SUPPORTS FOR FAMILIES DURING TEACHER STRIKE

Alberta's government is providing new supports to help parents and students manage financial and learning challenges during these uncertain times.

The ongoing teachers' strike has left many families balancing work, child care and learning at home. The new supports will help parents and students manage unexpected costs, reduce learning disruptions and provide stability during this uncertain time.

Additional parent payment for children with complex care

needs

The impacts of a teacher strike can be especially challenging for families of children with complex care needs, who may have limited access to suitable respite and child care options. That's why Alberta's government is providing additional financial support for those with active Family Support for Children with Disabilities (FSCD) agreements who are affected by the strike.

Families of children with active FSCD agreements who are enrolled in schools affected by the strike will be eligible for the following supports:

- \$30 per child per instructional day for children 12 and under
- \$60 per child per instructional day for children 13 years and older

While families will be asked to provide their child's FSCD File ID number, found on their FSCD agreement, a separate application process is not required.

This funding is in addition to the previously announced Parent Payment Program, which provides \$30 per instructional day for children 12 and under who are enrolled in a school impacted by teacher labour action.

Families of children aged 12 and under with active FSCD agreements are eligible for an additional \$30 per child per school day. Combined with payments through the Parent Payment Program, this totals up to \$300 per five-day school week.

Families of children aged 13 through 17 with an active FSCD agreement are eligible for \$60 per child per instructional day, totalling up to \$300 per five-day school week.

Parents can apply through the online parent portal, which will open on alberta.ca on Oct. 14.

If a student was 12 on Oct. 6, when labour action began, they

will qualify to receive the payment for the duration of the strike, even if they turn 13 prior to labour action ending.

Previously announced supports:

Payment program

To help ease the extra costs families may face while children are away from their desks during labour action, Alberta's government is introducing a new payment program for parents. This program would be available to parents and guardians of students aged 12 and under who attend a public, separate or francophone school and are affected by teacher strikes.

Eligible parents or guardians would receive \$30 per day, or \$150 per week, per student for the duration of the ATA's labour action. The first payment will be made on Oct. 31

Supports For Families During Teacher Strike

The payments would support families while students are unable to attend school to help offset additional costs like child care, educational supports such as tutoring or other activities to keep students engaged.

Child care subsidy

To ease the financial burden on families who require additional child care during the strike, Alberta’s government will increase October funding rates for eligible children in

grades 1 to 6 who are attending out-of-school care full time.

The temporary increase in funding will come into effect after five consecutive days of a strike and apply for all of October. The rate of funding will increase to a maximum of \$644 to align with the funding rates provided during summer months when children require full-time care.

Distance education

To provide continued access to learning and offer students more flexibility, Alberta’s gov-

ernment will temporarily lift the 10-credit per year limit on distance education. This will allow students in grades 10 to 12 to keep earning credits during a strike if they are interested in doing so. Students may also enrol in distance learning with independent schools that offer this programming at any time during the strike.

Home education

Parents may also choose to enrol their child in a home education program with a supervising independent school. If a

family chooses to do so, both the family and the supervising independent school will be eligible for up to 50 per cent of the home education grant, up to \$450.50 per child.

Family programming

To provide further opportunities for continued learning, Alberta’s provincial heritage sites and museums are offering free admission for all Albertans aged 18 and under for the duration of the teachers’ strike.

Sites offering free admission include:

- Frank Slide Interpretive Centre, Crowsnest Pass
- Head-Smashed-In-Buffalo Jump, Fort Macleod
- Oil Sands Discovery Centre, Fort McMurray
- Remington Carriage Museum, Cardston
- Reynolds Museum, Wetaskiwin
- Royal Alberta Museum, Edmonton
- Royal Tyrrell Museum, Drumheller

Parents and family members will still be required to pay admission fees. Guests 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Museums will also be expanding hours. Families are encouraged to visit the website of each participating museum for details on hours and programming.

Learning supports

To give families flexibility during the labour disruption, Alberta Education and Child-care created a free toolkit for parents to support their child’s learning.

The toolkit provides resources that follow the grades K-12 curriculum. The resources are available in English, French and French immersion and focus on the core subjects of language arts, social studies, math and sciences. These resources will be updated weekly.

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WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Whitecourt will be applying to the Forest Resource Improvement Association of Alberta for funding for two projects:

- Development of a Wild-fire Resilience Toolkit – This will be targeted to developers, builders and

homeowners to promote FireSmart principles during permitting and construction phases. The Toolkit will include educational materials, and facilitated sessions.

- Vegetation Management Program – Funding will be allocated to hire the 2026 FireSmart Summer Crew to promote FireSmart principles and complete vegeta-

tion management projects in the Centennial Park and Southlands Park area.

A delegation from the Whitecourt/Yubetsu Cultural Exchange presented Council with highlights of their recent trip to Japan. The Whitecourt/Yubetsu Twinning Exchange Program provides residents of both communities the op-

portunity to immerse themselves in a new culture.

Since 2005, the Government of Alberta has funded the Whitecourt Family Violence Stakeholders group to provide the Family Violence Initiative. It uses best and promising practices to deliver services and supports to prevent and reduce family violence/sexual violence and promote safe, healthy, equitable relationships. The supports the Initiative provides, including a court co-ordination program for domestic violence cases and the New Hope program, are unique in Alberta in the way the programs work to provide not only support and rehabilitation to the victim, but also to the perpetrator to help end the cycle of family violence. The Town was recently notified that a recent grant request to extend funding for the program was unsuccessful, and that the current funding will expire this month. Whitecourt Town Council has allocated funds from a reserve to continue the program to the end of 2025, and will be advocating to the Province for funding so that the program can continue into 2026.

Whitecourt is applying to the Canada Cultural Spaces Fund for funding a portion of the specialized theatre equipment for the Culture & Events Centre. The equipment will enhance the physical, technological, and safety of the Culture & Events, and create the first fully equipped performance space of its kind in the region.

Council has approved a one-year exemption to Sagitawah RV Park's operating season, allowing the Park to operate throughout this winter season (from October 16, 2025 to May 14, 2026). This approval is subject to a number of conditions as part of the Development Permit approval process.

Council has approved street closures for the Chamber of Commerce Santa Claus Parade on November 15 and the Christmas Is For Kids event on November 29. Details on road closures will be posted closer to the event dates.

Council has approved a request from the White-

court Mountain Bike Association to utilize the \$150,000 matching contribution for the road access and parking, and that any remaining funds be used for the skills park and trail development on a 50/50 matching basis.



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LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY AND DARWELL LAGOON COMMISSION ADVANCE INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN TO PROTECT LAKES, SUPPORT GROWTH, AND SECURE LONG-TERM COMPLIANCE

Sangudo, Alberta — Wednesday, October 8, 2025

Lac Ste. Anne County (LSAC) and the Darwell Lagoon Commission are taking proactive steps to ensure the region's wastewater systems remain safe, compliant, and sustainable for decades to come. A new wastewater management solution, supported through a provincially funded partnership, will protect local waterways, accommodate future growth, and reduce long-term costs for residents.

How We Got Here

LSAC operates **eight lagoon systems**, with **Darwell and North 43 handling the majority of municipal effluent**. Darwell is unique as the **County's only evaporation lagoon with no discharge**, and its last expansion took place 16 years ago. As the system approaches capacity, the County and Commission recognized the need for a long-term solution that avoids emergency measures and costly short-term fixes.

North 43 also operates under limitations set by Alberta Environment and Protected Areas (AEP), requiring careful management to maintain compliance. Both systems have undergone regular major maintenance to stay within regulatory standards, but increasing demand and tightening federal and provincial discharge requirements have made an upgrade necessary.

Without intervention, expansion of the Darwell and North 43 lagoons would cost approximately **\$5 million each – a combined \$10 million – fully funded by municipal taxpayers**. That approach would not only burden residents but also risk future non-compliance as standards continue to evolve.

What We're Doing

Through the Province's **90/10 grant funding model**, LSAC and the Darwell Lagoon Commission are preparing to **direct treated wastewater from the Darwell and North 43 lagoons into the Pembina watershed via a connection to the Northeast Lagoon**. This forward-thinking project will meet modern environmental standards, accommodate community growth, and protect area lakes and rivers for generations to come.

By using different lagoons along the route, the system will also improve wastewater collection efficiency and provide capacity for future development. The Pembina watershed connection will ensure treated water is released safely into a flowing system, as discharges into the Sturgeon River cannot be approved under current regulations.

By investing in this project today, LSAC and the Darwell Lagoon Commission are proactively eliminating those risks, ensuring operational stability and environmental protection.

To provide confidence in the process and ensure the highest technical standards, **Stantec Inc. has been engaged as the lead engineering consultant on this project**. Their expertise and oversight ensure the design, planning, and execution meet both community expectations and strict regulatory requirements.

- Possession of controlled substance.

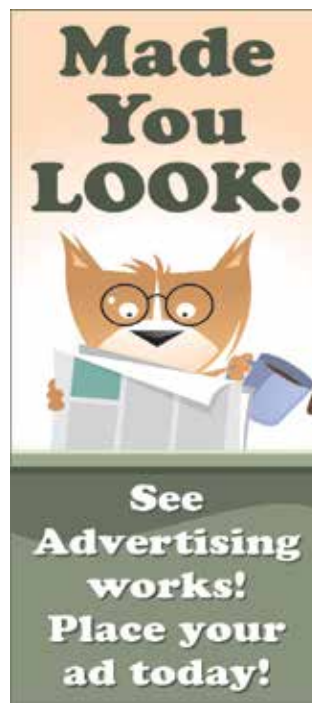
Jayden Stebbings (19), a resident of Wabamun, Alta; was arrested on outstanding warrants and charged with:

Stony Plain is on Oct. 1, 2025.





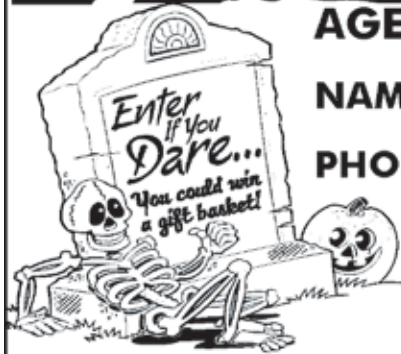
