PARKLAND RCMP REQUEST INFORMATION REGARDING RECENT ARSONS

On Oct. 7, 2025, Evansburg RCMP were called to a deadly altercation

and started searching for the suspect, who had fled the scene. The suspect fled to Spruce Grove, Alta., where he was safely arrested. The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes

Unit has taken carriage of the investigation. The victim was identified as 50-year-old Yellowhead County resident Robert Brett Macleod. MacLeod was known to the suspect.

As a result of the investigation, Levi Allen Williamson (39), a resident of Yellowhead County, has been charged with:

- 2nd degree murder;
- Dangerous driving; and
- Flight from police.

Williamson was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg on Oct. 21, 2025. The investigation is ongoing.

ID Requirements

Option A - Resident can vote if their name is on the Permanent Electors Register and they produce one piece of ID issued by a Canadian government, whether federal, provincial or local, or an agency of the government, that contains full name and photograph.

Example: driver's licence; Alberta ID card; Canadian passport

Option B - Residents not on the Permanent Electors Register, or who are on the Register, but do NOT have government-issued photo ID at the voting station must complete the Elector Register and provide one of the following:

o One piece of identification issued by a Canadian government, (federal, provincial or local), or one of its agencies that includes the elector's photograph, full name, and residential address.

OR

o Any piece of identification listed on the Yellowhead County website that contains both the elector's name and residential address.

OR

o One piece of identification that shows the elector's name, and be accompanied by a voucher—an eligible voter who meets the requirements and completes Statement of Voucher.

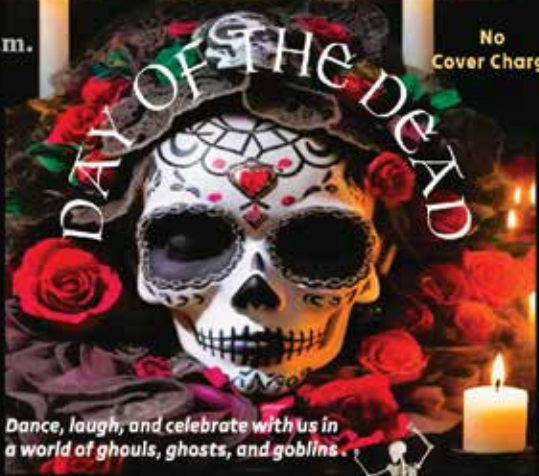

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DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP PROPERTY CRIME INITIATIVE RESULTS IN MULTIPLE ARRESTS

Over the past couple of months, after receiving multiple complaints regarding motor vehicle theft, the Drayton Valley RCMP began an initiative targeting property crime offenders. As a result, there have been a few noteworthy investigations that the Drayton Valley RCMP would like to share:

- On Aug. 17, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP attempted to stop a suspicious vehicle in Drayton Valley. The driver fled from police but RCMP officers were able to identify the driver as a known suspended driver and prolific property crime offender in the area. On Aug. 27, 2025, the Drayton Valley General Investigation Section (GIS) and the Central Alberta District (CAD) Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) executed a search warrant on a rural property in Alder Flats, Alta. Police seized the vehicle that was being operated on the date of the original offence as well as a second vehicle that has been confirmed to be stolen. As a result of the investigation, Jason Roy (38), a resident of Alder Flats, was arrested and charged with:
 - o Flight from police;
 - o Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle;
 - o Operation of a motor vehicle while prohibited; and
 - o Possession of property obtained by crime.

Roy was brought before a

justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

- On Aug. 19, 2025, CAD CRU and Drayton Valley RCMP GIS were able to locate a wanted male in a rural location West of Drayton Valley. A search warrant was executed, resulting in the seizure of:

- o Four stolen trucks;
- o A stolen holiday trailer;
- o A stolen Side-by-Side ATV;
- o A stolen quad ATV; and
- o Several firearms, two of which were later confirmed to be stolen.

As a result of the investigation, Kenneth Caron (33) and Yvonne Rheaume (23) were arrested. Both were charged with the below offences, with Caron being additionally charged with Possession of a firearm or prohibited weapon contrary order (x5) and failure to comply with a release order(x5):

- o Possession of property obtained by crime (x9);
- o Possession of a firearm without holding a licence (x4);
- o Possession of a stolen firearm (x2); and
- o Possession of a prohibited weapon.

Caron and Rheaume were brought before a justice of the peace where Caron was remanded and Rheaume released. They are both to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

- On Aug. 28, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP conducted a traffic stop on a suspicious vehicle in Drayton Valley. During the course of the investigation, police determined that the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) on the dash of the vehicle did not match the one on the doors. Police queries on the door VIN revealed the doors to be from a stolen vehicle. Further investigation revealed the location of the stolen vehicle with its two missing doors. A 43-year-old male Drayton Valley resident was arrested and will be charged with Possession of property obtained by crime, though the information has yet to be sworn. The male was released by way of an Appearance Notice and is next scheduled to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Oct. 21, 2025.

- On Sept 5, 2025, after a three-months long investigation, the Drayton Valley RCMP GIS, with the assistance of the RCMP Auto Theft Unit, executed a search warrant on a "Chop Shop" near Drayton Valley. As a result of the search, police located and seized:

- o A large quantity of parts from four different stolen vehicles in various states of disassembly, with stolen parts mounted on non-stolen vehicles;
- o A firearm;
- o Ammunition;
- o A stolen safe;
- o A stolen ID card;
- o Methamphetamine; and

- o Cocaine.

Michael Tymchak (43) was arrested and charged with:

- o Break and enter and commit theft;
- o Possession of property obtained by crime (x9);
- o Possession of identity documents;
- o Possession of a firearm without holding a licence;
- o Possession of a firearm or ammunition contrary to order (x3); and
- o Possession of a controlled substance (x2).

Tymchak was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton on Sept. 10, 2025.

"The Drayton Valley RCMP remains committed to the investigation and prosecution of individuals that engage in property crime in and around the community of Drayton Valley" said Cpl. Cam Turner, the NCO i/c of the Drayton Valley RCMP GIS. "These criminal offences victimize members of the community and often can lead to lost wages and out of pocket expenses for victims of these crimes. The Drayton Valley RCMP will continue to ensure that persons who choose to engage in criminal activity and prey on members of the community will be located and dealt with according to law."

COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM AND PARKLAND RCMP ARREST INDIVIDUALS ON OUTSTANDING WARRANTS

On Oct. 2, 2025, the Community Response Team located a male with active warrants at a residence in Paul First Nation. Police believed there was a stolen vehicle on the property. Police attended the property and arrested a male and female on active warrants who were standing alongside the stolen Ford F550, without incident.

Ryan Wiggins (41), a resident of Alexander First Nation, Alta; was arrested on outstanding warrants and charged with:

- Possession of stolen property over \$5,000;
- Theft of vehicle;
- Mischief;
- Possession of counterfeit currency;
- Break and enter;
- Fail to comply with conditions (x5);
- Possession of controlled substance.

Jayden Stebbings (19), a resident of Wabamun, Alta; was arrested on outstanding warrants and charged with:

- Possession of stolen property over \$5,000;
- Breach of probation order (x2).

Wiggins was remanded into custody and his next court appearance at the Alberta Court of Justice

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SUPPORTS FOR FAMILIES DURING TEACHER STRIKE

Alberta's government is providing new supports to help parents and students manage financial and learning challenges during these uncertain times.

The ongoing teachers' strike has left many families balancing work, child care and learning at home. The new supports will help parents and students manage unexpected costs, reduce learning disruptions and provide stability during this uncertain time.

Additional parent payment for children with complex care needs

The impacts of a teacher strike can be especially challenging for families of children with complex care needs, who may have limited access to suitable respite and child care options. That's why Alberta's government is providing additional financial support for those with active Family Support for Children with Disabilities (FSCD) agreements who are affected by the strike.

Families of children with active FSCD agreements who are enrolled in schools affected by the strike will be eligible for the following supports:

- \$30 per child per instructional day for children 12 and under
- \$60 per child per instructional day for children 13 years and older

While families will be asked to provide their child's FSCD File ID number, found on their FSCD agreement, a separate application process is not required.

This funding is in addition to the previously announced Parent Payment

Program, which provides \$30 per instructional day for children 12 and under who are enrolled in a school impacted by teacher labour action.

Families of children aged 12 and under with active FSCD agreements are eligible for an additional \$30 per child per school day. Combined with payments through the Parent Payment Program, this totals up to \$300 per five-day school week.

Families of children aged 13 through 17 with an active FSCD agreement are eligible for \$60 per child per instructional day, totalling up to \$300 per five-day school week.

Parents can apply through the online parent portal, which will open on alberta.ca on Oct. 14.

If a student was 12 on Oct. 6, when labour action began, they will qualify to receive the payment for the duration of the strike, even if they turn 13 prior to labour action ending.

Previously announced supports:

Payment program

To help ease the extra costs families may face while children are away from their desks during labour action, Alberta's government is introducing a new payment program for parents. This program would be available to parents and guardians of students aged 12 and under who attend a public, separate or francophone school and are affected by teacher strikes.

Eligible parents or guardians would receive \$30 per day, or \$150 per week, per student for the duration of the ATA's labour action. The first payment will be made

on Oct. 31

The payments would support families while students are unable to attend school to help offset additional costs like child care, educational supports such as tutoring or other activities to keep students engaged.

Child care subsidy

To ease the financial burden on families who require additional child care during the strike, Alberta's government will increase October funding rates for eligible children in grades 1 to 6 who are attending out-of-school care full time.

The temporary increase in funding will come into effect after five consecutive days of a strike and apply for all of October. The rate of funding will increase to a maximum of \$644 to align with the funding rates provided during summer months when children require full-time care.

Distance education

To provide continued access to learning and offer students more flexibility, Alberta's government will temporarily lift the 10-credit per year limit on distance education. This will allow students in grades 10 to 12 to keep earning credits during a strike if they are interested in doing so. Students may also enrol in distance learning with independent schools that offer this programming at any time during the strike.

Home education

Parents may also choose to enrol their child in a home education program with a supervising independent school. If a family chooses to do so, both the family and the supervising independent school will be eligible for up to 50 per cent of the

home education grant, up to \$450.50 per child.

Family programming

To provide further opportunities for continued learning, Alberta's provincial heritage sites and museums are offering free admission for all Albertans aged 18 and under for the duration of the teachers' strike.

Sites offering free admission include:

Parents and family members will still be required to pay admission fees. Guests 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Museums will also be expanding hours. Families are encouraged to visit the website of each participating museum for details on hours and programming.

Learning supports

To give families flexibility during the labour disruption, Alberta Education and Childcare created a free toolkit for parents to support their child's learning.

The toolkit provides resources that follow the grades K-12 curriculum. The resources are available in English, French and French immersion and focus on the core subjects of language arts, social studies, math and sciences. These resources will be updated weekly.



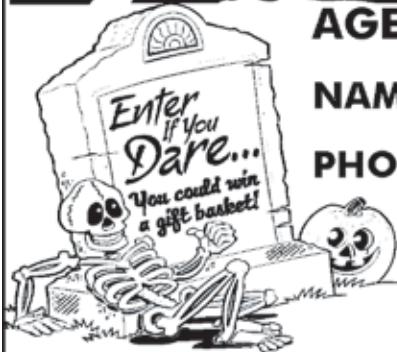
