On Dec. 18, 2025, the Alberta RCMP's Community Response Team and the Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit were

making patrols when they located a vehicle acting suspiciously in Onoway. A traffic stop was conducted which led to the occupants being arrested and a search of the vehicle

was conducted.

As a result of the investigation, police located and seized: •83 grams of Cocaine;

- 3 grams of Methamphetamine;
- Canadian Currency; and
- A replica firearm.

RCMP charged a 33-year-old female resident of Whitecourt and a 33-year-old male resident of Fox Creek with the following:

- Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking Cocaine; and,
- Possession of property obtained by crime.

The 33-year-old female was also charged with the following additional charges:

- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose; and,
- Failure to comply with a Release Order.

The accused's have been released on an undertaking with conditions to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert on March 25, 2026.

As the informations have not been sworn yet, police are unable to provide names of the accuseds.

Vehicle Fire Contained Quickly – No Injuries, No Structural Damage

preventing damage to surrounding homes and ensuring public safety.

FRI was paged to the call at 21:14 hours. The first responding unit rolled within two minutes of page-out and arrived on scene three minutes later, achieving a total response time of five minutes from dispatch to arrival. Upon arrival, Incident Command identified a single-vehicle engine compartment fire with nearby structures initially reported as threatened.

During a rapid 360-de-

gree size-up, the Incident Commander immediately deployed ABC dry chemical into the engine compartment, eliminating all visible flame. Within two minutes of arrival, the fire was effectively darkened down, removing any further risk to the residence or the public.

Additional apparatus arrived moments later, and crews stretched and charged a handline while a second team accessed the engine compartment. Water was applied to cool the affected areas, followed by a full overhaul once the hood was opened. Crews

conducted repeated thermal imaging camera (TIC) checks to confirm that no hot spots remained.

In total, eight members, two fire apparatus, and one command unit responded to the incident. There were no injuries to civilians or firefighters, and no structural damage occurred.

After confirming the vehicle was fully cooled and safe, crews collected statements, completed a final hot-spot check, and began demobilization. All equipment was serviced, apparatus refilled, and crews debriefed.

PARKLAND RCMP EXECUTES SEARCH WARRANT IN FRAUD AND IDENTITY THEFT INVESTIGATION

On Dec. 17, 2025, Parkland RCMP General Investigation Section conducted a search warrant at a property in Spruce Grove. This search warrant was a result of a comprehensive investigation into multiple frauds and identity thefts. Two individuals have been arrested and remanded into custody.

Evan Mitchell Balchen (37), a resident of Spruce Grove; and Rena Linsey White (41), a resident of Spruce Grove, have been charged with the following:

- Breach of Release Order;
- Fraud Over \$5,000;
- Possess Identity of multiple victims with

intent of committing an offence;

- Personate multiple victims with intent to gain advantage for him/herself;

- Traffic in multiple credit cards in the name of multiple victims that he knew had been obtained by the commission of an offence;

- Make a false document;

- Possess a false document;

- Have in possession capable of making the impression of a stamp or part thereof (Bank Stamp);

- Fail to comply with release order.

Evan Balchen and Rena White have their next court appearance on Dec. 22, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Evansburg.

LETTER TO EDITOR

What Are Alberta Separatists Doing?

There are among us a few people and groups who appear unable to see the benefits of their own country, and are willing to disrupt it for their own benefit. Such people differ in their hopes, and even if one group gets its way, the others can never be satisfied.

Some call for Sovereignty Within a United Canada, whatever that means. Sovereignty means supreme power or authority (independence). This sounds like a complaining teenager's desire for total freedom while expecting other family members to tolerate it, and the refrigerator to remain accessible. Would other members (provinces and territories) be granted the same freedom and the same expectation? Perhaps they think a special Alberta might go its own way, unlike New Brunswick or B.C. (special for their lumber), Newfoundland and Quebec (special

for their electricity), Saskatchewan (potash), the Territories (minerals). It can not work unless the same choice is given to all, but that would still mean restrictions on selfish and libertarian desires. The closest and happiest result would be what exists now, a relatively respected family under confederation. Recognize and enjoy what we have here. Stop dreaming.

Some want an independent country trying to establish itself around the world. Unfortunately, such a divorce would simultaneously create barriers against co-operation with (former) provincial partners. Such people should start to think about assuming all the responsibilities now covered by the federal government, and suddenly facing full accountability. Start considering constructing a new legal system, new trade offices and embassies, tax agreements, pension plan and employment insurance, army

and air force, credit rating for new currency, and passports to everywhere else. Oh, yes, Canada might even want to be repaid for the Trans Mountain Pipeline and expect Alberta to assume its share of the national debt. Isolation at great cost and the need to establish credibility with about 200 other countries? That does not seem very wise.

Some want to join with the United States, imagining that they would enjoy statehood like New York or California. That is unlikely, as Alberta's population is only about 1.5% of that of the U.S. Perhaps such proponents do not understand how states differ from provinces. Each has its own code of laws which differ from their neighbours (sorry: "neighbors"), and from their country. The small population would relegate Alberta to territorial status rather than place a new star on the striped flag. Anyway, such an arrangement

would mean getting used to constant 2-party squabbles, two year voting schedules, enjoying (?) the reputation of mass shootings, a critical world, and the vast costs of private health care, among many other things. Perhaps you should consider staying with those of us who actually like Alberta. If that doesn't suit you, find a place that will take you. Good luck with that!

Even the separatists among us can not agree on whether to stay conflicting with others, to leave completely and start anew, or to try to join our southern neighbour. Three groups clamour for the impossible, since they can not all be satisfied whatever the final result. Let us be happy to do the best with what we have. In Canada!

PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE SERIOUS CRASH CAUSED BY IMPAIRED DRIVER IN DEVON

On Dec. 20, 2025 at 12:31 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a collision on Athabasca Avenue in Devon. Upon arrival, emergency responders tended to 5 individuals all occupants of one vehicle. Investigation revealed that the vehicle lost control striking a parked vehicle and a tree. All occupants had various levels on injury. Two occupants had serious life-threatening injuries. One was taken by STARS and one by ambulance to hospital where they remain.

The driver, a 20-year-old Devon resident, was arrested and taken to the detachment where they provided breath samples more than twice the legal limit. The driver has charges pending for impaired driving causing bodily harm.

"Investigations like this are yet another reminder of the dangers of impaired driving," says Sgt. Rob Gillies of the Parkland RCMP, "nearly 25% of all fatal collisions have impaired driving as a contributing factor."

Alberta RCMP and partners are out in full force conducting checking stops to keep Albertan's safe. Be responsible, drive sober.

WHITECOURT 2026 INTERIM BUDGET ADOPTED

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the 2026 Interim Budget. The budget, totaling \$69,078,492, consists of a \$50,957,865 operating budget and a capital budget of \$18,120,627. The budget maintains service levels and funds important capital investments with a 4.45% tax rate increase.

"This budget not only meets our needs today, but prepares our municipality for the future. Long-term financial health and stability are priorities for this new Council, and this budget includes a number of multi-year investments in local infrastructure, while balancing ongoing financial pressures from rising inflation and operating costs," stated Whitecourt Mayor Ray Hilts. "I'll be posting a series of budget highlights on social media in the new year to discuss what is planned for 2026, and how this budget will impact our community."

The 2026 Interim Budget Report

can be viewed on the Whitecourt website at www.whitecourt.ca/your-town. Whitecourt Town Council will be hosting its annual public open house on the proposed budget in the new year, which will provide an opportunity for further public engagement.

2026 Capital Budget Highlights:

- The Culture & Events Centre will open in the fall of 2026.

- The 2026 Street Improvement Program includes street, lighting, and sidewalk repairs at locations throughout the community.

- Highway 43 Vitalization plantings will be completed along both sides of Highway 43 in west Whitecourt.

- Enhancements will be made at the intersections of 52 Avenue and 47 Street, and 51 Street and 49 Avenue, and improvements will be made to pathway and bus stop connectivity, and accessibility on portions of the transit route.

- Construction of the multipurpose courts at Festival Park will be completed to provide space for pickleball, basketball, badminton, tennis and ball hockey.

- An outdoor classroom will be developed at the Forest Interpretive Centre to provide space for a variety of community programming.

2026 Operating Budget Highlights:

- A Community Safety Plan will be developed that will connect local agencies and organizations with shared safety priorities for the community that will focus on crime prevention and crime reduction.

- A Community Emergency Preparedness Day will be organized to provide community members a chance to meet local first responders, and to learn how to prepare for emergencies.

- Continuation of youth-focused programming, including the Doors Open Program and Teen Week.

- Continuation of the social prescribing services for seniors in the region, with support from the United Way and Health Aging Alberta.

This program helps connect seniors with non-medical programs

and services in the community to enhance their quality of life.

- A Volunteer Coordinator position will be added to support Whitecourt non-profit groups in areas such as grant identification and writing, budget development, recruiting and retention of volunteers, and other organizational supports.

- A Utilities Master Plan will be created to assess the Town's existing water, sanitary and storm systems, and provide recommendations for future services and development.

The 2026 Budget will be finalized in the spring of 2026 once the Provincial budget is adopted, and final assessment figures are established. Specific tax rate impacts will vary by property type depending on the assessed value of a home or business, and will be determined once the final budget is adopted.

REVITALIZING ALBERTA'S ICONIC SKI RESORTS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Castle, Fortress and Nakiska have been designated as Alberta's first all-season resort areas, making it easier for people to stay and play year-round.

For decades, red tape has restricted these resorts to winter operations and limited the ability to make facility upgrades or simply maintain existing facilities. These resorts are central to Alberta's outdoor heritage, inspiring generations of athletes and outdoor enthusiasts. They have hosted world-class events such as the 1988 Olympics and served as the backdrop for cinematic blockbusters like *The Revenant* and *Jumanji: The Next Level*. All-season resort area designations support the revitalization of iconic resorts while maintaining strong environmental protections.

All-season resort areas will offer a wider variety of affordable and accessible recreation experiences for families, outdoor enthusiasts and visitors. These designations simplify regulatory processes while maintaining Alberta's high environmental standards.

"Our government is proud to champion former Premier Peter Lougheed's vision for Alberta's Rockies, ensuring future generations can continue to access and enjoy these beautiful areas. By helping revitalize Alberta's legendary ski resorts, we are striking the right balance of economic growth, environmental stewardship and Indigenous opportuni-

ty."

Environmental excellence remains a core requirement. All projects must meet Alberta's existing environmental standards, including the Public Lands Act, Water Act, and Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act, and will be subject to environmental assessment. Plans must address wildlife protection, water conservation, wildfire mitigation and sustainable visitor behaviour.

Since 2019, Alberta has expanded provincial parks and recreation areas by more than 300,000 hectares. As part of these designations, minor boundary adjustments ensure long-standing ski terrain is placed under the appropriate regulator, affecting less than 0.03 per cent of Alberta's parks system.

"All-season destinations are all about serving community and building community. The new all-season policy will bring both social and economic opportunities to Alberta."

Over the next decade, these three all-season resort areas have the potential to create 24,000 new jobs, \$3.6 billion in GDP, and \$4 billion in visitor spending. All-season resort developers and operators will be encouraged to partner with local businesses and use locally sourced materials, workforce talent, suppliers and service providers.

"Alberta's outdoor recre-

ation and resort potential was held back for decades by an unworkable land-use framework, even as our population grew. The new all-season resort regulations will now help catalyze responsible, year-round, nature-based development that draws new rural investment and strengthens Alberta's culture of stewardship through lived connections with the land."

All-season resorts present the opportunity to further support Indigenous economic participation, leadership and cultural inclusion in Alberta's visitor economy. Alberta's government is committed to continuing meaningful engagement with Indigenous communities, including ensuring that Treaty rights and traditional practices are respected.

To foster trust, transparency and collaboration in the development and management of all-season resorts, Indigenous groups were formally consulted by Alberta's government as part of designation evaluations. Prospective project proponents must undertake consultations in accordance with Government of Alberta consultation policies and guidelines.

"Alberta's first all-season resort areas mark an important step forward, and we are encouraged by the ongoing engagement between our Nations and proponents. When development respects our land and is built on true partnership with our communities, it

creates meaningful opportunities for Indigenous Peoples, supporting economic growth, strengthening leadership and sharing our culture with visitors."

Alberta's government has created a clear regulatory pathway for all-season resorts. Designation is the first step in the regulatory process. Prospective project proponents can now begin Indigenous consultation, public engagement and proposal submissions to the regulator. Each proposal will be carefully reviewed by the regulator with input from subject matter experts and affected municipalities.
