## **HAVE YOUR SAY ON HIGHWAY SPEED LIMITS**

Alberta's government is engaging with Albertans on increasing speed limits on rural highways.

Starting Nov. 7, Albertans can share their views on modernizing speed limits on divided highways through an online survey running until Dec. 12. The survey will ask how Albertans view raising the speed

limit by 10 km/h on various highways from 110 km/h to 120 km/h.

divided highways, and if Albertans support increasing speed limits. We are investing more than \$1.5 billion this year alone to improve highway safety and upgrade infrastructure across the province. We want Albertans to be able to drive the speed limit that the highways are designed for. Modern vehicles combined with public awareness mean we can explore higher speed limits."

The survey will provide Albertans with the opportunity to provide input on which highways they would prioritize having a speed limit increase, their views on restricting commercial trucks from using the far-left lane on highways with three or more lanes and any other feedback that would improve driving experiences on provincial highways.

Following a review of the survey results, Alberta's gov-

ernment plans to conduct a mini-trial of a 120 km/h speed limit to assess the impacts of higher speed limits on divided highways. The trial will include strong monitoring to assess driving behaviour.



# MASKWACIS RCMP CHARGE MALE WITH WEAPONS TRAFFICKING

In 2024, Maskwacis RCMP recovered a firearm from a crime scene. After extensive investigation, it was determined that this firearm was illegally purchased. On Oct. 23, 2025, Maskwacis RCMP arrested 26-yearold Payne Smallboy, a resident of Ermineskin Cree Nation, for firearms trafficking.

Smallboy has been charged with:

- Weapons trafficking;
- Transferring a firearm without authority.

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Smallboy was released with a number of conditions. He will be appearing in Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin on Nov. 18, 2025.



#### **HELP FOR FAMILIES: PARENT PAYMENTS BEGIN**

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Eligible families who applied for support through the Parent Payment Program on or before Oct. 27 will receive their full payment starting Oct. 31.

To help cover extra costs families faced while schools were closed, Alberta's government introduced the Parent Payment Program. This non-taxable support is for families with children aged 12 and under that attend a public, Catholic or francophone school affected by the strike. Families with children aged 17 and under who have active Family Support for Children with Disabilities (FSCD) agreements also qualify for additional support.

Parents and guardians who applied for the program on or before Oct. 27 will start to receive their payments by e-transfer on Oct. 31. These payments provide \$30 per child per school day for the length of the Oct. 6-28 teacher strike. Eligible families with active FSCD agreements will receive \$60 per child for the same dates.

For families that applied to the program after Oct. 28, another batch of payments will start going out on Nov. 30. The Parent Payment Program portal remains open, and families can apply until

Nov 14

Receiving your parent payments To protect yourself from scams impersonating the Government of Alberta, do not accept an e-transfer if you did not apply for a payment through the Parent Payment Program portal.

All parent payments will be sent by e-transfer using the email address associated with your Alberta. ca account. If you have auto-deposit, the payment will be automatically deposited. If you do not have auto-deposit set up, you will have 10 days to manually accept your payment. If the e-transfer is not accepted within 10 days, it will be cancelled and reissued on Nov.

If you applied before Oct. 27 and do not receive an e-transfer by Nov. 3, check your spam folder or log in to your Alberta.ca account to confirm the status of your payment. An application confirmation number will be needed to manually accept your e-transfer. If you do not remember this number, please check the application confirmation page in your Alberta.ca account.

The security question password can be found on an individual's YourAlberta Parent Payment Program application under application summary.

The Application Reference Num-

ber will be in the form of XXXX-XXXX and must be entered as shown, including dashes, and is case sensitive. Do not copy and paste.

Parents who are entitled to additional funding but have not yet received it will be included in a future payment run.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Parent Payment Program, the following criteria must be met:

•You must be the parent/guardian of a child aged 12 or under.

•Your child must be enrolled in a public, Catholic or francophone school impacted by the teacher strike.

•You and your child must be Alberta residents.

To be eligible for the additional support available to families of children with complex care needs, the following additional criteria must be met:

•You must be the parent/guardian of a child aged 17 or under with an active FSCD agreement.

Parent applications will be reviewed and validated to ensure eligibility criteria are met. Only one parent/guardian per child is eligible for the Parent Payment Program. The parent/guardian who applies must have the same mailing address that is in the child's

student profile.

How to apply

Applications are still open and will be accepted until Nov. 14.

•Step 1: Log into your verified Alberta.ca Account

oSign up for an Alberta.ca account if you do not already have one.

•Step 2. Apply on Parent Payment Program.

To apply, the addresses on your alberta.ca account and on your child's student file must match exactly. Any difference in street name or numbers, abbreviations, postal code, etc. will result in an error message. Please confirm the addresses on file match.

•If you need to update your child's student file, please contact your school or school board.

•You can update the address associated with your Alberta.ca account by visiting a registry office (this address must match what appears on your driver's license or Alberta ID).

## ALBERTA RCMP ISSUES 1,918 TICKETS AS PART OF #OPERATIONIMPACT2025 SAFETY CAMPAIGN

This Thanksgiving long weekend, the Alberta RCMP participated in enforcement initiatives as a part of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police's #OperationImpact2025, a campaign aimed at making Canada's roads the safest in the world. This year's theme was

"Safety is in MY hands."

While patrolling Alberta's provincial roads this past weekend, the Alberta RCMP issued 1,918 tickets. 55 tickets were issued for distracted driving, 13 tickets were issued for seatbelt infractions, and 841 tickets were issued for speeding. Additionally, 106 drivers were removed from the

roads for being impaired due to drugs and/or alcohol.

There were 45 collisions which resulted in injuries, though zero collisions resulted in fatalities.

"The Alberta RCMP would like to remind drivers that traffic safety is everyone's responsibility," says Sgt. Darrin Turnbull, Alberta RCMP Traffic. "We would like to thank those who helped keep themselves and others safe by following the rules of the road this Thanksgiving."

### JANUARY PROVINCIAL EXAM UPDATE

January provincial exams are cancelled. Students may opt to write January diploma exams in April or June 2026, on a voluntary basis.

To ensure students and teachers can concentrate on learning after lost instructional

time due to the teacher strike, Alberta's government has cancelled the January 2026 diploma examinations and Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs).

The cancellation will not affect students' ability to apply to, be accepted by, or attend post-secondary institutions.

Students who choose not to

write at a later date will receive their school-awarded mark as their final official course mark. A notation will be added to transcripts confirming that no diploma exam was written. This ensures there is no impact on students' ability to graduate or transition into post-secondary programs.

School authorities will meet

all learning outcomes for the school year and will have flexibility to adjust the school calendar as needed. Any changes in the school calendar will be communicated to families by their school.

# DO YOU AGREE ALBERTA SHOULD REMAIN IN CANADA?

For the last three months, area residents have seen a few canvassers, with clipboards in hand, asking this question. Well it turns out that a good number of Albertans agreed. The tally when the petitions were delivered to Elections Alberta on October 28 was 456,365, with an additional 23 to be added (grand total of 456,388)!

If you are one that signed, THANK YOU!! You are likely wondered what the next step is and that will be Elections Alberta verifing those signatures. Most of you will have been told this when you signed but here is the information from the Elections Alberta press release on October 28 (https://www.elections.ab.ca/citizen-initiative-petition-received-verification-begins/):

"Important: During the 60-day verification process, Elections Alberta staff will contact a sample of electors who have signed the petition to verify their information and signatures, using the contact information recorded on the petition signature sheets. Electors who have signed the petition are asked to be prepared to verify their information, as they may be contacted.

If a phone number was listed in the contact information, randomly selected electors will receive a text message from Elections Alberta indicating we will be calling to verify their information. Elections Alberta's name will appear on the call display. There is no need to call or text back.

If an email was listed in the contact information, randomly selected electors will receive an email from Elections Alberta with the information to be verified. Electors will respond by email with a yes if the information is correct, and no if the information is incorrect."

As canvassers, we had questions about where your personal information would be going. Please know that all of the information gathered was handed over to Elections Alberta on October 28 and nothing was retained by the canvassers or by Forever Canadian. Elections Alberta has strict provisions for how this is handled and when it will be destroyed. If you are interested in knowing more about that, this is a link to that information (https://www.elections.ab.ca/recall-initiative/ initiative/Initiative-FAQs/):

"If I sign the petition, will my personal information be public?

The Citizen Initiative Act

requires petition sheets be made available for public inspection for one year from the time it is filed or submitted. Electors' residential address and contact information (phone or email) will be obscured from public inspection

Individuals who request to view copies of citizen initiative petition sheets are required to sign a declaration stating the information viewed will not be used except as permitted under the Citizen Initiative Act."

On behalf of the canvassers in this area, we were thrilled to have such amazing support for this petition. Let's all take comfort in knowing how many like-minded individuals we have in our communities when it comes to remaining in Canada!

# MASKWACIS RCMP ARREST MALE FOR POSSESSION OF EXPLOSIVES

On Oct. 23, 2025, RCMP in Maskwacis, with assistance of the Alberta RCMP Explosives Disposal Unit, executed a search warrant at a residence on Samson Cree Nation, after receiving a tip that there may be explosives in the residence.

During that search, police located several improvised explosive devices.

32-year-old Terrance Bruno, a resident of Samson Cree Nation, was arrested at the scene. He has been charged with:

- Breach of a release order (x3)
- Possession of explosives contrary to order

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Bruno was remanded into custody to appear in Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin on Oct. 28, 2025.

The explosive devices that were located during the search were destroyed on scene by the RCMP Explosive Disposal Unit.

Given the Halloween sea-

son, fireworks and firecrackers are commonly seen in our area. The RCMP want to remind the public that fireworks can be extremely dangerous if not handled properly by responsible adults, and the modification of any fireworks can cause them to become very volatile.

## MASKWACIS RCMP SEIZE FIREARMS FROM A REPEAT OFFENDER ON RELEASE FOR AN ARMED ROBBERY

On Oct, 30, 2025, after receiving a tip of illegal firearms, the Maskwacis RCMP executed a search warrant at a residence on Samson Cree Nation. As a result of the search, officers located two firearms and ammunition.

21-year-old James Rain, a resident of Samson Cree Nation, was arrested at the scene. He has since been charged with:

•Fail to comply with release order condition (X2);

- •Weapons possession contrary to order (X2);
- •Possession of a firearm when knowing possession is unauthorized (X2);

•Possession of a firearm with tampered serial number:

•Possession of a firearm with ammunition without licence/registration;

•Unsafe storage of a firearm.

Rain was brought before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin on Nov. 4, 2025.

Rain was under curfew at the time after being charged with robbery with a firearm following a Wetaskiwin liquor store robbery Aug. 14, 2025

## LEDUC COUNTY COUNCIL REAPPOINTS TANNI DOBLANKO TO SERVE AS MAYOR

At this morning's organizational meeting, Mayor Tanni Doblanko was reappointed to serve her ninth term as Mayor.

Nominated by division six Councillor Glenn Belozer, Doblanko was honoured to be elected by Council and spoke to the work the group will build on as a team.

"Our Council has worked hard over the years to represent Leduc County and its citizens," said Mayor Doblanko. "Together we have grown, developed and elevated the County as a regional leader, and I'm honoured my fellow councillors – both incumbents and newly elected – have chosen me as their representative and as their voice. Part of being Mayor is to enable collaboration and cohesion of Council, and I look forward to the work we will achieve together."

Doblanko has served as Leduc County Councillor representing division five since October 2013; she was appointed to her first term as Mayor in October 2017 and has been re-elected each year since.


