Payers Association. This is not a post I ever thought I would have to write. LSARA is a dedicated group of volunteers that come from all walks of life with different experiences. There is at least one volunteer from every single division in Lac Ste Anne County. This group was formed out of a need, not a want. There has never been any personal gain for any one of us who currently sit on the board. We have no PERSONAL AGENDA.

When this group became reality and the non profit was formed, our own personal home became the hub. This was all inline with the first petition wherein a referendum was held with the question being, "Did the ratepayers of Lac Ste Anne County wish to build an administration building for approximately 9 million dollars?" The people voted and the answer was no, they didn't. Six months later, the dollars increased, the bylaw number for borrowing changed and we did it all over again. The part that was missed was the location in the original petition. But it didn't matter as they didn't listen anyway. They ignored the petition and made the motion to short term borrow which means it gets paid off in 5 years or less. Many things happened in that time frame but suffice it to say, council and administration proceeded. The rest is kind of history however there remain lingering concerns as to the integrity. If you haven't seen it for yourself, I urge you to take a drive. Cracks in the walls that you can put your hand in...

They will tell that they had nothing to do with any of this.... They are victims too so just live with it. Well I'm here to tell you that the discussion regarding a new building was during the tenure of some of the current council from as many as 15 years ago. The CAO at that time, was prudently putting money aside for the eventual build. But that wasn't good enough for some. Certainly not the CAO that was recently released. They will tell you that LSARA is a "fringe minority" of people who are trouble makers, who don't know what they are talking about. Well I am here to tell you that not ONE article was published without being fact checked and verified. We have all the documents to support our position. Again, we have had everything to lose and nothing to gain. Lose you say? What could we possibly have lost? Time. Time that we will never get back doing research, writing letters, making phone calls, doing petitions, holding executive meetings and public forums. Money. The money that it cost us for paper, ink, power, fuel. Not one of us ever took or were given a dime. This was all out of pocket. BTW, welcome to check out LSARA's books at any time but our current balance is \$4025.24. Membership and donations.

Our home looked like a war zone during times of petitions as we put together packages and had folks coming and going to pick them up, drop them off or just to sign. Family. Most importantly, it took away time from our families. I sat at night in my camp room writing many of those articles as I worked away. Come home to work some more on LSARA items. The team that helped with all the posts, the editing, the publishing, they gave up endless hours as well. This was all TIME that we have never been compensated for. Most of the time hard to get a thank you. Why hard to get a thank you? Because people are intimidated by the current council and the ex CAO. Some worried that if they signed a petition or became a member they would be targeted. No sugar coating anymore.

I saw a post the other day wherein it was stated that petition went to the current Reeves home and it was commissioned there and that he helped get signatures. Not the truth. A special trip was made to bring the petition to a golf tournament where many county residents were in attendance. No signatures were collected. The petition was picked up and a few signed at the home when it was being picked up. Wendy did not commission that document at that time.

Several members of the current council sat at our kitchen table. Both in a councillor capacity and as directors of LSARA. Do you think they had anything to gain or lose? Two have been councillors for the last two terms. So call us or call me whatever you want, but I know I speak for myself and the executive and volunteers of LSARA when I say that the last eight years have shown us nothing changes, that's what it has shown us. LSARA has made the effort to set up two forums. Forums for both the benefit of the incumbents, the challengers, and for the folks that want to be able to make an informed choice. We initiated these forums on the 23rd of September. We sent out emails to all the folks vying for a seat. We booked the venues (we pay for them) and arranged for moderators, respected members of the community. We sent out notifications to both newspapers, the Community Voice and The Bulletin for public notice. LSARA also sent out a subsequent email offering to post all those running for a seat to provide their bio and a photo and we would post it and share it through LSARA. Some of the folks responded immediately that they were grateful to be able to participate. Today, we received communication that there is another forum being hosted on the same day, at the same time in another community. We reached out to let them know that we had over a week invested into the forum already. They told us they were going forward. I did some checking. Their email went out this morning as did their FB posts. One paper was not contacted at all. Here's my thoughts. There were no responses from the incumbents this morning aside from Ross Bohnet who indicated that he would be unavailable to attend. A reminder email was sent out to all that had yet to respond including the incumbents. Then the next thing we know, there is a forum that is at the same time, same date and the incumbents advertise it. This is what it tells me. They don't want to be put together with those challenging for a seat. They want to tell their supporters the same stories they have told us all for the past 8+ years. They don't want to listen to new ideas or concerns raised.

So here is what LSARA is going to do. We are going to run our forum for all that wish to attend whether they are vying for a seat or an incumbent. We are going to run it for the ratepayers who deserve to be able to make an informed decision.

Our FB posts have been reported, removed and reported and removed again. Folks comment as anonymous and call me out as we no longer reside in the County of Lac Ste Anne. We do reside in Parkland, an adjacent county with an IDP with LSAC. More importantly, we have some of our children, our grandchildren and great grandchildren living in Lac Ste Anne.

I personally have never hid under the veil of an anonymous post and never will. You either want what you have got for the last 8 years plus or you don't. Make an informed decision and come hear the folks vying for a seat.

October 8th at 7 pm at the Sangudo Hall for Divisions 4,6 and 7.

October 14th at 7 pm at the Onoway Heritage Center in the gym for Divisions 1,2,3 and 5.

I posted this to my own page first so it shows my name. Not LSARA but mine. I'll post it to LSARA and hope you will share. Your comments are always welcome.






