PARKLAND RCMP SEEK VICTIMS IN ONGOING INVESTIGATION

On Apr. 27, 2025, Parkland RCMP observed a vehicle driving in a concerning manner and initiated a traffic stop. On further investigation it was learned that the driver was in

breach of court-imposed conditions prohibiting him from being in contact with anyone under the age of 16.

The Parkland RCMP Special Investigations Unit assumed the investigation and identified an additional four victims re-

lated to several other offences. Brian Jenkins (44), a resident of Stony Plain, has been charged with the following:

- Use smart technology like video doorbells or smart locks to monitor deliveries.



COUNTY PROVIDES ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE ON CAO ROLE

Lac Ste. Anne County, AB — Monday, December 8, 2025

Lac Ste. Anne County Council is issuing the following statement regarding the departure of the former Chief Administrative Officer (CAO).

The decision to end the former CAO's employment was made by the prior Council. The specific rationale and supporting discussions remain confidential, as they took place in closed session under the provisions of the *Municipal Government Act* (MGA) and in accordance with privacy legislation. As such, the current Council is not privy to the detailed deliberations that informed the former Council's decision.

Following direction from the previous Council the CAO's employment was ended April 17, 2025, and severance was paid in accordance with the terms of contract in place. As per the provisions of the contract, the County provided a severance payout totaling \$622,860, which reflects the contractual obligations in place at the time. We are providing this information in accordance with the provisions of the MGA.

"Council recognizes the importance of transparency and clarity when it comes to leadership transitions," said Reeve Jurgen Preugschas. "While we cannot comment on closed session, personnel matters, we can confirm that the former CAO's departure was managed in accordance with the contractual terms and with full compliance with legislative requirements."

The County continues to focus on organizational stability and effective service delivery for residents. Current interim administrative leadership remains in place while Council advances the process to recruit a permanent CAO.

This statement is issued by Lac Ste. Anne County Council. No further comment will be provided.

PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO BREAK AND ENTER COMPLAINT

On Dec. 2, 2025, at 11:12 p.m., Parkland RCMP received a complaint of a break and enter in progress to a business on South Park Drive in Stony Plain. Upon arrival, police noted a broken door on the side

of the business, which was found to be vacant inside. Police reviewed surveillance which showed three suspects breaking the door, taking items, and exiting the store.

Police located the suspects nearby who matched the surveillance reviewed. The three youth suspects

were arrested, and admitted to committing multiple other break and enters to businesses in Stony Plain, as well as Spruce Grove, Alta. All three youths were charged and released with a court date of Feb. 6, 2026 at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

THE COUNTY'S WINTER ROAD MAINTENANCE PROGRAM – IN A NUTSHELL

The County maintains range roads, township roads and subdivision roads. After a snowfall event, our Public Works crews begin to clear these corridors quickly, safely, and in accordance with standard County procedures.

With the goal to clear the County's road network as efficiently as possible after a snowfall event ends — our snow-clearing priorities are as follows:

Priority 1: Fire stations and main roadways – these routes carry the highest traffic volume, including collector roads

Priority 2: Local roadways – the feeder roads with lower traffic volumes

Priority 3: Subdivisions and hamlets

Priority 4: Snowplow flags, parking lots, and back alleys

Please keep in mind that the **Province of Alberta** is responsible for all maintenance including snow clearing on highways throughout the County. This includes **highways 18, 22, 33, 37, 43, 633, 642, 647, 654, 757, 764, 765 & 777**. The County has no jurisdiction over these highways.

SITE SELECTED FOR A STAND-ALONE STOLLERY HOSPITAL

Alberta's government has chosen a site for the new stand-alone Stollery Children's Hospital, marking a major step toward delivering a state-of-the-art pediatric facility.

The new stand-alone Stollery Children's Hospital will be located on the University of Alberta's South Campus in Edmonton, at the northeast corner of 122 Street and 51 Avenue. Alberta is continuing to grow, and this site was chosen for its large size, potential for future expansion and proximity to the university's existing hospital, supporting stronger collaboration with academic and research partners.

"Selecting the site for a new

stand-alone Stollery Children's Hospital is a major step forward towards building a new hospital in Edmonton that will serve children in Alberta, the rest of western Canada and the territories. This location gives us the space and flexibility to plan a modern facility that puts children and families first."

As an undeveloped green space, the location would allow construction to begin without the need to demolish or relocate existing buildings, helping streamline the project timeline to deliver on the province's commitment to build another major hospital in the City of Edmonton. A new stand-alone Stollery Children's Hospital is vital to Alberta as it will support

high-quality pediatric care and address the increasing demand for specialized children's health services.

"This is an exciting milestone for families in Alberta and across Western Canada. A new, stand-alone Stollery Children's Hospital will ensure children receive world-class care in a modern facility designed to meet their unique needs"

Alberta's government began investing in the Stollery project in 2021 with an initial \$1 million, matched by the Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation. Budget 2025 invested another \$11 million over three years to advance the planning and design for the new children's hospital which will serve families across Edmonton, northern Alberta and the Northwest Territories.

Planning is currently underway to determine the hospital's space, service and infrastructure needs. The planning phase is anticipated to be complete in 2026.
