ALBERTA RCMP WESTERN ALBERTA DISTRICT CRIME REDUCTION UNIT, AIR SERVICES, AND LOCAL DETACHMENTS COORDINATE TO CATCH PROLIFIC OFFENDER

On Oct. 22, 2025, members of the Alberta RCMP's Western Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (WAD CRU), working with local detachments, and with the help of the RCMP Air Services unit initiated an operation to re-

move a prolific property offender, subject to a Canada-wide warrant, from the community of Mayerthorpe.

The operation began with locating a stolen vehicle believed to be in possession of the suspect in the rural community of Lac St. Anne County. WAD

CRU began surveillance of the suspect, with the assistance of Alberta RCMP Air Service's Helicopter and Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems (RPAS, more commonly known as drones). WAD CRU attempted to disable the suspects vehicle with

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the use of a Tire Deflation Device (TDD). The first attempt was unsuccessful, and the suspect fled the scene; however, by this point, they were under the visual operation of the Air Services helicopter, who surveyed him for the remainder of the operation. This allowed the RCMP Real Time Operation Center to coordinate officers ahead of the suspect to deploy a second, successful, TDD. The suspect was forced to abandon his vehicle and was apprehended while attempting to steal another vehicle.

In Alberta, the Crime Reduction Units of the RCMP are committed to using proven methods to reduce crime in the communities they serve. One of the ways that they do this is by targeting prolific offenders, like

this suspect, who commit a disproportionate amount of crime in the community.

The Alberta RCMP Air Services unit was onsite during the operation to assist members on the ground by providing Helicopter and RPAS support. The RCMP Air Services operates across all of Alberta, providing air support for all detachments. Air Services provides a variety of benefits to the province of Alberta. First and foremost, they help ensure the safety of the officers and the public on the ground. They provide a serious tactical advantage to law enforcement officers, allowing for oversight and improved coordination. Air Services is also key to capturing important evidence that helps support charges by members.

Through the combined efforts of everyone involved, the RCMP was able to apprehend

the suspect while ensuring the safety of the public and officers. As a result, Daniel O'Donnell, a 38-year-old resident of Tomahawk, remains in custody and has been charged with:

- Robbery with firearm;
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000;
- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle;
- Operation while prohibited;
- Possession of weapons contrary to order;
- Possession of weapons for dangerous purposes;
- Resisting a police officer;
- Break and enter of a residence;
- Theft under \$5000;
- Fraudulent concealment; and
- Unauthorized possession of a firearm.

Children with Disabilities (FSCD) agreements also qualify for additional support.

Parents and guardians who applied for the program on or before Oct. 27 will start to receive their payments by e-transfer on Oct. 31. These payments provide \$30 per child per school day for the length of the Oct. 6-28 teacher strike. Eligible families with active FSCD agreements will receive \$60 per child for the same dates.

For families that applied to the program after Oct. 28, another batch of payments will start going out on Nov. 30. The Parent Payment Program portal remains open, and families can apply until Nov. 14.

Receiving your parent payments

To protect yourself from scams impersonating the Government of Alberta, do not accept an e-transfer if you did not apply for a payment through the Parent Payment Program portal.

All parent payments will be sent by e-transfer using the email address associated with your Alberta.ca account. If you have auto-deposit, the payment will be automatically deposited. If you do not have auto-deposit set up, you will have 10 days to manually accept your payment. If the e-transfer is not accepted within 10 days, it will be cancelled and reissued on Nov. 30.

If you applied before Oct. 27 and do not receive an e-transfer by Nov. 3, check your spam folder or log in to your Alberta.ca account to confirm the status of your payment. An application confirmation number

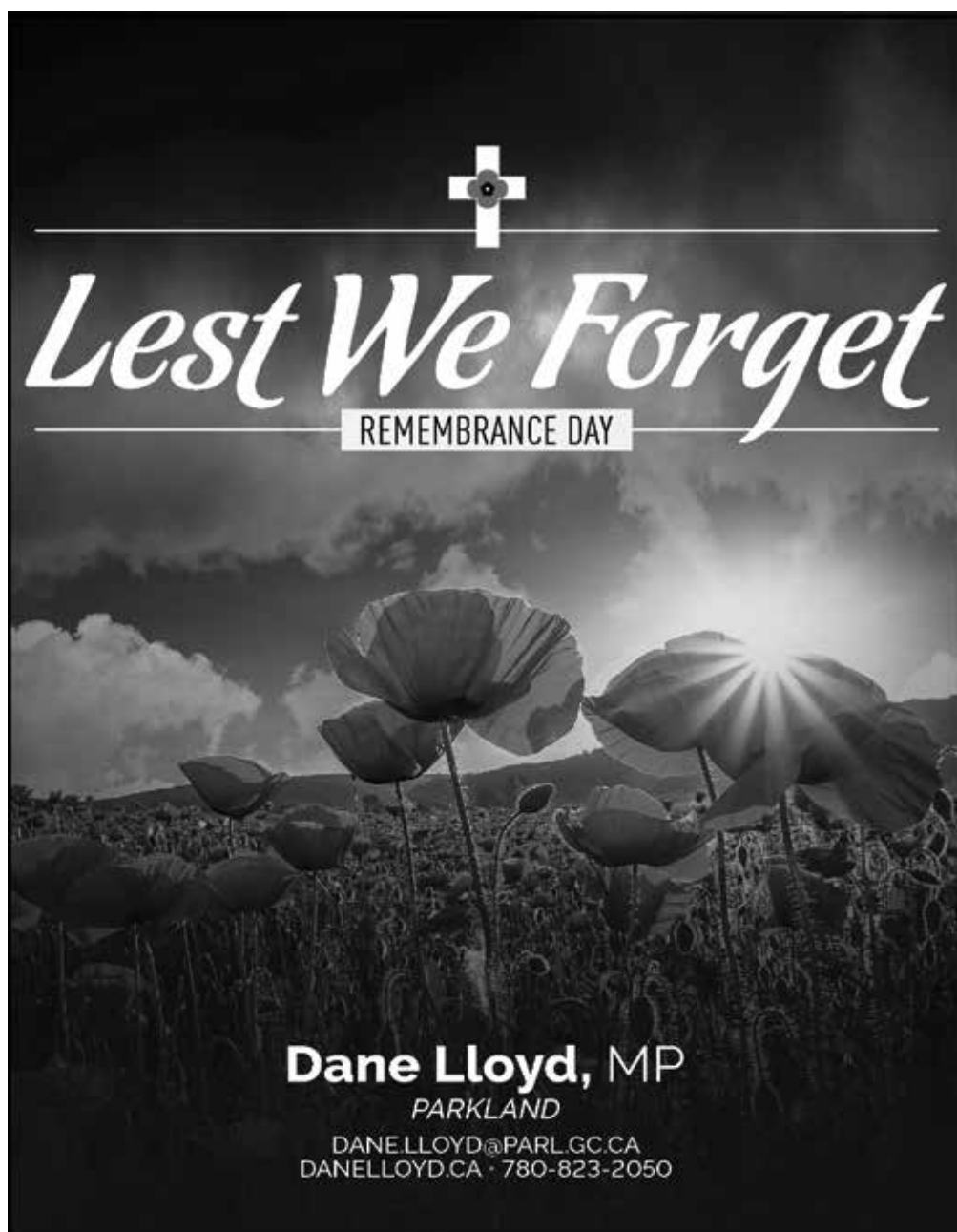
will be needed to manually accept your e-transfer. If you do not remember this number, please check the application confirmation page in your Alberta.ca account.

The security question password can be found on an individual's YourAlberta Parent Payment Program application under application summary.

Help For Families: Parent Payments Begin

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The Application Reference Number will be in the form of XXXX-XXXX and must be entered as shown, including dashes, and is case sensitive. Do not copy and paste.

Parents who are entitled to additional funding but have not yet received it will be included in a future payment run.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Parent Payment Program, the following criteria must be met:

- You must be the parent/guardian of a child aged 12 or under.

- Your child must be enrolled in a public, Catholic or francophone school impacted by the teacher strike.

- You and your child must be Alberta residents.

To be eligible for the additional support available to families of children with complex care needs, the following additional criteria must be met:

- You must be the parent/guardian of a child aged 17 or under with an active FSCD agreement.

Parent applications will be reviewed and validated to ensure eligibility criteria are met. Only one parent/guardian per child is eligible for the Parent Payment Program. The parent/guardian who applies must have the same mailing address that is in the child's student profile.

How to apply

Applications are still open and will be accepted until Nov. 14.

- Step 1: Log into your verified Alberta.ca Account

- o Sign up for an Alberta.ca account if you do

not already have one.

- Step 2. Apply on Parent Payment Program.

To apply, the addresses on your alberta.ca account and on your child's student file must match exactly. Any difference in street name or numbers, abbreviations, postal code, etc. will result in an error message. Please confirm the addresses on file match.

- If you need to up-

date your child's student file, please contact your school or school board.

- You can update the address associated with your Alberta.ca account by visiting a registry office (this address must match what appears on your driver's license or Alberta ID).

YOUR PROVINCE, YOUR PLATE

For the first time in more than 40 years, Alberta is refreshing its licence plate with a Strong and Free motto, and the final look will be decided by Albertans.

From Oct. 15 until Nov. 5, Albertans can take part in a tournament-style online vote for a new provincial licence plate design that proudly reflects who we are every time we hit the road.

The new licence plate will be available in late 2026 and will be based on a “Strong and Free” theme, echoing the Latin motto of our province and reflecting Alberta’s bold identity, economic strength and deep-rooted provincial pride. The motto’s inclusion on the licence plates will also serve as a

nod to Canada’s national anthem and Alberta’s position as a strong and sovereign province within a united Canada.

“From our wide-open landscapes to our entrepreneurial spirit, Alberta has so much to be proud of, and our new licence plate will reflect that pride. For the first time in four decades, Albertans will choose how we tell that story. I look forward to seeing which design is selected to show the world that this is the land of the strong and free.”

With options that include famous Alberta landmarks such as the Three Sisters Mountains, and long-standing symbols of our province’s core industries including agriculture and energy production, the po-

tential plates each contain symbols of Alberta’s beauty, history and spirit.

In the first phase of voting, Albertans can vote for their favourite of eight unique concepts that incorporate Alberta’s unique landscape and history. Following the first phase, four designs will advance to the next round of voting where the top two will be selected, and subsequently, there will be a final vote for the winning plate concept. The winning new licence plate will be announced during the fall session of the legislature.

“Alberta is strong and free, and Albertans will have the opportunity to choose a new licence plate that captures that spirit. The new licence plate will be a fresh design that every Albertan will be proud to show off,

whether they’re driving to work, heading to the lake or exploring North America.”

If an Albertan wants to replace their current plate for the new licence plate once it is released, they can voluntarily pay a \$28 fee. Alternatively, Albertans could obtain a new plate on their vehicle registration renewal date at no additional cost. Motorists may also continue using the previous licence plate once the new licence plate is brought on-board, provided it is still in good condition.

JANUARY PROVINCIAL EXAM UPDATE

Submitted by Government of Alberta

January provincial exams are cancelled. Students may opt to write January diploma exams in April or June 2026, on a voluntary basis.

To ensure students and teachers can concentrate on learning after lost in-

structional time due to the teacher strike, Alberta's government has cancelled the January 2026 diploma examinations and Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs).

The cancellation will not affect students' ability to apply to, be accepted by, or attend post-secondary in-

stitutions.

Students who choose not to write at a later date will receive their school-awarded mark as their final official course mark. A notation will be added to transcripts confirming that no diploma exam was written. This ensures there is no impact on students' ability to graduate

or transition into post-secondary programs.

School authorities will meet all learning outcomes for the school year and will have flexibility to adjust the school calendar as needed. Any changes in the school calendar will be communicated to families by their school.

WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Whitecourt Town Council for the 2025-2029 term had its first Organizational and Regular Meetings on October 27. Council is moving forward on budget deliberations and has scheduled a number of presentations/meetings for the coming weeks to discuss and prepare the 2026 operating and capital budgets.

Councillor Tara Baker has been appointed Deputy Mayor until January 31, 2026. Councillor Ser-

ena Lapointe has been appointed Acting Deputy Mayor for the council term.

A number of public appointments were made to Council Committees. To everyone that submitted applications for Council Committees – thank you for your commitment and willingness to serve our community. All applicants will be contacted in the coming days regarding the status of Council Committee appointments.

Administration has been directed to bring additional financial and long-term planning information

to the November 10, 2025 Council Meeting on the proposed purchase of three new transit buses.

Traffic signal upgrades will be completed at the intersections of 49 Avenue and 51 Street, and 52 Avenue and 47 Street. The upgrades were recommended following a review of traffic flows and infrastructure condition. The contract for the upgrades has been awarded to Can-Traffic Services Ltd. in the amount of \$529,536.66 plus GST, and construction will begin this winter.

Whitecourt Town Council has

adopted supplementary procedures for the Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) Committee.

The procedures relate to meeting management and administration for the Committee.

At the request of the Whitecourt Wolverines, Whitecourt Town Council has approved a request to extend the Renovation Contribution Agreement for six months.

COMPANY SENTENCED FOR SERIOUS WORKPLACE INJURY

A sand and gravel supplier has been penalized \$150,000 related to a serious workplace injury incident.

McLeod Valley Sand and Gravel, as an employer, pleaded guilty on Aug. 25 in the Evansburg Court of Justice to one count under the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Act for failing to ensure the health and safety of a worker. The

Crown withdrew 14 other counts. The Crown withdrew all 17 counts against JRF Oilfield Services Ltd. related to the same incident.

The charges stem from an incident that occurred on a construction site near Entwistle on June 29, 2023. A worker became entangled in a roller that formed part of a conveyor's drive system and suffered serious injuries.

On Oct. 20, under a creative sentence, the court ordered McLeod Valley Sand and Gravel to

pay \$150,000 to the Alberta Sand and Gravel Association to develop three interactive online safety training modules.

The OHS Act provides a creative sentence option in which funds that would otherwise be paid as fines are directed to an organization or project to improve or promote workplace health and safety.

Both the company and the Crown have up to 30 days to appeal the conviction or penalties.

Alberta's OHS laws set basic

health and safety rules for workplaces across the province. They provide guidance for employers to help them ensure their workplaces are as healthy and safe as possible while providing rights and protections for workers. Charges under OHS laws may be laid when failing to follow the rules results in a fatality or serious injury.

FILING AN INDIAN BOARDING HOMES CLAIM IF YOU FILED A CLAIM IN ANOTHER SETTLEMENT

If you filed a claim in another settlement related to federal education programs, you may still be eligible to apply for the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action Settlement. These are separate legal processes, and receiving compensation under one does not automatically disqualify you from applying for the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement.

The Indian Boarding Homes Program recognizes the unique experiences of First Nations, Métis and Inuit children who were placed in private homes between September 1, 1951 and June 30, 1992 for the purpose of attending school. Survivors of this program faced isolation,

loss of culture and language, and risks of mistreatment while living away from their families and communities.

A Different Process, Focused on Survivors

Unlike past legal settlements, survivors applying to the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action are not required to testify or recount their story in order to receive compensation. The process is confidential and designed to acknowledge harms without forcing people to relive traumatic experiences.

Eligibility Requirements

You may qualify for the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement if you:

- Are First Nations, Métis or Inuit

- Were placed in a private home by the federal government to attend elementary or high school

- Lived in that home between September 1, 1951 and June 30, 1992

If you received compensation from the Residential Schools Settlement or any other settlement, you could still receive compensation from the Indian Boarding Homes Settlement, if you meet all the eligibility requirements.

Filing a Claim for Compensation

The claims process for the Indian Boarding Homes Class Action Settlement is now open, with a deadline of February 22, 2027. Survivors can submit claims for

compensation through a process that is designed to be clear, confidential, and accessible.

Support is available through Community Engagement Teams, who host Information Sessions across Canada to answer questions, provide resources, and guide survivors through how to file a claim.

You can also find detailed information and claim forms online.

Survivors and families do not need to navigate this process alone. Resources for emotional, cultural, and practical support are available to help you take the next step if you choose
